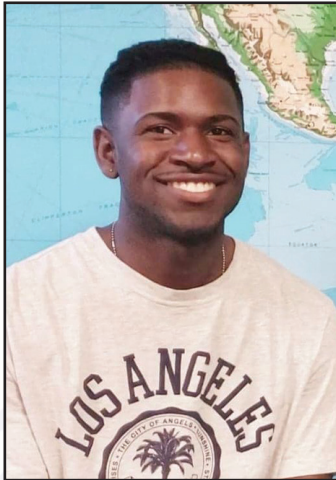

Advice for Future Soldiers: This is not high school anymore, it is your career, it's about you, and you should take it seriously. Create study habits, take time to study, and take baby steps.

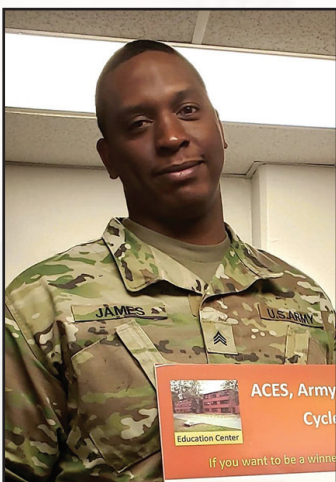


PFC Hughes is on the path to greatness! She has shown success in persevering to strive for excellence with her educational goals; therefore she is definitely an Education Center Heroine!

Future Goals: Now that I have the AFCT score that I wanted, I am going to complete the Green to Gold packet.

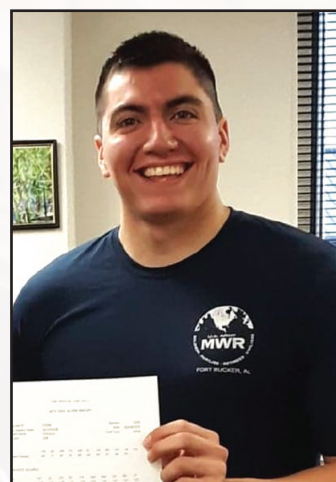
Advice for Future Soldiers: Even when you get a little frustrated, keep going! Never give up!

Did your commander tell you that you need a 110 General Technical Score (GT) for a certain Military Occupational Specialty (MOS)?

Or maybe your GT score is good but you need to improve other line scores for a certain MOS?

What do you do?

The FAST class could help. The FAST class (Functional Academics Skills Training) is a commander's on-duty training program for soldiers needing to improve academics and job related math and reading skills. The FAST class is 3 weeks long, from 0800 to 1200, Mon thru Friday. On the first day, students will be administered the TABE (Test of Adult Basic Education) to find out where improvements are needed. Half way through the course students will take a GT Predictor exam to show the level

of improvement since the first day. At the end of the course students will be administered the ASVAB, now called AFCT (Armed Forces Classification Test), for their final score. I assist a lot of soldiers in this course and when they get the score they want it feels great to know I had something to do with it! So if you are in need of GT improvement don't hesitate to contact the Education Center. It would be my pleasure to help!

DANTES EDUCATION BENEFITS APP

Information on your Defense Department education benefits is available in the palm of your hand, anytime, anywhere you want it. The My VolEd Path mobile app is a tool aimed at increasing awareness of and access to voluntary education programs and benefits for military members. The app serves as a discovery tool to help you begin to build personal pathways to your individual education and career goals. It also serves as another resource to demonstrate the Department of Defense (DoD) Voluntary Education (VolEd) program's commitment to ensuring you are properly informed of the educational opportunities available. The My VolEd Path mobile app can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and through Google Play.

Tool to Help Counselors & School Representatives

One of the voluntary education community's strengths is its myriad of professional education counselors and school representatives from academic institutions under the DoD Voluntary Education Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (DoD MOU). The My VolEd Path mobile app helps these professionals empower you and other military students to navigate the vast amount of available information. Counselors and school representatives may encourage students to use the app to aid in making informed decisions

on the right programs and benefits that will help them prepare and be ready to succeed while pursuing post-secondary education. The app can be used to begin the process of clearly defining education goals and connecting to those resources that will be the most beneficial throughout a member's education journey. The app may also save counselors time during advisement sessions by familiarizing students with voluntary education terminology, programs, and how to access resources.

