

Speakin' Chamorro

BASIC ANIORRO PHRASES

ost of the younger Chamorros you meet on Guam, or "Guåhan," are not likely to speak much more of the Chamorro language than the ubiquitous greeting, "Håfa adai!" But while the number of Chamorro speakers has decreased over the decades, a recent surge in interest in preserving local history, traditions and culture indicate the language may be around for centuries to come. English may be the lingua franca on the island today, but you might be surprised at how many speak some of the Chamorro language – and would appreciate your attempt to speak it, too. Here are some basics to get you started.


One language is never enough -

Un linguahe ni ngai'an u nahom

Note: The letter Y is pronounced more like DZ (an approximation of the regional Spanish pronunciation). The letters N and \tilde{N} , and A and \tilde{A} , are not always distinguished in print. Thus, the Guamanian place name spelled "Yona" is pronounced "Dzona," not "Jona" as might be expected. "Ch" is usually pronounced like "Ts," rather than as it is in English. The Chamorro R is a flat (r), like a Spanish R between vowels, and a retroflex approximant (A), a type of consonantal sound, like the English R at the beginning of words.







Green Tea Furikake Tea to top your rice with

he season for the year's first batches of green tea is upon us, and there are many ways to enjoy it.



But did you know you can turn used green tea leaves into rice toppings? Furikake made with used tea leaves and other healthy ingredients lets you enjoy the wonderful fragrance of

green tea, and goes well with rice, salad, tofu, or grilled meat and fish.

Servings: 4-5 Cooking time: 15 min.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 tbsp used tea leaves
- 1 tbsp white sesame seeds
- 1 sachet (3g) dried bonito shavings (katsuobushi)
- 2 tbsp boiled, dried baby sardines (chirimenjako)
- 1 tbsp soy sauce
- 2 tsp sake
- 1 tsp salt







DIRECTIONS

- 1 In frying pan, fry used tea leaves without oil on very low heat.
- 2 Add sesame seeds, bonito, and sardines to pan, and keep frying on low until the ingredients dry completely.
- 3 Add soy sauce and sake to the mix. Stir gently but quickly to blend ingredients well. Continue frying to evaporate the moisture.

Marines set to support Manila in skirmish

Commander says rotational force is ready to back Philippines

MOUNT BUNDEY TRAIN-ING AREA, Australia — A Marine rotational force in northern Australia is ready to back up the Philippines in clashes with China over disputed territory in the South China Sea, according to the force's commander.

"We were given a warning order to support the Philippines defense forces in resupplying of the Second Thomas Shoal," Marine Rotational Force — Darwin commander Col. Brian Mulvihill said recently at an Outback training camp in the Northern Territory

Mulvihill, a veteran of Iraq and Afghanistan, commands 2,000 Marines in the territory. He said members of the rotational force have been in the Philippines for extended periods this vear for the Balikatan, Valiant Shield and Marine Aviation Support Activity exercises.

Clashes between Filipino and Chinese forces at the shoal have intensified in recent months. The Chinese coast guard has interrupted Filipino navy and coast guard efforts to resupply troops on the grounded BRP Sierra Madre. The rusted warship houses a garrison to reinforce the Philippines' claim to the shoal.

Beijing and Manila agreed recently to deescalate at the shoal without conceding either side's territorial claims, according to statements from both country's foreign ministries reported by The Associated

The Marines have been monitoring events at the shoal over a drone feed, Mulvihill said.

"We were ready to support the Philippine defense forces," he said, noting that Marines across the Pacific are also ready to back

The rotational force can airlift food and water by pushing pallets out of helicopters, he added.

"We can control airspace and aircraft from many nations," he said. "We provide a range of options if a host nation, through the embassy, requires assistance."

The rotational force was also ready to support Papua New Guinea after a deadly May 24 landslide that buried hundreds of people. Marines were in the islands earlier that month, but local officials did not ask for

their help, Mulvihill said. Marine Rotational Force — Darwin has evolved from a unit that trains with its counterparts to a crisis-response force under the Hawaii-based U.S. Indo-

Pacific Command, he said. "Anything we do here, we are partnered with another mil-

itary," he said. "In order to create stability in the region we need to partner with the forces that live here and know the region better than we do."

The force sent Marines and sailors to the Micronesian island of Nauru in May and June for

Operation Render Safe, an Australian-led effort to clear explosives dating to World War II from Oceania, Mulvihill said.

