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# HISTORIC ALLIANCE

CAMP CASEY - South Korean army Capt. Ha Neul laughed as she recalled meeting her husband, U.S. Army Capt. Miles Gabrielson, last year.

"We have a very different memory over that," she said during a recent interview with the newlyweds at this base 40 miles north of Seoul. "He thought I was smiling at him."

While relationships between Americans and Koreans are not uncommon, the couple's Feb. 20 union became the first of its kind: a marriage between active-duty officers in the U.S. and Korean armies, according to the 2nd Infantry Division.

The bond between Ha, 31, and Gabrielson, 29, both artillery officers, formed in May 2020 after the pair was tasked with one of the most mundane duties in the

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# Kunsan airman has pride in Air Force family

KUNSAN AIR BASE - U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Foster Conner projects a room-brightening personality. He holds his head high, shoulders straight, he's comfortable, confident and proud of who he is.

"In the military, I've found my community," said Conner, 8th Security Forces Squadron Airman at Kunsan Air Base. "A community where I don't have to worry about being shunned. We're all family here."

Before he joined the Air Force, Conner shared how he did have to worry about being shunned...by both his community and his family.

Raised in a strictly religious home, Conner said he was taught to look down on people who fell outside of the community's standards. Until the age of 12, Conner's life revolved around activity inside, and with people from, his church. However, at the age of 12, Conner came out as gay to his family and church.

Immediately, he said he had become one of those lookeddown-upon outsiders. Conner said he was even barred from interacting with his church friends because adults "didn't want him to spread the disease of being gay to other kids."



Conner said he felt he could no longer connect with his parents, spending many sleepless nights in secret, researching why he felt the way he did, because there was no one in his family he could speak with.

The emotional disconnectedness between Conner and his family came to a head when he was 15, and his grandfather died. Between withholding who he truly was from his grandfather under familial pressure. and then being accused of being willfully distant after his death, it was all too much.

Conner said he spent the

rest of his high school years at home, feeling depressed, experiencing suicidal ideations, and unable to escape the weight of confusion and disbelonging in the world.

sought new life experiences, which eventually led him to an Air Force recruiter. There, Conner laid out his family situation and the fact that he



"My recruiter told me the military is a place where all of that stuff doesn't matter," Conner said.

Five years later, Conner is here at Kunsan and he says the recruiter was right.

"In the military, you're all brothers and sisters. It doesn't matter if you're gay or black or this or that, we're all family... I was able to break away from a toxic culture," Conner said. "Standing here today, I would tell my 12 year old self to not fall into the traps you were taught. You are your own person and no matter what they say they can't break you."

Staff Sgt. Foster Conner is an Airman in the United States Air Force. He is gay, and proud to

fter intense 60-minute gym workouts, I typically return to my dorm room to judge myself. Grabbing at what little fat lingers on my stomach, overanalyzing if I'll ever look good enough. The thought of being physically vulnerable quickly forces me to put a shirt on.

Have you ever looked in the mirror and thought to yourself, Wow! I

some people that day never comes, especially in the LGBT community.

The mixture of growing up overweight and in the closet into my 20's, I find myself falling into the category of someone who struggles with body dysmorphia. Often times opting to keep my shirt on at the pool even though I looked similar to most people there.

In my experience, the gay community hyperfocuses on body types casting labels to categorize the shapes and sizes. Whether you are skinny, a twink, hairy, stocky or a bear, the pressure to fit into a certain mold can cause us to feel inadequate.

Being judged by first glances leads someone to care more about the outer appearance rather than their own character. Striving for something unattainable we forget to love ourselves in the process. But then

why should going to the gym everyday be an issue when we are taught to be 'fit to fight?

As a gay male, I tend to view myself in a negative light. I grew up hiding, being ashamed, wondering, "Why me?"

I often felt my sexuality was on display and the need to inform others of the gender I am attracted to so I can prevent offensive gestures.

I find that some topics, especially within our Air Force, are taboo or not discussed. The issue is that so many things thrive in the dark, simply shining light on an issue is not enough to fix it, but it's a start.

It's been 10 years since the repeal of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell." As a member of the LGBT community, I love to see our fighting force making strides towards diversity and inclusion.