A key feature of the mobile app is the discovery tool designed to quickly assess and generate recommended programs. You can "Create a New VolEd Path" by answering a few short questions about your career and education goals. Based on these responses, you will receive program cards that introduce you to programs you may be interested in learning more about. Once those selections are made, you are taken to your personal pathway to help reach your goals.

Voluntary Education Pathways

The "My Pathway" section of the app provides you with a customized checklist to support the pursuit of your education goals. You will see a snapshot of your discovery tool selections to remind you of the options you chose. Because you are able to create multiple pathways, this reminder allows you to be clear on the pathway that

corresponds to a particular goal (for example: military advancement, officer accession, college degree, etc.). Next, you'll receive the option to "Find a Counselor" and explore "Recommended Programs".

The programs included on the "Recommended Program" list will include those voluntary education programs that best correspond to your current education level and future education goal. As you select a program, you'll be taken to an overview of how the program may help you prepare for college and career advancement, find support as you pursue schooling, and save time and money while completing degree requirements. To find more detailed program information, you can select "Learn More". If you are ready to get started with using a program, you can select "Try Now" to be instantly connected to register for a program. You are also able to share your recommended pathways directly with their education counselor through email or social media.

Connections to Counselors

When using the app, you are able to connect to voluntary education professionals through the "Find a Counselor" feature. By selecting a branch of Service, CONUS or OCONUS, and state, you are presented with all of the education centers available in the state or location selected. The app includes additional functionality that connects

directly to the mobile device's call features to allow you to contact the education center. The education center location and street address are also included. If you prefer virtual assistance, the branch of service selection will automatically populate the appropriate Virtual Education Center or voluntary education portal information.

Education Program Information & Access

Not everyone who uses the app may want to complete the discovery tool assessment. If you are simply interested in learning about of the available programs, you can select "All Benefits" from the main menu. This will bring you to an overview of all the program included in the app and links to additional program information. From here, you can also access each program by selecting "Try Now".

Videos, Podcasts, & News

Because there are various ways learners consume information, the mobile app includes videos and audio podcasts. These resources will be updated on a regular basis and provide program benefit information and tutorials based on frequently asked questions. The app also includes articles on various education topics from the DANTES4Military.com blog for servicemembers. Each week, new articles are available that offer guidance, advice, encouragement,

and information that supports you and other military students pursuing voluntary education.

FAQs, Resources, and Encouragement

An important aspect of promoting quality education opportunities for servicemembers is ensuring you have adequate support. In addition to being able to "Find a Counselor", the app provides you with connections to DANTES support resources. From any screen within the app, you can select the question mark at the top right-hand corner of the screen to be connected to either chat live with a DANTES representative via instant messenger or send a message for an email response. In the "FAQ and Resources" section, you can find answers to frequently asked questions and links to helpful resources.

You and other My VolEd Path users will also benefit from positive reinforcement and periodic encouragement through badges. You can earn badges for reaching certain milestones within the app. These badges can be viewed with their profile and are also shareable on social media. To download and view the My VolEd Path mobile app, visit MyVolEdPath.com or the Apple App and Google Play Stores.

CAREER SKILLS PROGRAM

YOU'RE HIRED!

ARMY CAREER SKILLS PROGRAM TO AID IN TRANSITION.

One of the most important questions Soldiers start asking themselves when getting ready to transition out of the military is, "What am I going to do next"? The good news is that the military has an answer for that, and it is called the Army Career Skills Program (CSP). The Army CSP is a component of the Soldier Life Cycle that encourages soldiers to capitalize on training and development opportunities throughout their military careers – both in uniform and as civilians beyond their military service. CSPs provide Soldiers with the opportunity to participate in career and employment skill training opportunities during transition, to improve employment options upon separation from military service.

CSP Highlights

1. Soldiers are eligible if they are within 180 days of discharge/release from military service.
2. CSPs afford Soldiers the opportunity to participate in first-class apprenticeships, on-the-job training (OJT), job shadowing, and employment skills training up to 180 days prior to separation from the Army.
3. Soldiers have the opportunity to move into high-demand and highly-skilled jobs.
4. 5-day Department Of Labor Workshop must be

completed prior to enrollment in CSP.