The bomb-disposal crews, along with medical personnel, will fly to the Solomon Islands on MV-22 Osprey aircraft to perform the same mission from August to September, he said.

Three Marines attached to Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 363 and deployed with the previous rotation to Darwin died after their MV-22B Osprey crashed on Melville Island, part of the Tiwi Islands, Aug. 4, 2023.

Darwin is an excellent platform for launching forces into Southeast Asia, according to Grant Newsham, a retired Marine colonel and senior researcher with the Japan Forum for Strategic Studies in Tokyo.

"It's good to see Darwin and Northern Territory being used this way ... rather than just as a training area for Marines, Air Force, and Australian and other forces," he said by email Thurs-

The Marines can offer the Philippines fire support coordination. They can help with logistics and intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance and guard locations that support Philippine forces operating towards the disputed shoal, he

"Of course, Marines can deploy aboard Philippine resupply boats alongside [Philippine] personnel," he said.

Marine engineers could repair the Sierra Madre at the shoal and Marine helicopters could resupply it, Newsham added.

"A U.S. amphibious ship or two with Marines and their aircraft and other hardware aboard deployed to Second Thomas Shoal would be a serious force and also sending a clear message," he said. "Deploying Marines in the Philippines with their aviation, long-range rockets, and other hardware has a political significance in itself."

DODEA grad to represent Guam in Paris

Seoul American graduate set to compete in judo at the Olympics

Maria Escano personifies the term international athlete.

The 2019 Seoul American graduate has competed in judo in 15 countries on four continents. She's a college student on scholarship at Sendai University in Japan. She speaks four languages. Her father is Filipino and her mother Russian.

The next step in her 22-year life's journey is in Paris, where Escano will represent Guam in the 57-kilogram weight class.

"Amazing is one way to put it, but when I got the confirmation that I was going, the feeling was indescribable," Escano said. "I cried at first because it has been a really, really long road. I still don't think it's hit me, but I'm really looking forward to the Games."

Escano, 22, has lived in Korea most of her life; it was where she was introduced to judo in Uijeongbu, about 13 miles north of Seoul, when she was just 7 years old.

Her father, Jim, worked as a contractor for U.S. Forces Korea at Camp Red Cloud starting in 1999, then moved to Yongsan Garrison when the former shut down as part of the relocation of U.S. forces south of Seoul. He and his job have since moved to Camp Humphreys.

Escano attended Casey Elementary starting in 2008 then Seoul American until her graduation.

She began her martial arts training at the Uijeongbu Judo Center, under the coach she refers to as her "judo dad," Lee Jong-myong.

She couldn't compete for Korea because it would involve a citizenship change. And could not compete for the States because she wasn't registered with a U.S. club.

Seizing on her family ties to Guam — her grandmother lives there — Escano traveled to Guam in 2017, sought out the island's judo federation and became acquainted with Ricardo Blas, who competed for Guam in the 2008 and 2012 Olympic Games.

"They took a chance on me and I took a chance on them," Escano recalled. "He (Blas) was the one who convinced the

members of Guam's judo team at the Paris Olympics

federation that they should take me in, so I have him to thank for opening the door."

Escano began competing for Guam in 2018, graduated a year early from Seoul American High School and earned a scholarship to attend Sendai University in Japan, about halfway between Misawa Air Base and Tokyo.

She credits Sendai husbandand-wife coaches Mitsutoshi and Kazue Nanjo for pushing her in her judo career, and coach Lee for getting her started lo' those many years ago.

"But I would say that my parents are the ones I'm forever grateful for," Escano said. "I couldn't have done it without them. They do so much for me and my journey."

In addition to South Korea and Japan, Escano has competed in Hong Kong, Italy, Hungary, Tahiti, Australia, Bulgaria, Poland, Turkey, Croatia, France, Austria and the old Soviet republics of Azerbaijan and Georgia.

"It was definitely an experience, to say the least," Escano said. "I wouldn't be half the person I am without it."

In short, it's been a whirlwind journey to her first Olympics bout Monday.

"Absolutely insane," Escano said of her roundabout road to Paris. "But I wouldn't have it any other way."

