



# Quick & healthy Guam recipes

n Guam, we love to eat — and as proud as we are of our barbecue and as much as we love to both laugh at and laud the myriad expressions of our Spam addiction, the resulting dietary habits combined with a variety of other factors have caused lifestyle issues such


as diabetes and heart disease to increase. But eating healthy can be expensive! To cut the cost, try sticking to local eats. We have five healthy recipes you can make with local produce. We're not saying to throw away your barbecue grill. But try mixing things up every once in a while by trying out the recipes below. You might find them delicious enough to forget they're healthy.



• 3 lbs local avocado

- 1 cup local tomatoes, diced
- Juice from 5 local calamansi or 1 local lemon (or more/less depending on your preference)
- 1 handful local cilantro, chopped
- 1-2 stalks local green onion, chopped
- 1/2 tsp salt

Mash avocado, then add remaining ingredients and mix.



(Guacamole)

- 1 local cucumber, sliced
- 2 local green onion stalks, chopped
- 1/2 cup local tomatoes, sliced
- Sprinkle of paprika
- Your favorite tuna salad mix (we used tuna plus veganaise, mustard, salt and pepper)

Lay cucumber slices down and top with tomatoes and tuna salad. Sprinkle with paprika and green onion.









## NATO allies getting ready to down drones

# After breaches, alliance turns to Merops system for eastern flank

NOWA DEBA, Poland — U.S. soldiers are training alongside Polish and Romanian forces on a counter-drone system rushed to NATO's eastern flank after a recent spate of unmanned aerial incursions across Europe.

U.S. and NATO officials, drawing lessons from the war in Ukraine, have long argued that the alliance needs cheaper ways to counter drones, since firing traditional air-defense systems at them is too expensive and often impractical. That urgency grew after about 20 unmanned aircraft crossed into Polish airspace in September, followed days later by an incursion into Romania.

NATO blamed Russia for those violations, which proved to be the final push for Poland and Romania to purchase the U.S.-made Merops counter-drone system.

The system has been battletested in Ukraine, where local forces have used it to shoot down Russian-made Shahed drones and other incoming threats, according to U.S. military officials.

Poland and Romania received their first Merops systems in November, and training alongside U.S. soldiers began here at one of Poland's largest military training areas soon afterward.

"It's very lethal, very effective, but the key piece here is that it's cost effective," said Brig. Gen. Curtis King, head of the 10th Army Air and Missile Defense Command.

During a demonstration on Nov. 18, the Merops system sat in the back of a midsize pickup truck. Once launched, its interceptor shot through the air at speeds officials said exceeded 150 mph, identifying drones and passing within feet of them in flight.

Officials said that in a real-life scenario, the interceptor would carry explosives and detonate to destroy its target. Each interceptor costs about \$15,000, and the system overall is roughly onetenth the price of the Shahed drones Moscow builds and employs, they said.

That matters because, until now, responding to incursions often meant scrambling NATO fighter jets, which cost tens of thousands of dollars per flight. And in a conflict like the one

playing out in Ukraine, large numbers of interceptors would be needed to counter repeated drone swarms.

Another advantage of Merops, made by the company Project Eagle, is its ability to use artificial intelligence to navigate even when satellite and electronic communications are jammed, according to the company.

"This is one of many capabilities that NATO nations are going to have to look to employ to defeat the drones," King said, adding that the war in Ukraine shows how quickly modern warfare evolves and how weapons development must keep pace.

U.S. Army Europe and Africa says Merops is the first system fielded since the announcement of the Eastern Flank Deterrence Line, a concept unveiled earlier this year by commander Gen. Christopher Donahue. The plan envisions a mix of manned and robotic forces linked by a shared data network to repel any attack on NATO territory.

Under the concept, low-cost, easily replaceable hardware and software feed live targeting data to front-line robotic platforms, which can strike enemy drones and ground forces while absorbing the first wave of an assault. The goal is to deter an attack or blunt one long enough for NATO's manned units to regain the initiative and launch a counteroffensive.