5. Commanders must approve Soldier's application; companies select participants.
6. A commander may terminate a Soldier's participation out of military necessity.
7. Appropriated funds will not be used to pay for CSPs (TA is not authorized)
8. Majority of CSPs are free to Army & Soldiers; Soldiers cannot receive outside compensation.

At the Fort Rucker Army Continuing Education Center, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University does briefings for Soldiers interested in their Microsoft Software & Systems Academy through Fort Benning. Assistant Campus Director of ERAU Fort Rucker, Pam Ridlehoover states the biggest benefits to Soldiers are, "being able to walk away from the program with a direct interview with Microsoft or one of their partners. These positions usually offer a very decent salary."

TYPES OF CAREER SKILLS PROGRAMS

- **Credentialing** - The process of meeting certain professional and technical standard and earning official recognition in the form of certificates, licensure, and other official verification of competency accepted by civilian industry or federal, state or local authorities.
- **Internships** - A system of on-the-job-training (OJT) offered by a provider to eligible servicemembers to develop job and employment skills training assisting them to gain employment in the civilian sector. Must be completed in federal, state, or local government, or in the private sector consisting of OJT and work experience for entry-level positions.
- **Job Shadowing** - A work experience option where individuals observe the day to day activities of someone in the current work force. No participation limit to the number of job shadowing opportunities in which the soldier participates.
- **On-the-Job Training (OJT)** - Employment training and tasks learned at a place of work while performing an actual job. An OJT or employment skills training program must adhere to certain criteria.
- **Apprenticeship** - The combination of On-the-Job Training and related classroom instruction under the supervision of a trade official. Employer and union groups, individual employers, or employer association jointly sponsor these programs.