New strategy for the High North unveiled

US military calls for updated tech and improved communications

WASHINGTON — The Defense Department is working to modernize early warning systems and build a communication network in the Arctic as warmer weather opens more waterways and allows Russia and China to threaten stability in the region.

"Climate change and the resulting shifts in the operating environment require us to rethink how we best protect our warfighters and prevent conflict. This transformation affects how we support our allies and partners, and it impacts our ability to deter and, if needed, defeat our adversaries. And that's exactly what this new Arctic strategy takes into account," said Kathleen Hicks, the deputy defense secretary.

The U.S. will take a "monitor and respond" approach by enhancing the Joint Force's Arctic technology, engaging with allies and partners, including local authorities and Alaskan native tribes, and being more present in the Arctic region, according to the 2024 Arctic Strategy released recently by the Pentagon.

The 18-page document includes efforts to update long-range early warning systems and tracking sensors and maritime surveillance systems for the North American Aerospace Defense Command, as well as conduct independent and joint military operations in the region.

The strategy comes as the Arctic warms three times faster than the rest of the planet. The Arctic could experience its first practically ice-free summer by 2030, according to the Defense Department. Melting sea ice opens the possibility of new shipping lanes and greater access to undersea natural resources that Russia has been looking to exploit.

Russia, the largest of the eight Arctic nations, has built up military infrastructure in the region and has a clear route to the U.S. through the Arctic. Russia's Arctic access, the document reads, could be used to constrain the ability of the United States to respond to crises in Europe and the Indo-Pacific regions.

Additionally, China declared itself a "near-Arctic state" in 2018, signaling interest in the region. Russia and China have

been collaborating on development in the Arctic, as well as conducting joint training exercises for years, raising U.S. and NATO concerns.

"We must have a strategy that ensures our military readiness in the face of these changes, ensuring our ability to quickly respond to threats in the region and to the overall demands they place on our force," Hicks said.

The 2024 strategy, she said, works to that end.

Iris Ferguson, the deputy assistant secretary for Arctic & Global Resilience, described the strategy as being "action oriented," which she said distinguishes it from prior Arctic strategies.

"We unpack where we need to sustain our investments, especially in critical capabilities. What do we have to see? How do we communicate? Do we have the right equipment to operate in the region? My office exists to champion these capabilities, which are vital to the successful implementation of our strategy," Ferguson said.

To better monitor the High North, the Defense Department will modernize its long-range aerospace and maritime surveillance systems. The Pentagon is also researching options for new space-based missile-warning and observational systems and assessing ways to improve ground-based sensors to complement existing NORAD capabilities. Hicks estimated the Defense

Department had invested \$43 million in ground-based sensors in recent years.

A lack of satellite coverage in the Arctic has challenged the establishment of communications that would facilitate tactical and strategic communications, the strategy reads. To combat this, the Pentagon has contracted Starlink, SpaceX and OneWeb to provide services for satellite communications terminals. Connecting terminals to satellite constellations will be tested in the summer of 2025, Ferguson said.

The Defense Department is

also investing in cold weather equipment and mobility for Arctic-based troops living and working in the austere environment.

Hicks said the Pentagon is unable to quantify how much is being invested in implementing the Arctic strategy because it does not budget by region. But Ferguson highlighted some of the funding and where it is going:

■ \$7 million dedicated to Pituffik Space Force Base, Greenland, to mitigate permafrost.

■ \$280 million on all-terrain vehicles and cold weather gear for the 11th Airborne Division in Alaska.

■ \$1.8 billion from the Space Force for a high-frequency military satellite communications system designed to provide 24/7 secure, anti-jam communications for U.S. forces operating in the Arctic.

The strategy also outlines training and operations in the region and a growing partnership between the U.S., Canada and Finland to procure three U.S. Coast Guard ice breakers.

"Should the security environment shift in a way that necessitates a DoD response, DoD will remain able to deploy the joint force globally at the time and place of our choosing. This includes responding in the Arctic, both independently and in cooperation with allies and partners," the strategy reads.

The Defense Department last updated its strategy for the Arctic in 2019, with the first one published in 2013. More than a decade later, Ferguson said the current strategy reflects a "greater awakening" across the Defense Department as enemy capabilities and technology have advanced.

"We can't just show up to operate there," she said. "We have got to exercise proficiency. We have got to make sure that we are working with our partners and actually exercising with one another so that we survive when we are there."