The feeling of fitting in, or acceptance, was not something obtained until I arrived

to my first supervi-

sor. To my surprise, I was met with an overwhelming amount of love and acceptance.

With mental health, the stigma is still the same, seek help for a problem and face consequences, whether the case requires that kind of attention or not. Members of the LGBT community often feel the need to fix things alone. I spent 21 years 'in the closet' of a religious family and it made it very difficult to express myself freely.

In my time of need, I got to the point where I reached out for help from my kin, unfortunately, I was met with distain and disapproval and caused an emotional spiral

Thankfully, my supervisor caught my hand and showed me the advantages and support of my Air Force family.

presentation.

The project required them to make a bilingual report for 2nd ID's Republic of Korea-U.S. Combined Division, a unique coalition where U.S. and Korean forces work side by side. For Ha, the project was assigned during "one of the busiest days of my life," when she was finalizing the purchase of a new home.

"I'll do the more important part, which is translating," Ha said she told herself at the time. "So, I went out to do all the [real estate] paperwork and then I came

Meanwhile, Gabrielson completed the lion's share of their presentation. Ha returned and apologetically asked him out to lunch, and then later to a coffee shop.

"I felt bad about it," she said. "I felt bad to make him work for me."

The two gradually grew closer over subsequent lunches and dinners. During one of those get-togethers, Ha brought up her concern about their off-duty meetings, which she described as potentially "scandalous." Ha said she had avoided relationships with service members, in the off chance they could develop into a disreputable affair.

# 'We saw an opportunity'

It was on a night shift during a field exercise when the two "couldn't keep back our feelings for each other anymore," Gabrielson said, and they decided to make their relationship official.

"We agreed to keep it very discreet, not tell anyone for a while," he said, adding that their interactions were kept strictly professional.

"And then, the next day, she told her boss," Gabrielson said, laughing.

Ha said her senior Korean officer was shocked and humbly blamed himself for having introduced the couple.

Nothing prohibits a marriage between active-duty service members from the two countries, a spokesperson for the combined division told Stars and Stripes on a customary condition of anonymity. She said Gabrielson and Ha, who are of

the same rank, went through the proper channels to get their marriage certified.

After thoroughly examining military regulations, Gabrielson proposed to Ha last summer, just three months after they were introduced.

Gabrielson admits their marriage "might have been a fast decision," but insists it was not impulsive.

"In the military, where uncertainty is the nature of our profession, sometimes you have to seize opportunities when they're presented to you," he said. "We didn't know how much time I would be in Korea, and we didn't know how much more time she'd have left in Camp Casey. We saw an opportunity and we went with

leagues, as professional counterparts," he added. "And then we became friends."

They exchanged vows at a Catholic church in Busan, about 220 miles

south of Camp Casey. The ceremony included a Korean-style reception with Ha and Gabrielson wearing traditional Korean clothing.

Gabrielson's family flew in from Connecticut to attend the ceremony. In lieu of a honeymoon, the couple toured five South Korean cities with their families due to coronavirus travel restrictions.

"I am very pleased and proud of their marriage," South Korean army Lt. Col. Son Sanghyun, deputy commander of the 210th Field Artillery Brigade and one of Ha's senior officers, told Stars and Stripes. "I sincerely hope for their best as they continue on with their army career.'

# **Common ground**

Despite wearing different uniforms and being raised in different countries, Gabrielson said he and his wife have a lot in common.

'We both went to military academies," he said, referring to his graduation from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and Ha's graduation from the Korea Military Academy. "We both have the same job, the same rank, and work in the same place. On the surface, you might say we have a lot more in common than a lot of couples from the same country."

Gabrielson and Ha acknowledged there are "huge differences" in their respective cultures but noted that the "biggest glue that kept us together" was their shared Catholic faith.

"That's something that's been important to me, my whole life," Gabrielson said.

Both Gabrielson and Ha said they have no immediate plans to leave the military. Gabrielson intends to extend his tour in South Korea for as long as possible and plans to eventually attend graduate school in the United States.

Ha hopes to attend a military-sponsored study-abroad program there.

