- **Pick out the trail with an adult:** Have your parent or guardian show you a few and pick the ones you want to try.
- **Wear the right shoes:** Make sure you've got your strong and comfy sneakers or boots on.
- **Look for hidden treasures on the trail:** Have a contest with your family and friends to see who can spot the most birds or different types of leaves.
- **Always make sure you can see your adult.**
- **Bring a bag for your trash and recyclables:** Put your trash in your bag, not on the ground!
- **Wear a whistle:** If you don't see an adult, stop; stay where you are and blow your whistle.
- **Drink water:** Always stay hydrated on your hike.
- **Eat your trail mix:** Trail mix is a great and tasty way to stay fueled while you hike.

Mudflat adventures



Did you know Korea's west coast has some of the largest tidal flats in the world? Mudflats are a special place where land and sea meet. When the ocean water pulls far away during low tide, it reveals a muddy playground full of hidden sea creatures. It might look messy, but it's perfect for treasure hunting for curious kids! Get your boots ready and explore Korea's mudflats!

Items to prepare

Extra clothes (you'll get muddy), gloves, aqua shoes or boots, a small shovel or hoe, tongs for grabbing crabs, bucket and headlamp (if you go at night).



Fun facts

- You'll easily find clams, crabs, conches, octopuses and many surprising sea creatures!
- The lowest tide usually occurs 1-2 times a day, once during the day and once at night.
- While clams can be collected easily during both day and night, you can catch crabs and octopuses at night because they're nocturnal.

UNESCO World Natural Heritage sites

Korea is home to four of the west coast mudflats designated as UNESCO World Natural Heritage sites. They are protected as one of the most valuable natural places on Earth. Many migrant birds stop here to rest during long trips across the world. A variety of rare animals, birds and plants live there. They also help keep the ocean clean and healthy. The four UNESCO mudflats are Seocheon, Gochang, Shinan and Boseong-Suncheon.

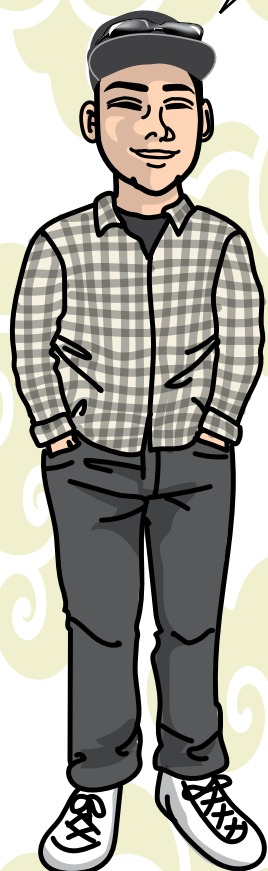

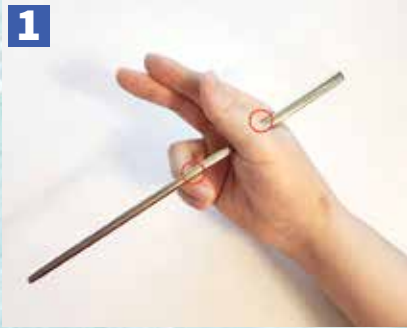

1 Place the upper part of the first chopstick between the thumb and index finger and put the lower part on a ring finger.

2 Grab the second chopstick between the index and middle finger and hold it with the thumb.

3 You don't have to move the first chopstick. Open and close the second chopstick to pick up food by using the index and middle finger.

SPAM A TASTY CANNED DELIGHT

SPAM is very popular in the Pacific! You'll see it in many yummy dishes like SPAM South Korean's budae jjigae hot pot, SPAM stir-fry and many more. If you've never tried SPAM, sampling it in some of the dishes in places like South Korea, Japan, Guam and Hawaii is a great way to do so! Give it a try!