Army officials say the approach is meant to be scalable and repeatable across the eastern flank, using rapidly deployable technologies that can overwhelm an adversary and deny key terrain.

It's one of several efforts being

pushed in Europe to counter future drone attacks, as the U.S. and its allies scramble to find effective, affordable solutions.

Speaking on the sidelines of the training, Lt. Gen. Stanislaw Czosnek, deputy chief of the general staff of the Polish armed forces, said Poland plans eventually to field its own domestically built counter-drone systems but needed a quick solution to fill an immediate capability gap.

"The airspace violation we witnessed recently forced us to accelerate," Czosnek said. "We want to be safer than we are now. This is a gap filler."

Merops' success on the battlefield in Ukraine was a major reason why Poland selected the platform, Czosnek said.

According to King, Merops has been responsible for up to 40% of the Shahed drones shot down by Ukrainian forces. He added that other counter-drone systems are being developed across the alliance that rely on similar radar,

with the goal of allowing partners to operate different systems interchangeably.

Sgt. 1st Class Corey Myers, a platoon sergeant with Germanybased 1st Battalion, 57th Air Defense Artillery Regiment, said he and his soldiers found the system intuitive.

"It's a simple system to understand," Myers said. "If you're good with an Xbox controller, you're good."

The U.S. military does not currently field Merops, but U.S. Army Europe and Africa sent troops to the roughly two-week training event in Poland so they can help train partner forces who adopt it in the future.

"It feels extremely important being here," said Sgt. Riley Hiner, another member of 1-57. "With all the Shaheds Russia is flying, I think this is the way forward."

# General: 'East up' highlights advantages

# USFK commander urges adjusting view of Pacific region on maps

The commander of U.S. Forces Korea is urging military planners to rethink how they view East Asia — literally — by rotating the map.

Army Gen. Xavier Brunson argues that turning a regional map 90 degrees to place east at the top reveals overlooked strategic advantages for the United States and its allies.

He outlined the idea in an opinion piece posted Nov. 16 on USFK's website.

"The most profound strategic insights sometimes emerge from the simplest shifts in perspective," he wrote. "In the Indo-Pacific theater, where geographic relationships determine operational possibilities and alliance effectiveness, military planners may be overlooking critical advantages simply because of how they view their maps."

An "east-up" map, Brunson wrote, highlights how South Korea, Japan and the Philippines — all U.S. treaty allies — gain strategic depth through cooperation at a time when Washington has encouraged closer coordination in the face of challenges from China, North Korea and Russia

Historical grievances and territorial disputes have often slowed such efforts.

In the column, titled "The East-Up Map: Revealing Hidden Strategic Advantages in the IndoPacific," Brunson wrote that the traditional U.S. view emphasizes the Indo-Pacific's vast distances and downplays the benefits of deployed forces.

The east-oriented perspective, he said, shows that troops on the Korean Peninsula are not "distant assets requiring reinforcement," but instead are already situated inside the "bubble perimeter" the U.S. would need to penetrate during a crisis.

USFK's headquarters at Camp Humphreys lies just 158 miles from Pyongyang, North Korea, 612 miles from Beijing and 500 miles from Vladivostok, Russia.

"Korea is positioned to address northern threats from Russia while simultaneously providing western reach against Chinese activities in the waters between Korea and China," Brunson wrote.

From Beijing's vantage point, Brunson added, U.S. installations such as Osan Air Base south of Seoul do not appear remote but instead offer "resources positioned to achieve effects in or around China."

"Perhaps the most significant insight from east-up mapping is the emergence of a strategic triangle connecting Korea, Japan and the Philippines," he wrote. "When these three mutual defense treaty partners are viewed as vertices of a triangle rather than isolated bilateral relationships, their collective potential becomes clear."

In written responses to South Korean media, Brunson expanded on that concept: "Each partner brings a distinct capability: Korea's central depth, Japan's technological advantage and maritime reach, and the Philippines' access to key southern sea lanes."