"We'll make the most of our time together and hopefully maneuver some kind of way to spend some time in the States," Gabrielson said, adding that he wants to "start a family together" back home.

Soon after their wedding, South Korean news outlets reported on the significance of the union. Gabrielson said "there's no bigger purpose behind our marriage," despite media reports focusing on the historic precedent.

"We're two people that have a lot in common with each other and got married," Gabrielson said. "We just happened to meet through this military venue."

"I would've married [Ha] if she had any other job in the world," he added. "I would've married her if she was from any other country in the world."

# Rising from the sea, Seongsan Ilchulbong Tuff Cone

Seongsan Ilchulbong Tuff Cone, a landmark attraction of Jeju, was formed about 5,000 years ago from an eruption of magma on the ocean floor. It is especially famous as a sunrise viewing spot, known to be one of the top ten exquisite sceneries of Jeju Island.

Besides viewing the sunrise, Seongsan Ilchulbong Tuff Cone is also known to be an excellent trekking spot. The Seongsan-Ojo Trail connects two villages by crossing the peak. Another popular trail, the Jijil Trail, offers a closer look at the UNESCO-designated geopark as well as Jeju's local culture. Walking along one of these paths is recommended to really experience the area; walking all the way to the summit offers views of both the vast volcanic crater in the center and the blue ocean surrounding the area. To complete your trip, head to Seongsanpo Port to watch haenyeo (female divers) at work.

# Feel the breeze at Seopjikoji

A short drive from Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak will take you to Seopjikoji. The name comes from the Jeju dialect for a "Cape of Small Land" due to its peculiar cliff formation that protrudes into the ocean. The picturesque harmony of the hill and ocean attract tourists all year round. You might even be able to sight Jeju ponies grazing on the field of grass.

Walking northeast along the cliff, you will arrive at Bulgeunoreum Volcanic Cone, offering an exquisite view of a white lighthouse with the dark blue sea in the background. Additional noteworthy beauties of Seopjikoji are the Glasshouse and Yumin Art Gallery, two masterpieces designed by world-renowned architect Ando Tadao. The two buildings blend in remarkably well with the surrounding nature.


You can't say you've been to Jeju Island without visiting one of the many oreum, Jeju dialect for volcanic cone. There are approximately 360 oruem scattered throughout Jeju. Among these hundreds of oruems, Yongnuni Oreum Volcanic Cone is undoubtedly the most well-known. It's not far from Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak and has a moderately gentle slope, providing a fairly convenient trail for trekking.

Both Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak and Udo Island can be seen from the peak of Yongnuni Oreum, offering an unforgettable panorama. The view of curvy ridges along with the ocean also serves as an excellent backdrop for memorable photos. If you are looking for a perfect spot for souvenir photos, be sure to check out Yongnuni Oreum Volcanic Cone.

# A long-lasting garden of nutmeg yews, Bijarim Forest


In contrast to Yongnunioreum's open vistas, Bijarim Forest is an ideal spot for a relaxing forest retreat. The dense forest is home to hundreds of bija (nutmeg yew) trees, and is the largest forest in the world to be made up of one plant species. Most of the trees in the forest have lived for 500 to 700 years, earning the forest the nickname "Forest of a Thousand Years." Must-see sights while at Bijarim Forest are none other than the 800-year old tree and the conjoined nutmeg yews.

# Enter the mysterious underground castle, Manjanggul Lava Tube

Of all the oreum on Jeju, Geomunoreum is the only volcanic cone to be designated as a UNESCO World Natural Heritage site. The oreum holds over 20 caves within its body, although only Manjanggul Lava Tube is open to the public. With its profoundly mysterious and grand appearance, taking a step inside the cave is like stepping into Hades' underworld. Follow the tunnel of articulate lava rock formations, and you will soon reach a giant rock pillar that indicates the end of the cave. The cave's temperature fluctuates within 11-21°C regardless of season, allowing visitors to enjoy the magnificent cave all year round.