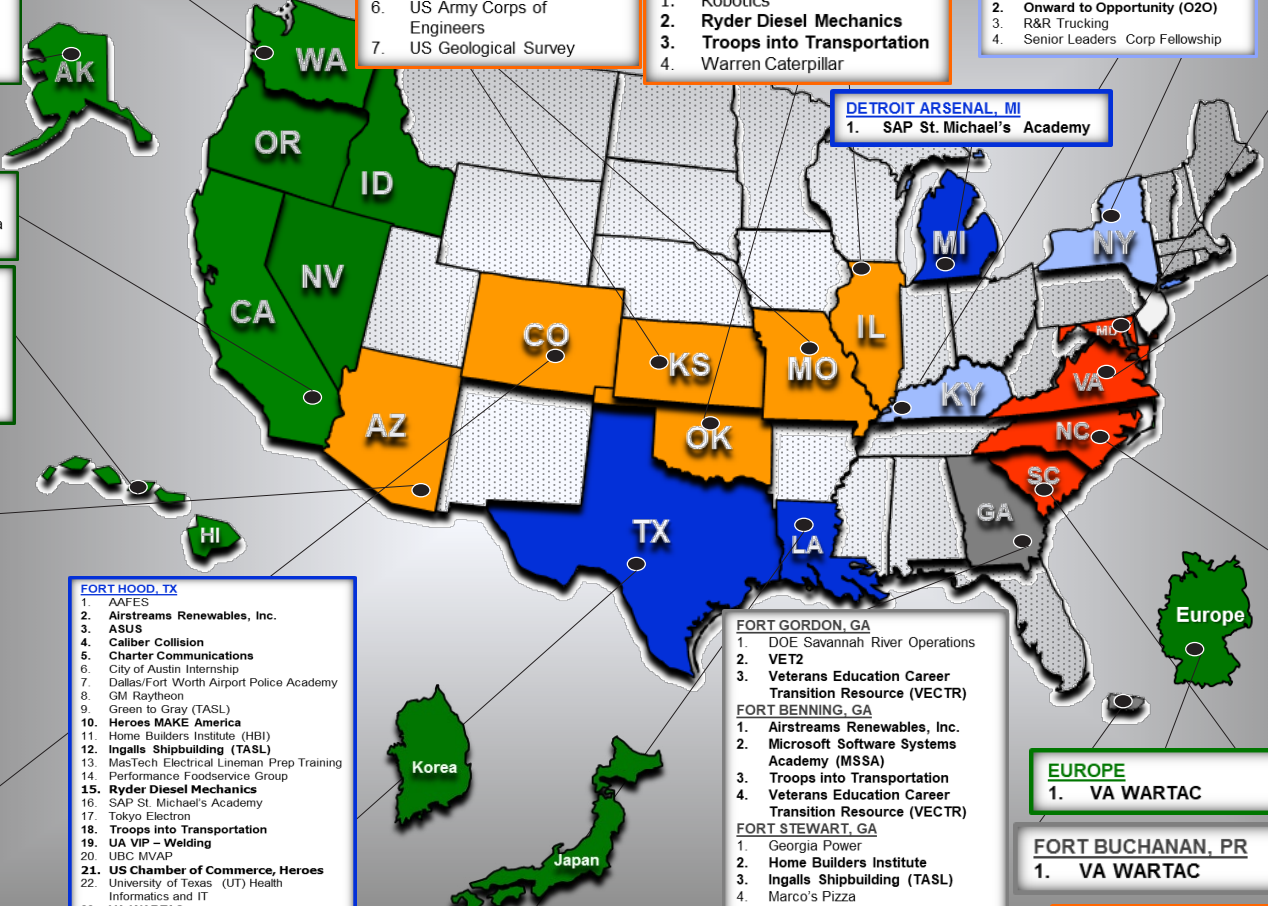

In FY20 servicemembers will gain access to over 1600+ credentials by way of the Credentialing Assistance Program (CA)! Servicemembers will have up to \$4000 per fiscal year (FY) for CA. Another added incentive with CA is that books and materials are included. According to ACES Counselor Delores Williams, "the need for credentials in the workforce is imperative. It really speaks to how much the Army listens to servicemembers that this opportunity is available. We see servicemembers everyday come in asking for these amazing credentials and it is so important for them to take advantage of the opportunity and sign up. At Fort Rucker, we will be excited to help servicemembers leverage their educational goals and be life-long learners using credentialing assistance!"

How does the program work?

FY20, CA is expected to launch Army wide. When CA opens for all servicemembers, local ACES Education Center Counselors will be available for one-on-one help to get you started. CA program requests must be completed at least 30 days in advance, so it is important to see your counselor. Servicemembers will have the choice to earn the credentials through an education

institution or a private partner of their choosing. Currently, CA is on a test run at Fort Hood and Fort Campbell, it has proven to be an extremely successful and beneficial program!

What credentials are available and how do I see the list?

Servicemembers can access a full list of credentials on www.cool.army.mil.

The best thing about CA is that servicemembers can request to take any credential listed; it does not have to be MOS specific.

On Army Cool, you can search credentials by a number of different categories including: Credentials In Demand/Not, Promotion Points Eligible, Gap Analysis Findings, E-learning/Not, Accreditation, Credential Type, and Enlisted/Officer.

How are promotion points awarded for credentials?

Education Centers can evaluate credentials, and promotion point memos to submit to S1. Current guidance from U.S. Army Human Resources Command states, "Army G1 has approved the initiative to award promotion points for technical certifications to Soldiers competing for promotion to Sergeant and Staff Sergeant."

- Ten promotion points for each awarded technical certification
- A maximum of 50 promotion points are authorized for technical certifications
- No additional promotion points are authorized for recertification

- Promotion points will be awarded under civilian education on the DA Form 3355

The finalization of the CA program is still in an evaluative state, and actual regulations can change before the FY20 launch. Contact your local Education Center for any updates.

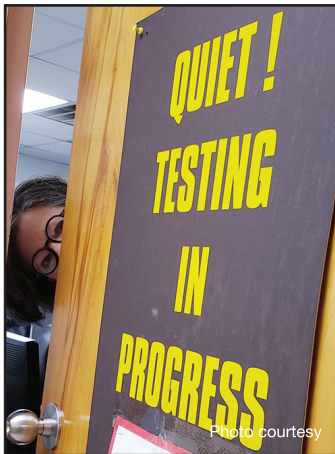

in the discipline by testing. Often these tests lead to promotion points, reenlistment eligibility, and qualifications for new MOS's or certifications to obtain a job in or out of the military. They take it seriously and so do we.

