The class, programmed and led by Bridget Hefele, is designed to give students the opportunity to gain a realistic perspective of employment through hands-on experience. This school year, Osan Post Office Postmaster Tavares Harris brought on students. The student interns assisted in the processing and distribution of mail items totaling over 737,000 pounds while gaining unmeasurable experience in both Postal and military life.

Radiology Intern and Senior Elisa Nasci said Career Practicum "gave me the amazing opportunity to get out to the job world and give me the chance to work with some amazing


people."



Jaha Sonmandoo was recognized in the 2018 Michelin Guide for serving excellent mandu (dumplings).

They do not use many seasonings, which gives the mandu a rather plain taste, but dip it in the in-house traditional Korean soy sauce and your taste buds will be awakened to

a whole new world! Each bowl of mandu guk (dumpling soup) is a pure expression of the chef's efforts. The chewy mandu shell and mildly seasoned flavors are tempting. The restaurant features large windows so diners can enjoy their meal while gazing at the beauty of Bugaksan Mountain.

The chicken is good on its own, but becomes something extraordinary when paired with the crunchy bean sprouts. The servings of chicken are generous, and bean sprouts are unlimited, so you're sure to get your fill!

The Garden of Morning Calm

The Garden of Morning Calm, located in Gapyeong, Gyeonggi-do, is just a 50 minute-ride out of Seoul. It is considered the best relaxing attraction in the Seoul metropolitan area, bringing in more than 1.3 million visitors a year. The name "Morning Calm" came from Sir Tagore, a poet from India, who described Korea as "a land of morning calm."

The Garden of Morning Calm consists of various themed gardens, including Eden's Garden, Morning Square, and Korean Garden, each relaxing in its own style. One of the most popular spots among tourists is Seohwayeon Pond, a beautiful water garden that featured in the Korean drama "Love in the Moonlight (2016)."



Forest of Wisdom

While it isn't a garden with flowers and plants, you can still find plenty of relaxation at the extraordinary "Forest of Wisdom" within Paju Book City. Here, you can take a walk along towering rows of books for a special experience. The library holds more than 500,000 books that were all donated on bookshelves reaching

a height of 8 meters and covering a distance of 3.1 kilometers. The books are grouped by donors instead of following the traditional library classification. Many book lovers come to the Forest of Wisdom to savor the atmosphere of being surrounded by so many books rather than to actually read here.



Ilseon Lake Park

Ilseon Lake Park is one of the most easily accessible relaxing attractions in the Seoul metropolitan area via public transit. A large man-made lake spanning over 900,000 square meters, the park offers visitors a chance to relax with more than 100 species of wild flowers and 200,000 diverse trees. Visitors can also enjoy a stroll

around the lake along the 7.5-kilometer-long walking trail or zoom past it riding a bicycle on a 4.7-kilometer-long bike path. The park hosts International Horticulture Goyang Korea and Goyang Autumn Flower Festival annually. With different flowers blooming throughout the year, it's a perfect place for a walk or a picnic.



The Botanical Garden BCJ (Byukchoji)

The final attraction we recommend for a relaxing day-trip out of Seoul is The Botanical Garden BCJ. The garden has a great atmosphere, created by many rare plants, famous sculptures, and beautiful fountains. The garden is divided into themed areas, such as the Fluttering

Area, and Grecian Gods Area. Amenities within the garden include a brunch café, food court, gift shop, and gallery. Hallyu fans will love to find the areas that appeared in popular K-dramas such as "Descendants of the Sun (2016)" and "My love from the Star (2013)."




Beneath the sands of Haeundae Beach, Sea Life Busan Aquarium features hundreds of species of marine life and face-to-face experiences suitable for all ages.


Spend all the time you want in a 260-foot underwater tunnel inches away from stingrays, sharks and dozens of other sea life. The giant groupers will stare back at you as you marvel at their size.

The aquarium is the largest sea-life experience in Busan, South Korea, and the only one underground in the entire country.

Various shows are performed throughout the day, including feedings for sharks, penguins, otters and stingrays.

Sea Life is home to more than 250 species, ranging from the smallest clownfish to enormous sharks that trained divers feed by hand for all to see.

For an additional fee, staff will take guests in a glass bottom boat over the 790,000-gallon main tank for a more personal experience.

The marine exhibit also features the more adorable creatures, such as dozens of penguins, otters and even an enormous, three-finned sea turtle that is just waiting to photobomb guests at every opportunity.

One of the most unique exhibits at this aquarium is the Rock Pool, which allows visitors to hold

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to discover each species. Admission costs 23,000 won for children 12 and younger. Before going, it's worth visiting the aquarium's English website for additional discounts.



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

Daecheon Beach

With entertaining rides and great waterfront seafood restaurants and a magnificent 3.5-kilometer coastline, Daecheon Beach is considered a favorite summer gateway amongst Koreans.