# Enjoy artwork along the ocean, Jeongbangpokpo Falls and Waljong Art Gallery

Seogwipo, which includes the entire southern half of Jeju, exhibits a great amount of sunshine and warm temperatures, attracting crowds of tourists all year round. One attraction many people choose to visit is Jeongbangpokpo Falls, one of the top three waterfalls on Jeju Island. The water falls 23 meters straight down off the cliff and into a pool before flowing to the sea.

Located on the cliff behind Jeongbangpokpo Falls is Waljong Art Gallery. This gallery is

dedicated to the Korean artist Lee Wal Jong, who settled in Jeju decades ago. The gallery is filled with his inspiring artwork, expressing the beauty of Jeju in his own unique way. The strategic location and glass-walled second floor also offer visitors an amazing view looking over the sea.




# Discover the history and culture of Jeju Island

Yongduam Rock, a top tourist attraction in downtown Jeju, is one of the many natural wonders of Jeiu Island. Formed by underwater lava millions of years ago, eons of weathering from the rain and wind have formed it into the likeness of a dragon's head.

After visiting Yongduam Rock, head down to the Jeju Folklore & Natural History Museum to learn about the development of the island people and culture over time. Not only does Jeju Island have its own dialect, it also has a distinct culture that separates it from the rest of mainland Korea, all of which you can see and enjoy from a quick tour of the museum. Right next to the museum is Samseonghyeol Shrine, a religious site that is also the birthplace of Jeju's ancient mythology. The old trees and traces of the past create a devotional atmosphere.




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# **Gways to enjoy Seoul Forest**



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# 4. Relax in a cafe

These big boxes make up UNDER STAND AVENUE, a popular attraction around Seoul Forest. The containers have been converted into all kinds of shops, from cafés to design products and even clothing. The street space often serves as the venue for concerts by indie bands.





# UNIQUE KAYAKING EXPERIENCE

At the end of the tunnel, you'll reach the wine cellar where you can indulge in a nice glass of mulled wine for 5,000 won (bottle wine costs 49,500 won). Across from the cellar were people splashing around on kayaks in the water, so I knew I'd finally reached the launch point.

I waited about 30 minutes before it was my turn to gear up with a helmet and life jacket and hop into a clear kayak. A clear kayak is the same as your average kayak except it is made of see-through plastic so you can see the water (and the school of fish that live here) surrounding your vessel. It's neat!

I visited on a weekday, so my wait wasn't too bad, but if you're planning to visit on a weekend expect longer lines and wait times.

The kayaking portion of this journey doesn't last very longabout 30 minutes from departure to return to the dock. The good thing is that it wasn't expensive, and I got as many photos as I wanted while I navigated in my kayak.

Spending the day in the Chungju Jade Cave and the surrounding areas was truly a nice way to get a little adventure in before the summer is over. If you're looking for a quick getaway near Camp Humphreys, I would definitely suggest you swing by and check out this area, especially if you're determined to not let bad weather ruin a good time. kim.chihon@stripes.com

ome to the largest riverside flowering plant garden in the country, Taehwagang Park in Ulsan is a definite must visit for any visitor to Korea.

Only an hour out of Busan, the stunning scenery of the ecological park alongside the Taehwa River is a perfect place to take a respite in the city as well as a destination for those in need of nature's healing hands.

One of the main highlights of the park is the Taehwagang Simnidaebat, a rich bamboo forest 4 kilometers long and 20-40 kilometers wide, which was created by the villagers in hopes of preventing the frequent flooding that occurred during the Japanese colonial period.

Bikes are also available to rent to cycle around the extensive 530,000 m<sup>2</sup> of grounds.

Spring is of course the preferred time to visit, though fall presents a beautiful picturesque setting for great photos with the reeds in bloom.

There are also an abundance of exercise facilities, snack bars and restrooms available throughout the park.

It's a perfect place for a day trip with the family, a picnic with friends or for a date outside the city that's a close destination to be home for dinner.



Near the beach, there is a 12-kilometer-long pine tree trail called Noeulgil. If you're looking for a place that's dedicated to your personal tranquility, the trail is for you. I loved the silence of the place. When the light comes through the trees, it's magical. And the wildflowers along the path are impressive.

The trail was created to placate residents who suffered through a serious oil spill accident in 2007. Following the disaster, hundreds of thousands of volunteers helped clean up, walking back and forth through Taean's forests and coastlines and forming the trail. 