FAA Requirements for Hobbyist and Commercial Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Pilots

The latest aeronautic craze has hit the U.S. and the interest in unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) otherwise known as drones, is growing rapidly. This is not just a technology being embraced by aerial hobbyist. UAS is being used commercially for its surveillance and delivery capabilities. Like most new technologies regulations must be put in place to insure it is being used responsibly and within the law. We've all seen the headlines concerning some of the drone hobbyist pilots being involved in anything from community nuisance to shutting down airports. Because the UAS/Drone technology has this capability the FAA has developed regulations that help to spell out the "Do's and Don'ts" of drone ownership. First and most importantly is the licensing and registration of UAS/Drone pilots. Certifications and regulations differ depending on whether you're a hobbyist or a commercial pilot.

FORT RUCKER SOLDIER FOR LIFE TRANSITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SFL-TAP)

The SFL-TAP provides transition and employment assistance to Soldiers and their adult family members who are transitioning from active-duty, veterans and retirees, and DoD civilian employees in a Reduction in Force status. Pre-separation planning includes benefits information, job search skills development, career guidance, job search assistance and other guidance relevant to a thorough transition.

Are you interested in developing an effective job search plan? If so, you’ll want to take advantage of the SFL-TAP classes that provide detailed information on how to do so. SFL-TAP staff members and the Department of Labor representatives who teach the classes have “been there and done that.” They’ve all transitioned from military service (as either a military member or dependent) to the private sector, they’ve all had the opportunity to apply and interview for jobs, and they’ve all had extensive training in what it takes to conduct a successful job search.

Would you like to develop resumes and cover letters that best market your qualifications for the jobs you’re interested in? SFL-TAP classes provide comprehensive guidance on how to do so. Additionally, once you’ve attended classes, you can work one-on-one with trained counselors and get their help in perfecting and polishing your resumes and cover letters. At this point, perhaps you’re questioning the use of the plural--“resumes” rather than “resume.” After all, you might wonder, isn’t a resume a resume? Or, why would I need more than one? Well, you might not, but most people do. Usually, different jobs require different resumes. For each individual job, you emphasize the qualifications, experience, and skills you have that are applicable to that specific job listing. The classes and counselors can help you learn how to tailor your resumes for a particular job so you can best market yourself.

CLEP & DSST Testing

In addition to Tuition Assistance (TA), the military allows eligible servicemembers additional resources to help them earn degrees faster and free of charge. Two programs, College Level Examination Program (CLEP) and DANTES Subject Standardized Test (DSST) allow college credit through examination, which saves time and TA money. The exams are offered in multiple subject areas and taking and passing the exams earns the equivalent of an undergraduate college course credit. DANTES PAYS FOR ONE FREE ATTEMPT PER TEST.

During the period of one month, W01 Rambinski Sovann passed four exams. That put him four classes closer to completing his degree requirements and saved him months of time in the classroom.

Troy University's Fort Rucker site administers the exams at the Army Education Center on Fort Rucker. For more information about the programs, contact Troy University at 334-598-2443.

There are online resources available to help with test preparation. You can visit the Fort Rucker Education Center for FREE CLEP Study Guides! Also, active-duty servicemembers and their dependents can get a scholarship waiver signed at the Education Center, reducing the cost of tuition to \$250 per credit hour.

POP-UP WRITING WORKSHOPS

Troy University Writing Centers Offer Pop-Up Workshops at the Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (NCOA)

Military servicemembers and the structures that serve and develop them, manage competing demands of Military Occupational Specialties (MOS) expertise, leadership development and academic skills development that also yield military benefits. Many times, the choice is either career or academic development, and for servicemembers

with dusty academic skills, no internal or external refresher programs are available. At Fort Rucker, Troy University offers FREE workshops for NCOA candidates focused on research writing strategies required to complete the Advanced Leaders Course (ALC) and Senior Leaders Course (SLC) writing projects.

The Writing Strategies Course is part of an overall writing improvement strategy for the NCOA.