This expansive sandy beach is a great place to spread out on and enjoy sand volleyball or sand soccer. Its close proximity to area hotels makes it an easy pick for a weekend itinerary. It is also a 10-minute taxi ride (10,000 won or \$8.32) away from the Daecheon Station and bus terminal.

Paragliding

I had the opportunity to knock off another item from my bucketlist. I had crossed off earlier this year, and at Daecheon I tried paragliding. My experience of tandem paragliding was similar to tandem skydiving. I filled out a waiver and received a briefing from my tandem pilot, Lee Sangki. At the site, other paragliders and I hopped on a truck and were transported to the launch site at an altitude of around 600-meters high. The view was spectacular. While Lee prepared the inflatable canopy, I put on my coveralls. Lee helped me into the harness and checked all of my gear before we took off.

It was much easier than I thought. After a few steps running down the hill, I was soon up in the air, the green farms below, the sea ahead and the mountains on either side of us.

Paragliding differed from skydiving was that it's much gentler and quieter. I enjoyed the view of the landscape and the smooth travel. The paragliding landing was much easier than I experienced before.

Paragliding experience? I absolutely recommend trying this at least once in your life.

Sky Bike (대전해수욕장 스카이바이크)

Another activity you must try at Daechen Beach is the Sky Bike. Plan ahead as there are only two sessions per day: from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

I waited for about 20 minutes to get a “waiting ticket” and spent 15 minutes more until my number was called. Sometimes the tickets are all sold out earlier than its closing time, so come early and spend some time around the beach after you get the waiting number ticket.

Since this attraction requires a minimum of two riders, I asked one couple from Humphreys in the line to ride together with me. The more people in your party, the lower the ticket costs. We paid 26,000 won for three

people.

Hop on and pedal on a track 15 meters above the sea and enjoy the stunning view of the West Sea. The red- and yellow-colored railroad track is automated, you can stop pedaling for a while and sit back and relax. The 40-minute round trip ride was enjoyable, and the sea breeze felt nice.

ZipTrek (zipline)

From the Sky Bike you’ll notice the joyful cheers of people on the nearby zipline. I headed there next for a more accelerated adrenaline rush.

Since it’s the summer holiday season, expect a bit of wait to hop on. I paid 18,000 won for my zipline ticket and spent time on the beach during the 40-minute wait for my turn. You can also buy

an entrance ticket to the observation deck from the 53-meter-high launch point, which includes free beverages and is discounted with a zipline ticket purchase. Whatever you pick to do while you wait, you’ll hear your number called over the loudspeakers.

After I placed my belongings at the ticket counter, the guides got me outfitted in a harness, helmet, and the other necessary gear to launch off on the 613-meter-long zipline, which can reach speeds of up to 80 kilometers per hour.

After a quick photo with the ocean view as my backdrop, the guide counted down before launching me off the zipline platform. The ocean breeze whipped past my face, I was overtaken by adrenaline and the view of the sunset took my breath away. While it may seem a little pricey at first, it was worth every penny and I would definitely do it again.

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Seafood restaurant



Probably one of the most difficult feats of this excursion was finding a restaurant serving Western or Korean food. There was a burger place, but it had bad reviews, so I settled on having seafood.

Most of the restaurants on the beach sell kalguksu soup or grilled clams. However, if you're traveling by yourself, bear in mind that a few do not take solo diners.

Eventually, I settled on Moa-Jogae-Gui, a seafood restaurant serving up kalguksu soup for 7,000 won. Kalguksu, or seafood knife-cut noodle soup, is a hot soup with wheat noodles literally cut by knife. In other parts of South Korea, you may find kalguksu served as a chicken soup, but here in Boryeong, you'll find the restaurants use the local seafood for this delicious soup.



My bowl was served up within 10 minutes of placing my order and I really enjoyed the flavor of this kalguksu.

UYU CHANGGO

(Café and dairy farm)



If you plan to drive down to Boryeong, Uyu changgo is a great pit stop to check out on your way to Daecheon Beach. You'll find this café and dairy farm about a 1.5-hour drive from Camp Humphreys. Here, the dairy cattle wander freely on 810 acres of land.



Uyu changgo can be translated to "milk storage room," but you'll realize that this place is far from a rustic dairy barn. This milk-carton-shaped giant building is a dairy outlet featuring organic items.

I ordered their signature milk ice cream for 3,800 won and roll cake with yogurt filling for 6,500 won. The milk ice cream was simple and delicious. They also offer a milk and chocolate swirl cone for 4,100 won.

The roll cake with gooey and sweet yogurt was really satisfying. Inside the café, you can also pick up merchandise like coffee mugs and other items.