Here are some interesting facts about this staple food in Asian cuisine:

-  SPAM is a canned lunch meat made of ground pork and ham.
-  SPAM appeared on shelves in 1937 from Hormel Foods in Minnesota.
-  During WWII, SPAM was shipped abroad to feed troops.
-  According to Hormel Foods, the canned meat is available in 50 countries.
-  SPAM comes in 11 varieties, including Bacon, Gochujang (a spicy paste in South Korea) and Maple.
-  In South Korea, SPAM is a popular gift for Lunar New Year. Stores will have elaborate displays of SPAM on sale for presents.
-  In Guam, the average person consumes 16 cans of SPAM per year.
-  In Hawaii, a total of 7 million cans of SPAM are consumed per year.

Ingredients

Popcorn kernels (35g)
Oil (15g)
Honey (30g)
Butter (30g)
Salt (A pinch. This is unnecessary if
your butter includes salt)
Sugar (20g)

Popping Pooh Popcorn

- 1 Put popcorn kernels and oil in a pan (or a pot) and mix them.
- 2 Put the pan over medium heat. Make sure you put a lid on the pot while heating.
- 3 When the popcorn starts bouncing, shake the pan.
- 4 Once the kernels are done with popping, put the popcorn on a plate and let them cool down.
- 5 In the pan, mix butter (30g), sugar (20g), and honey (30g) together. (Add a pinch of salt if the butter is unsalted)
- 6 Place the pan over medium heat and keep stirring the ingredients to avoid burning the sauce.
- 7 The sauce gets thick and its color changes gradually.



- 8 When the sauce turns brownish, turn off the stove.
- 9 Add the popcorn back in the pan and mix them with the sauce quickly.
- 10 Spread the popcorn out on a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper and let it cool. (Make sure to spread the popcorn as the sauce is sticky and this will ensure the popcorn is coated separately.)
- 11 Once the sauce has hardened on the popcorn, it's time to enjoy!

Charming Churros

Ingredients

240 cc water
120 cc butter
1.25 cc salt
3.75 cc cinnamon
150g all-purpose flour
3 eggs
360 cc vegetable or canola oil
100g sugar

- 1 Pour water in a pot over medium heat and add in butter, salt, half of the cinnamon (1.25 cc).
- 2 Change the medium heat to low.
- 3 Add all-purpose flour and mix it until the dough begins to form. Remove from heat and let the mixture cool for 5 to 7 minutes.
- 4 Add eggs in one at a time as you knead the dough.
- 5 Place the dough in a pastry bag with a star-shaped piping tip. Prepare a plate with paper towels to place fried churros cool and drain excess oil.
- 6 Pour oil into a frying pan or another pot over medium to high heat until the oil reaches about 170°C (338°F).
- 7 When the oil reaches the temperature required, squeeze dough into the oil in 2.5 cm-long portions.



- 8 Fry until golden brown, then transfer onto the plate with the paper towels.

- 9 Mix sugar and cinnamon (2.5cc) in a bowl.



- 10 After the churros have cooled and strained excess oil, place into the sugar-cinnamon mix and coat.

- 11 After this, your churros are ready to devour. Bon appetite!



Terrific Toast Art

- 1 Draw or print out the character you want on a piece of paper.



- 2 Put the drawing over a paste board or a plastic sheet.



- 3 Cut out outlines and facial features using scissors or a paper cutter. (Have an adult do this for you).

- 4 Toast the bread and smear butter on it.

- 5 Place the stencil over the toast, then sprinkle generously with cocoa powder.

- 6 For my design, I also added a dollop of strawberry jam for my characters mouth.



Materials needed

- Printed design
- Paste board or thin plastic sheet (you can find these at the 100-yen store or even use a sheet protector)
- Toast
- Butter
- Cocoa powder, cinnamon, matcha powder, or any sweet powder you want to decorate your toast with.

- 7 Carefully remove the stencil.
- 8 Bon appetite! Get your picture for the 'gram, then enjoy!