# Hitting the beach

The name of Sambong, which literally means "three peaks," was named after three small mountains north of the beach. The 800-meter-long beach includes a wide coastal dune that is surround by a bamboo fence (like in my dream), which was really impressive.

Sambong Beach has its own unique peaceful atmosphere and beauty that you can't find elsewhere. The beach has some of the most interesting rocks. Behind big, bizarre stones near the entrance of the beach, there is a stone arch. The brilliant natural frame created by nature serves as a beautiful backdrop for a cool photo op. (Note: You can only reach the photo spot when the tide is low, so check out the tide table chart before making a travel plan.)



# Pitching a tent

With beaches, rocks and dense pine forests, Taean has no shortage of scenic spots to pitch a tent. Whether you can set up camp like a pro or have never slept outside, Sambong Campground in Taean is one of the great options for every kind of camper. The campground, surrounded by towering pine trees, is perfectly situated in a scenic spot that meets the coastline, making the place a fantastic home base for exploring the gorgeous nature in the area.

The night sky that is rarely found in the city is another reward for those who camp overnight. The place is open from July 5 to Sept. 26. The campground does not take reservations, so you will need to have a "Plan B" in case it's full. Parking, entrance and camping are free. But if you visit in July and August, you'll be required to pay a cleaning fee (20,000 won per night, or \$17.69). The campsite also offers electric hook-ups for 5,000 won per

# **Eunpyeong Hanok Village**





Eunpyeong Hanok Village was founded at the foot of Bukhansan Mountain in December, 2014. Rather than restoring old hanok houses like most villages do, the area was completely created from scratch, becoming the largest neighborhood of new hanok houses in the metropolitan area. The area has plenty of attractions to fill a half-day itinerary, from walking along forested trails on Bukhansan Mountain to visiting a temple and museum before enjoying a break at a café or restaurant with an amazing view.





# **Eunpyeong History Hanok Museum**








The museum is largely divided into the Eunpyeong History Hall on the second floor and the Hanok Exhibition Hall on the third floor. The hanok hall shows the changes in hanok structures over time, showing plenty of examples of modern hanok. The Eunpyeong History Hall shows the history and culture of the region where Eunpyeong Hanok Village currently stands.

Many visitors enjoy getting a closer look at the materials used to construct hanok, as well as the science behind the flooring of hanok buildings, such as the ondol (underfloor heating) and maru (wooden floor). The museum holds approximately 7,500 items related to the area's history and representative cultural heritages.

# **Jingwansa Temple**



Jingwansa Temple is one of four major temples located around Seoul. The temple offers many facilities to learn about Buddhist culture, including temple stay, temple food, and traditional culture experience halls.

The walking path, Baekchowon-gil, starting from the temple entrance is highly recommended. The path is named after Monk Baek Chowon, who hid the Korean flag and other patriotic materials during the Japanese colonial period. The path passes a beautiful valley flowing out of Bukhansan National Park.

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

orea is home to 11 of UNESCO's historically significant sites that span the globe. If you are visiting or living here on the Peninsula, here is a list of five favorite spots worth checking out during your stay.

# 1. Jongmyo Shrine, Seoul

Jongmyo Shrine was constructed by the first king and founder of the Joseon Dynasty, Lee Seong-gye (1335-1408). In its heyday, it was used as the primary place of worship for kings throughout the Joseon Dynasty and is now best-known for being the oldest and most well-preserved of the Confucian royal shrines.

# 2. Hwaseong Fortress, Suwon

The fortress was constructed between 1794 and 1796 as a display of the King's Confucian filial piety toward his father. Surrounded by a strong defensive system, which brought together the latest defensive architecture from both East and West, the massive walls extend nearly 6 km and have remained intact over the centuries.



# 3. Seokguram Grotto and Bulguksa Temple, Gyeongju

Constructed in the 8th century, the Seokguram Grotto houses a monumental statue of the Buddha looking out to sea. Nearby Bulguksa Temple is a stunning example of Silla Dynasty construction, and, along with the Seokguram Grotto, forms a religious architectural complex of exceptional historical significance.