The great thing about this farm is that there are many Instagram-worthy spots. There's also a small petting zoo area where kids can interact with calves, rabbits and goats.

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
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Korea Tip of the Day

Know rules of passing while driving in a tunnel

While it is possible to explore South Korea by public transportation like a train or bus, driving around is a fun and easy way to discover this country. When you're driving on the road, the mountain scenery is probably the most familiar landscape from your car. Over 70 percent of Korea is mountains, which means your travels will likely take you through many of the tunnels running under the mountainous terrain. Here's what you should know before you go!

Prior to 2019, traffic laws banned lane-changing within tunnels in South Korea. Now, the rules are slightly eased and the former solid line on the road is now dotted in certain tunnels. The new rules allow lane changes when absolutely necessary, but never to overtake a car in front of you.

Note that this does not apply to all tunnels and most still have the solid lines. Some regions also have surveillance cameras at the entrance, center and exit of tunnels to ensure drivers are staying in their lanes.

Pay attention to the roads and don't forget to mind the solid and dotted lines. Driving in South Korea can be a great experience, so don't let the rules keep you from hitting the open road!

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
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How to use Bedal Minjok app

STEP 1 & 2 Download Bedal minjok (배달의 민족) from the Apple store or Google Play. Hit the 'My 배민' at the bottom right. And then hit the '로그인해주세요' in red line in photo #2.

STEP 3 & 4 For the easy next order, I recommend you become a member of this app. Tap the '회원가입' at the bottom right in red. You'll see terms and condition boxes for you to fill in photo #4. Fill the boxes circled in red to agree to the terms and hit the blue bar at the bottom.

STEP 5 & 6 Enter your cell phone number and enter a SMS verification number. Next, hit the '다음' in red at the top right. And then enter your E-mail address and hit the '다음' in red at the top right again.

STEP 7 To check duplicate e-mail address, hit the '중복확인' in the red circle. Next, enter info in each blank and hit the '다음' circled in blue at the top right.

Set your delivery location

STEP 8 & 9 & 10 Time to show off your Korean typing skills! Tap the top area in red circled in photo#8 and type in the address where you live first into the red bar in photo#9 and tap the magnifier button. (There is also a GPS button but only use that as reference as it can complicate the search to more complicated Hangul.) Enter your address and tap the address in red to confirm it in photo #10.

STEP 11 Now enter your detail address (i.e. building name and apt. number) in the blank in the red line. Next, tap the blue bar to set up your address completely.

Choose a restaurant and menu

STEP 12 & 13 When you see this tasty screen, it means you're ready to get started! The main screen is categorized based on the menu item. Tap one of the food groups on the main screen, then the app will show you the list of the restaurants near you. Scroll through to choose the restaurant you're craving, and then click to see their delivery menu. The listings also have a star rating which will help you for quick reference and save you the trouble of trying to translate a Korean review.

STEP 14 & 14(1) Tap the green bar at bottom if you want to add your food to the cart. Tap the shopping cart button at the downright in photo#14(1) if you'd like to just order the menu item you have chosen without adding any other items. (Note: Check out the minimum order amount, before ordering it.)

STEP 15 Once you've selected all your items and tapped the green bar, you've reached the final stage of your food-ordering mission! The top box in the red is a place where your detailed address needs to go. If you fully entered your address including your unit number and building name at the stage of STEP 11, then you can skip this box. The second box in green is where you should type in your phone number, skip this verification step as well if you've done this prior step.

Pay for your meal

STEP 16 Scroll down to pay for your order. This is where you choose a payment method. Bedal Minjok offers five options including debit/credit card, cash apps like Naver Pay, Kakao Pay, and Toss. You can see the drop-down payment options after you tap the 신용/체크카드 in red.


STEP 17 If you're an expat, cash apps might not be good options since proving your identity on this is beyond a hassle. The old method of payment in the green and blue is the best option. Payment in green is a cash on delivery option (만나서 현장결제) and blue is a credit/debit card on delivery option (만나서 카드결제).

STEP 18 & 19 & 20 Scroll down. Fill the term and condition in red and then hit the green bar at the bottom in photo #18. At this step shown in photo #19, you'll be required to verify a phone number. Choose the mobile service provider you use and fill the all terms and conditions boxes. Enter info into each blank, then tap the blue bar at the bottom in photo#20. Then get a SMS verification number, enter it in the blank and tap the blue bar at the bottom again.

Review the order details

STEP 21 (fyi-no photo) Before you confirm your order, review the details including delivery fee. It's individual for every restaurant and some of them also have order minimums so keep that in mind. After carefully reviewing your order again, hit the green bar at the bottom to complete your order!

You'll receive a confirmation text message and wait time in a moment. It might be a bit hard for you at first, but once you learn how to use this app it will be a breeze to order food to your door. Bon appetite!

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
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