Brunson argues that U.S. forces already in the region can impose costs on adversaries while

retaining defensive advantages and that current force posture, particularly in South Korea, may provide greater strategic value than widely recognized.

The east-up approach mirrors long-standing Australian strategic thinking and aligns with India's "Look East" perspective, said Paul Buchanan, an American security analyst based in New Zealand.

U.S. commanders, he said by email, should study regional geopolitics in countries such as Thailand, Japan, South Korea, Indonesia and Australia "to get more well-rounded East-Up perspective rather than something more narrowly construed by U.S. interests alone."

# Guam's 3D-printing hub aims to cut months off repair times

A Navy-backed 3D-printing lab under construction on Guam aims to slash the monthlong wait for ship and infrastructure parts on the island by producing them locally.

The Guam Additive Manufacturing and Materials Accelerator, or GAMMA, held a ceremonial groundbreaking on Nov. 7 for its 8,000-square-foot site in Dededo's Pacific Industrial Park. The \$40 million project is led by the Applied Science & Technology Research Organization of America.

Once complete, the facility will house equipment for measuring, testing and designing metal and plastic industrial components.

The Maryland-based research institute hopes to have it operating as early as spring, said GAMMA general manager Alex Benham.

"It might not be full-scale manufacturing, but we can produce parts" by March or April, he said.

Despite its cost and planned capabilities — including a \$5 million investment with another \$12 million expected — the lab is not intended to design new components.

"They just want to be able to get parts now. They don't need to be better than the past ones they just need to be as good," Benham said. "The problems we're solving with additive [manufacturing] is entirely a logistical problem."

Benham said GAMMA's primary customer will be the Navy, particularly the five nuclear-powered fast-attack vessels in Submarine Squadron 15 at Naval Base Guam. Among the most in-demand items are pump impellers — fan-like parts that move fluid through pumps.

"It's a common part that is classically hard to design and hard to manufacture, but [additive manufacturing] comes in and kind of solves all that," he said.

The Air Force and Marine Corps are also evaluating the lab's potential, especially for producing ground-vehicle components that corrode quickly in Guam's climate, Benham said.

Civilian infrastructure operators, including power, water and emergency services, may also benefit from the ability to reverse-engineer and reproduce

# Survey finds mold, air quality problems

# Many significant or dangerous issues cited in military housing

A survey last month of service members living in military housing drew nearly 3,400 respondents who cited at least one significant or dangerous issue in their homes.

The online survey by the non-profit Change the Air Foundation attracted respondents from all four military branches and the Coast Guard from 57 installations across 30 states and the District of Columbia. It sought answers to an online questionnaire rather than through random sampling.

About three-quarters of respondents said the health of family members had been negatively affected by housing issues.

Change the Air Foundation advocates for improved indoor air quality.

The findings echo the conclusions of federal watchdogs in recent reports.

In a 2023 report, the Government Accountability Office detailed squalid living conditions in military housing, such as overflowing raw sewage, mold and rodent infestation.

An audit earlier this year by the Defense Department Office of Inspector General that looked at seven installations managed by a private entity found that lax inspection protocols led to families moving into homes that had unresolved health and safety

The new survey report con-

tains several dozen excerpts of comments made by respondents concerning their experiences.

An active-duty service member in Texas, not identified by name, said his family's housing experience "financially leveled us."

"We left military housing after over a year of being displaced, having been placed in three homes that contained toxigenic molds, and walked into a rental off post with nothing but a week's worth of clothing," the service member said.


"We ended up having to sell our home in our home state to pay for basic furniture and begin treatments. We have never recovered."

Two-thirds of respondents said they had mold problems in their homes and that they felt "stuck without further options," according to the survey report.

Almost half the respondents reported that housing-related issues had affected their "ability to perform duties and maintain mission readiness," according to the survey report.

Parents answering the survey indicated that housing problems had led to changes of mood or anxiety in their children, specifying respiratory, skin and sinus problems as being most common.