The workshop provides knowledge of the processes and practices involved

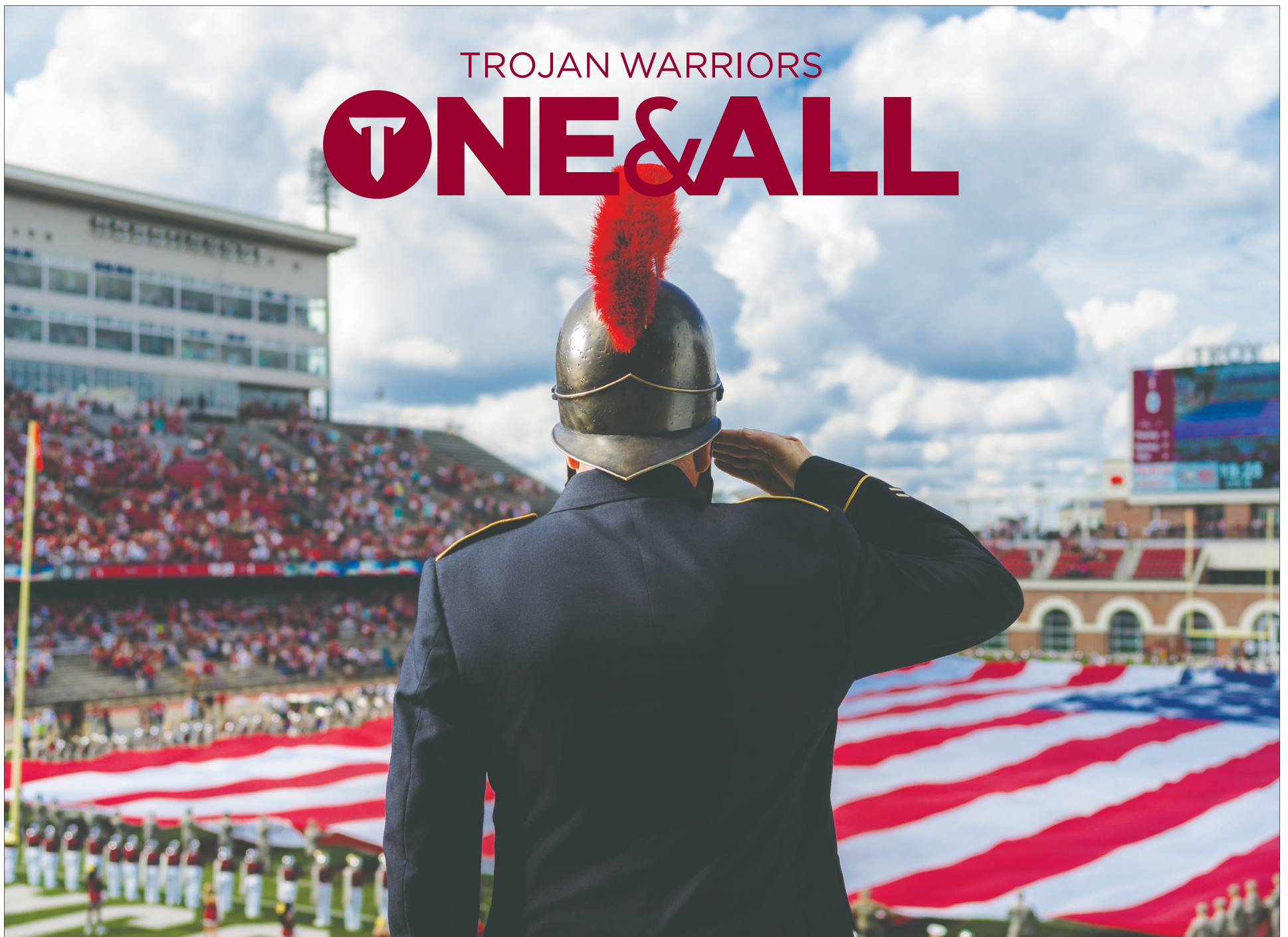
in research writing with the goal of improving research approaches, citation style and creating effective written communication.