Airman seeking patent for invention

An airman's invention aims to make a lifesaving device wearable and easily accessible in an emergency.

It also just might earn him some extra cash.

Senior Airman Isaiah Demillo, 23, stationed at Sheppard Air Force Base in Texas, applied for a patent in February for the Demillo Rigger's tourniquet



Recently, the country liaison for the 82nd Training Support Squadron was headed to a six-week Air Force course in Pittsburgh to refine his proto-

type and get the backing of medical experts before seeking wide-scale adoption.

Demillo, from Denver, Colo., joined the Air Force in 2021 and a year later found himself asking questions during a Tactical Combat Casualty Care course.

"They told us to never use a belt because it doesn't generate the pressure needed to stop massive bleeding," he said. "It's because the belt was missing the spinning portion that applies pressure with the (combat application) tourniquet. So I thought to myself, 'Add one.'"

The belt can be worn with operational camouflage pattern uniforms and is designed to be self-applied. Demillo hopes it will one day be sold in base exchanges and recommended in the very combat care course that spurred the idea.

"I couldn't tell you where my nearest tourniquet in this building is right now," he said. "So if somebody has it on their waist and it's constantly on them and it's a part of your uniform, it's integrated into your lifestyle."

Demillo wasn't the first to imagine a tourniquet on a belt, but existing models used a ratchet to tighten the device, which could lead to tissue damage, he said.

He wrote up his concept and reached out to the base's Spark Cell, which is part of a network of innovation offices at Air Force bases around the world.

The cell referred him to a patent lawyer at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio. He began deconstructing tourniquets and planning what his product would look like before making a computer-aided drafting file.

He contacted other units to help him 3D print and sew on the device. The initial prototype cost about \$46.

Demillo signed away a portion of his rights to proceeds from sales in exchange for the Air Force's assistance. He can't charge the Air Force for using the patent, but Demillo said he would receive the first \$2,000 and 15% of commercial royalties afterward.

Tech. Sgt. Daniel Ramsden, a deputy in the wing's digital integration office, helped Demillo in the belt's early days.

"I have full confidence that he is going to do something with this," Ramsden said. "He is one of the most driven people that I've met."

CDC eases rules on rabies for dogs coming to the US

Due to public outcry, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has eased restrictions on dogs coming into the United States from countries with low or no risk of rabies.

The CDC announced recentlythat it will require just one form from dog owners entering the U.S. with their pets instead of a package of documents it set forth earlier this month in new regulations.

"These updates incorporate the feedback received from the public, industry partners, and various countries on the dog importation rule, and clarify and simplify the processes for those bringing dogs from dog rabies-free or low-risk countries," the CDC's official website states.

The rules took effect Aug. 1, the tail end of the military's busy season for permanent changes of duty stations, which typically occurs from May to August.

Under the latest revisions, dogs that have spent the previous six months in a country free of or at low risk for canine rabies will need only the free CDC Dog Import Form available online.

The pet owner may complete the form on the day of travel, according to the CDC's website. The document may be printed or shown on a phone screen to U.S. customs officials or airline representatives.

Dogs still must be microchipped and at least 6 months old at time of entry to the U.S. and appear healthy upon arrival.

Meeting all the new requirements to bring a dog into the U.S. can be pricey. To obtain a health certificate, dogs may undergo preliminary requirements, including microchipping, vaccinations and bloodwork, according to Pet Relocation, an international pet transportation company.

On average, pet owners may expect to pay between \$50 and \$200 for those services, Pet Relocation states on its website. Finally, the dog must undergo a veterinary exam to complete the health certificate, another \$50 to \$200.

The CDC provides a list of highrisk countries on its website. If the country is not listed, it is considered low risk or free of canine rabies.

CDC experts in the poxvirus and rabies branch annually assess individual countries' rabies statuses worldwide.

Since the CDC first revised its guidelines last month, eight airlines have announced they will no longer fly dogs with their owners, the Military Times reported.

Information on whether any of them will change that policy was not immediately available.

Military members making PCS moves sometimes fly on commercial airlines due to limited space for pets aboard the Patriot Express, which is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. The Patriot Express is a contracted passenger air service that links the United States with its overseas installations.

Lufthansa, a German airline, decided last month to stop carrying pet dogs starting Aug. 1, except service dogs. That rule was recently still posted on Lufthansa's website.