An active-duty service member in Texas said that while living in military housing "my kids were regulars" at the local urgent care with breathing prob-

lems and chronic congestion.

"Once we moved everything cleared up," she said. "They haven't had any issues since we left that house."

The findings illustrate a housing system that is failing those it is intended to support, according to the survey's executive summary

"The widespread prevalence of hazardous conditions — paired with unresolved maintenance requests, declining physical and mental and cognitive health, and the heavy burden placed on families — shows the current model is neither sustainable nor acceptable," the summary states.

The foundation contends that a major step in improving military housing would be to provide service members with reliable housing condition records.

"For years, military families have lived in homes with no clear history of past repairs, unresolved issues, or environmental risks," the survey report states. "Without a transparent, verifiable trail of repairs, families are forced to navigate problems blindly, often discovering hidden hazards only after their health or belongings have already been profoundly affected.

"This absence of documentation also prevents commanders and housing officials from identifying patterns, holding providers accountable, or intervening early when serious issues emerge."

## Last-of-its-kind Independence-class LCS commissioned

The newest ship in the Navy, the USS Pierre, was commissioned Saturday in Panama City, Fla.: "Welcome to the fleet," said Navy Secretary John Phelan, who gave the keynote address.

Pierre is the 19th and final Independence-variant littoral combat ship. The ship bears the name of the capital city of South Dakota.

The commissioning of the Pierre marks the end of an era.

Littoral combat ships were designed to be fast, nimble vessels prized for their abilities in coastal areas and the open ocean.

In the early 2000s, shipbuilders developed two variants, Independence and Freedom, each capable of surface warfare and mine hunting. The ships have different hulls and are designed and built by separate shipbuild-

ers.

At one point, the Navy planned to have the ships make up about one-sixth of the service's oceangoing fleet.

But the Independence variant suffered costly setbacks and delays, including cracked hulls and propulsion issues.

About 17 Independence-class vessels are active.

The Freedom variant also was plagued by propulsion problems and other costly issues.

As a result, the Navy in 2022 proposed mothballing nine Freedom-class ships well ahead of their end-of-service dates. Ultimately, five of the ships were saved.

About 10 Freedom-class ships remain in service, according to the Navy's website. The variant's final vessel, USS Cleveland, is planned to be commissioned this

fall, according to usscleveland.org.

The service now is prioritizing production of the Constellation-

class frigate, which it says delivers a more powerful punch.

But with the aging Avengerclass minesweepers nearing retirement, the Navy recently designated at least three Independence-class ships — USS Canberra, USS Tulsa and USS Santa Barbara — to be homeported in Bahrain.

The USS Pierre — led by Cmdr. Justin Guernsey — will have a crew of 112 and depart Panama City next week, making several stops before arriving at its homeport of San Diego in December.

In the week leading up to the commissioning ceremony, the Pierre crew spent time around Panama City, hosted tours onboard for local organizations and built ties with the city hosting their ship's commissioning ceremony.

# Rise in military aviation accidents seen

### Serious mishaps rose significantly from 2020 to 2024, killing 90

WASHINGTON — Serious U.S. military aviation mishaps rose significantly between 2020 and 2024, killing 90 people and costing billions in damage, according to new Pentagon data provided to Democratic senator Elizabeth Warren of Massachusetts.

There were a total of 4,820 mishaps from October 2019 to July 2024, including 222 of the most severe "Class A" incidents, which result in damage of at least \$2.5 million, destroy aircraft, or lead to fatalities or permanent full disability.

The rate of such accidents rose from 1.30 mishaps per 100,000 flight hours in 2020 to 2.02 mishaps per 100,000 flight hours in 2024 — an increase of 55%, according to Warren.

Those mishaps killed 90 service members and Defense Department civilian employees, destroyed 89 aircraft and cost the military \$9.4 billion. There were

25 fatalities, 14 destroyed aircraft and costs of \$1.7 billion in the first half of the 2024 budget year alone, according to the data.