The Directors of the Troy Writing Centers started offering the workshops to NCOA candidates in September of 2018 and have served more than 200 writers at Fort Rucker since then. Troy and the NCOA have worked together over time to co-design the program and customize the workshop to fit candidates' needs and schedules. What started as a three-day workshop after duty hours on weekdays is now a one-day, three-hour workshop offered on Saturday afternoons.

Workshops are typically offered on

a schedule that gives each incoming rotation an opportunity to engage. This means that some workshops include both ALC and SLC candidates, but that just makes the discussions even more interesting. The Writing Center directors created guides, templates, and checklists in the form of two books produced exclusively for the NCOA, and each candidate is provided an electronic copy of these books on writing and research strategy. Troy designed the workshop and texts as just-in-time job training rather than as a standard college course, and they have found this approach most effective at the NCOA.

MILITARY SPOUSE AND FAMILY EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

There are several education benefits available to dependents of veterans as well as surviving family members of deceased veterans. Ranging from scholarships to totally free school, these benefits are often overlooked.

Department of Defense

Post 9/11 GI Bill Transferability

There is a special provision of the program that allows military members to share their remaining GI Bill (education) benefits with immediate family members. The key factor is whether or not the member has used any of their GI Bill in the past; only unused benefits can be transferred. This means that if they used 12 months of their GI Bill, then they can only transfer the remaining 24 months of benefits.

Servicemembers must meet specific criteria to be eligible to transfer their GI Bill benefits. This includes having at least six years of service and an obligation to serve at least four more.

Military Spouse Career Advancement Accounts (MyCAA)

The Military Spouse Career Advancement Accounts (MyCAA) program provides up to \$4,000 of Financial Assistance for military spouses who are pursuing degree programs, licenses or credentials leading to employment in portable career fields.

Veterans Affairs

Dependents Education Assistance Program

The Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) program provides education and training opportunities to eligible dependents of certain veterans. The program offers up to 45 months of education benefits. These benefits may be used for degree and certificate programs, apprenticeship, and on-the-job training. Remedial, deficiency, and refresher courses may be approved under certain circumstances.

Marine GySgt John D. Fry Scholarship Program

The Fry Scholarship is an a program similar to the Post-

9/11 GI Bill that makes education benefits available to the surviving spouses and children of servicemembers who die in the line of duty after Sept. 10, 2001. Like Post-9/11 veterans, eligible surviving spouses and children attending school may receive full tuition coverage at state-operated colleges and universities, plus a monthly living stipend and book allowance under this program.

Surviving spouses can use the Fry Scholarship for 15 years from the anniversary of the servicemember's death or until they remarry. Eligible children can use the Fry Scholarship between the ages of 18 and 33. Children under age 18 cannot use this benefit even if they have completed high school. The child's marital status does not affect eligibility for the Fry Scholarship.

State Provided Education Benefits

Educational benefits for families, particularly the children of deceased, MIA, POW, and disabled veterans, may be available in some states.

Scholarships and Grants

While looking for money for school many spouses and their families overlook the over \$300 million of military - and veteran - related scholarships and grants. These scholarships often go unclaimed.

Not applying for scholarships is like turning down free money.

Army Resources

Army Emergency Relief (AER)

Army Emergency Relief maintains two scholarship programs – the Spouse Education Assistance Program and the MG James Ursano Scholarship Program for dependent children. Both scholarships provide financial assistance for students who are pursuing their first undergraduate degree.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO COMPLETE A TRANSFER OF EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS (TEB)? COMPLETE APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER

1. Login in to milconnect at <https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect/>
2. Verify your dependents are listed as eligible to receive the transfer.
3. Your dependents will be listed in the List of Family Members chart.
4. If your dependent(s) is under 23 years-old and is identified as ineligible, contact your DEERS office to enroll that dependent into DEERS.
5. Enter the number of months you wish to transfer to each dependent.
6. Entering a Transfer End Date is optional, but not recommended. If left blank, the dependent will receive the longest period of eligibility allowed by law.
7. Click the "OK" button and repeat for each dependent.
8. Complete the application by reading every statement and selecting EVERY check box.
9. Be sure to click the SUBMIT button.
10. Transfer request is complete.
11. Dependent Application to VA for use: www.vets.gov.