# 4. Haeinsa Temple, Gaya

Located on Gayasan, Haeinsa Temple is home to the famed Tripitaka Koreana, the most complete collection of Buddhist texts, which was engraved on 80,000 woodblocks between 1237 and 1248. Constructed in the 15th century, the Janggyeong Panjeon complex served the sole purpose of housing the sacred woodblocks.

# 5. Namhansanseong, Gaya

Namhansanseong was originally designed to serve as an emergency capital for the Joseon Dynasty (1392–1910). Located in the mountains 25 km southeast of Seoul, it was traditionally defended by Buddhist monk-soldiers. Though it was rebuilt several times, the earliest remains date from the 7th century.

he summer heat is sizzling in Korea, so what better way to cool off than enjoy some delicious ice cream. Though summer is the ideal time for ice cream, I love eating ice cream all year round – and in all its forms.

You can pick up ice cream at supermarkets and small groceries stores, but I've been on a mission to find the best in Pyeongtaek. The other day, I've found a place that scoops up flavors you won't find anywhere else.

Located in Songtan around the Seojeong-ri Station (or Osan AB), Uokfarm is a renowned ice cream shop that serves up tasty gelato and yogurt made on-site using locally produced dairy products.

Uokfarm owner Gwak Jin-yeong has been scooping up homemade ice cream since 2019, and she uses a family connection to ensure she serves of the freshest products possible. Milk used in her creamy offering comes from her father's farm. Before opening her shop, she made an effort to ensure what she serves up high quality ice cream products, flying to Italy to brush up her ice cream making skills by attending a gelato school.

The dessert spot has a retro 80's vibe exterior covered with bricks that is a rare architecture trend in South Korea these days, and the clean and neat interior has some space where you can sit and enjoy your cool treats.

Crowds flock to Uokfarm for its rotation of eight delicious homemade soft-served ice cream that changes daily. The ice cream is not cheap, but the quality is worth the price. If you order a small size (1,100 won), you can pick two flavors. A medium size (14.000 won) allows for three flavors, while you can pick

four flavors if you order a large (19,500 won). I think the small cup with two flavors is the perfect size for kids and others who don't want to overeat.

I had my mind set on green tea ice cream, but when I arrived, I quickly learned it was not on the menu for that day. I suggest checking Uokfarm's Instagram account to see what special flavors Gwak has in store for you that day.

My disappointment quickly faded as I checked out the display of ice cream. I opted for medium size and filled it with Oreo, peanut butter, and

milk flavor ice cream. At first bite, I fell in love with the peanut butter ice cream. The other two were also very satisfying. The ice cream wasn't too sweet, which is a really good thing for me because I'm on a low-sugar diet. Gwak was also proud to point out that her ice cream has no artificial additives or coloring.

I also highly recommend the yogurt, which is also a big seller at Uokfarm. I ordered a blueberry yogurt (500ml) for 7,000 won and Greek yogurt (200g) for 5,500 won. The yogurt is all natural and doesn't contain any emulsifiers and stabilizers, which are common ingredients when yogurt is created in a factory.

The yogurt was very tasty and the generous portion of fresh blueberries from local farms is another reason you should try it. And you can take it home with you. I added the small batch of Greek yogurt to my bowl of oatmeal the next morning, which helped me feel full with a just few spoons. I loved the thick and

consistent texture. Overall, every moment of my ice cream experience at Uokfarm was unique. I'll definitely go for more. If you're looking for cool and healthy ice cream to get you through the sweltering summer days, Uokfarm will scoop it up for you.