"These data reveal that [the Defense Department] must make additional efforts to improve aviation safety, and that Congress must act," said Warren in a letter sent to Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth.

The senator has partnered with Sen. Dan Sullivan, R-Alaska, both members of the Senate Armed Services Committee, on an amendment included in the Senate's annual defense policy bill that would require more transparency from the military's safety investigation boards.

The boards identify root factors and safety issues that contribute to aviation accidents, but their reports are not made public or provided to lawmakers.

If adopted by the House and Senate as part of the 2026 National Defense Authorization Act, the measure would give lawmakers access to summaries of investigations over the past three years and help Congress in its oversight role of preventing accidents, Warren said.

The data provided by the Pentagon shows the Marine Corps had the highest average rates of Class A mishaps out of all the military branches, with a 194% increase from 2020 to 2024. In 2023, the service's commandant ordered all Marine units to review their approach to safety after two aircraft crashes within days of each other killed four Marines.

Aviation mishaps continued across all the services this year.

In January, an Army helicopter collided with a commercial passenger plane over Washington, D.C., killing 67 people. The Navy has lost several F/A-18 Super Hornet fighter jets to mishaps, including incidents this spring where two jets fell off the deck of the USS Harry S. Truman aircraft carrier.

Most recently in October, a Super Hornet jet and a helicopter assigned to the aircraft carrier USS Nimitz crashed into the South China Sea within 30 minutes of each other.

Warren said she is seeking more recent crash data from the Pentagon as well as information on how the military is addressing the rising rate of accidents.

### GAO: DOD vulnerable due to info available to public

The Pentagon's missions and personnel are increasingly vulnerable to "malicious actors" who can disrupt operations by aggregating digital information from data brokers, websites and other sources, a government watchdog concluded in a report issued Monday.

An 18-month audit by the Government Accountability Office of 10 Defense Department components — all five military services, U.S. Cyber Command, U.S. Special Operations Command, National Security Agency, Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency and Defense Intelligence Agency — found that all but one "did not consistently train personnel on risks of digital information in the public across all relevant security areas," the report states.

U.S. Special Operations Command provided a digital force protection training course aimed at helping personnel manage their online identities, among other things, the GAO found.

"Eight of ten components did

not conduct assessments of threats across the required security areas of force protection, insider threat, mission assurance, and operations security," the report states. "While the department has taken actions related to a wide field of traditional security areas, its actions to reduce safety, security, privacy, and operational risks posed by the digital profile are limit-

The security risks posed by malicious actors — criminals, terrorists and adversarial nations — have increased with the proliferation of ubiquitous digital devices, social media and "big data" that can now be combed using artificial intelligence.

"The digital activity of DOD's service members, contractors, and family members — from websites visited to emails sent to photos posted on social media can generate volumes of traceable data that can threaten their privacy and safety, and ultimately our national security," the GAO report states. "These digital footprints represent a piece of a larger puzzle that, when tied to

other sources, can create a digital profile and adversely affect military functions and missions."

unknowingly leave behind sensitive information via digital activity.

A malicious actor can create a digital footprint for an individual by purchasing personal information from a data broker for just pennies and combining it with online posts and location "pings" from cellular towers from devices such as fitness trackers, the report states.

The report illustrates a hypothetical scenario in which the operations of an aircraft carrier could be disrupted or sabotaged

by a malicious actor using Pentagon news releases, media reports, online activity, social media posts and ship coordinates routinely posted by maritime aficionados.



# North Korea labels military drills 'gravely threatening'

Commentary knocks US, South Korean exercises, buildup on Guam, Japan

CAMP HUMPHREYS, South Korea — North Korea's government media has denounced the year's U.S. military activity in the region as "gravely threatening" to "strategic stability" on the Korean Peninsula.

A series of exercises on and off the peninsula encroaches upon North Korea's "sphere of security," according to an unsigned commentary published on the Korean Central News Agency website.

"We have already made it clear that all threats encroaching upon our sphere of security will become direct targets of the [Democratic People's Republic of Korea] and be managed in a necessary way," the KCNA commentary states, referring to the country by its formal name.

U.S. Forces Korea responded that military exercises by the U.S. and South Korea "ensure the readiness necessary to meet the expectations of those we lead and those we are sworn to protect," according to a Nov. 28 email from USFK spokesman David Kim.

"Our training events are transparent and focused on deterrence, defense, and the maintenance of peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula and across the region," Kim said. "We maintain a strictly defensive posture, and our exercises are designed to prevent conflict, not provoke it."

KCNA lists a series of "reckless military moves" this year, most recently an anti-submarine and counter special operations drill with South Korea.

The four-day Maritime Counter Special Operations Forces Exercise involved the guided missile destroyer USS Dewey, an

MH-60R Seahawk helicopter, two U.S. AH-060E Apache helicopters and one U.S. P-8A Poseidon surveillance aircraft, according to a U.S. Navy news release Nov. 21. The exercise took place Nov. 17 to 21 in Pyeongtaek and offshore, according to the Navy.

"Our routine and long-planned defensive training exercises are essential to ensure we meet our mission: to defend the homelands and uphold our ironclad commitment to [South Korea]," Kim said.

The South Korea Joint Chiefs of Staff said the nation's military "conducted an annual defensive exercise for the stability on the Korean Peninsula and the region, and we will continue this effort."

KCNA also referenced a U.S. Air Force consolidation this year of F-16 Fighting Falcons from Misawa Air Base, Japan, and Kunsan Air Base, South Korea, into two "super squadrons" at Osan Air Base, 48 miles south of the border between North and South.

The super squadron initiative is a yearlong "force-optimization

test designed to see if a larger, consolidated squadron can generate more combat power and operate more efficiently," according to an Air Force news release in August.

KCNA said the Air Force "is running amuck" by creating "two 'super-powerful wings'" at Osan.

"It is an irrefutable fact that it is aimed at deterring the DPRK and regional countries by force and securing air superiority in contingency," the commentary states.

The commentary also criticized the U.S. for military exercises and arms buildups in Japan and Guam "targeting independent sovereign states in the region."

South Korea for the first time sent its own domestically designed and built submarine and other assets to Guam for a biennial Silent Shark exercise starting Nov. 18, according to the Korea JooAng Daily on Nov. 17.

## Airdrop drills prep for speedy deliveries

JOINT BASE PEARL HAR-BOR-HICKAM, Hawaii — In just four days, an Army aerial delivery unit from Alaska packed more than 160 tons of gear onto parachute-rigged pallets to be dropped over Hawaii's Big Island — a logistical surge at the heart one of the service's largest Pacific combat exercises.

The 4th Quartermaster Theater Aerial Delivery Company, based at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, underpins airdrop operations for U.S. forces across the Indo-Pacific, especially in remote spots where parachuting supplies is the only lifeline.

"The uniqueness of the Pacific area is that it's vast," Capt. Cody Poos, the company's commander, said Nov. 6 as about 60 soldiers prepared pallets inside a joint base hangar.

During the 15-day Joint Pacific Multinational Readiness Center exercise, which ended Nov. 17, the company loaded everything from Humvees to barrels of water onto specialized 8-, 12- and 16-foot steel pallets.

Each pallet was rigged with an elaborate system of parachutes, the first of which pulls the load out the back of an Air Force C-17 Globemaster III followed by additional chutes that carry it safely to the ground.

The pallets were dropped from about 1,000 feet onto the

Pohakuloa Training Area, a sprawling expanse on Hawaii Island used heavily by the 25th Infantry Division during the drills. The unit later recovered the pallets for reuse.

"So if you need something quick, yes, barges can move, and boats can move, but it's not going to be quick," Poos said. "Yes, they can go to seaports, but there's many islands, many locations, that just don't have a deep enough draft or deep enough port. So aerial delivery gives that option. You can reach farther, you can reach faster, you can reach more precisely."