# **INGREDIENTS**

3/4 cup chopped fermented kimchi

Cooked rice (400g)

1 green onion sliced (optional)

Sausage 60g (optional)

Spam 30g (optional)

Oil for stir-frying

1/3 tbsp sugar (optional)

1/3 tbsp soy sauce (5g)
1/3 tbsp red chili powder (5g)

1/4 small onion diced (optional)

1 tbsp parmesan cheese powder

or 2 Tbsp Mozzarella Cheese (optional)

1/2 sheet of laver sliced (optional)

3 – 4 tbsp juice from kimchi (water is also okay)

1 pinch of ground sesame seeds (optional)

1/2 tbsp sesame oil (optional)

# **DIRECTIONS**

- 1 Cut all veggies and meat into bite-sized pieces and set them aside.
- 2 Chop up kimchi into small pieces and set it aside.
- 3 Heat oil over medium-high heat, stir-fry the veggies and sausage (or ham) until slightly browned.
- 4 Over medium heat, add soy sauce, chopped Kimchi, sugar, and chili powder into a pan. (Add juice from kimchi (or water) only if the ingredient in the pan gets too dry)
- 5 Stir fry them until the kimchi slightly turns soft.
- 6 Turn off the stove. Add rice and broke the clumped rice up.
- 7 Over medium-high heat, sauté them together for about 3 to 4 minutes more. Add sesame oil, parmesan cheese powder and remove it from the heat.
- 8 Put a fried egg on top of it and sprinkle with ground sesame seeds and sliced laver. Bon appetite or 잘 먹겠습니다 (Pronounced: jal meok-ke-sse-um-nida)!









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# Speaking when eating in Korea

o you want to go out in town and try out a restaurant your friends told you about? Well, Here's some helpful tips on how to order, even if your Korean speaking skills are limited.

When you go out to eat at a Korean restaurant with meat as the main dish, you will want to order a bit differently than you would at an American restaurant. Of course, if you are ordering a steak or a hamburger it is no different. However, if you are ordering meat to be grilled at your table you will normally order by the serving:

\* Give me three servings of ribs .: 갈비 삼인분 주세요 / gal-bi sam-in-bun ju-se-yo. The "sam-in-bun" part of the request is asking for 3 servings/portions.

# Beef: 소고기 / So-go-gi

- \* Beef Ribs: 소갈비 / so-gal-bi.
- \* Rib roast cut into small grillable portions but without the bone: 소갈비살/ so-gal-bi-sal.
- \* Sirloin cut for grilling Korean style: 등심 / Doong-shim.

# Pork: 돼지 고기 / Dwe-ji-go-gi

- \* Pork ribs: 돼지갈비 / Dwe-ji-gal-bi.
- \* Side pork (uncured): 삼겹살 / sam-gyop-sal.
- Though you can eat each of these directly from your grill, when you order them in a restaurant there is normally a way to truly make the experience more enjoyable. With each order of these meats will come a variety of vegetables and condiments. Normally you will receive lettuce leaves, garlic, red pepper paste, and, depending on the restaurant sesame leaves, Julian sliced onions, mushrooms, etc. (With the sam-gyop-sal, you will receive a small bowl of Sesame oil with some seasoning.) When the meat is cooked to your satisfaction, take it from the grill and place it on a lettuce leaf. Then add a dollop of rice and a little of each of the extras, pepper paste, garlic, onions, mushrooms, etc. Wrap it all into one large ball and stuff it into your mouth. It sounds rude but it is really the best and least offensive way to eat this.

# Chicken: 닭고기 / Dalk-go-gi

- \* Chicken Ribs: 닭갈비 / Dalk-Gal-bi.
- Not really what it sounds like. This is actually normally chicken breast cut into pieces and seasoned (spicy) then mixed with vegetables and cooked at your table in a grill or wok. (Boneless: 뼈없는 / Byeo-eob-nun)
- \* Fried chicken: 닭 튀김 / Dalk-dwi-gim. (It is just as common to hear "Chicken Fry."
- \* Fried chicken with spicy sauce or flavoring: 양념 닭 /양념 치긴 / Yang-nyom-dalk / yang-
- Rice is a staple of Korean life and there are a number of ways to get it in a restaurant:

# Rice: 밥 / Bab

- \* Fried Rice : 볶음밥 / Bok-kum-bab
- If you want a certain kind of meat in the fried rices just add in the appropriate meat Pork Fried Rice: 돼지 고기볶음밥 / Dwe-ji-go-gi-bok-kum-bab
- \* Chicken Fried Rice: 닭고기볶음밥 / Dalk-go-gi-bok-kum-bab
- \* Shrimp fried rice: 새우 볶음밥 / Se-u-bok-kum-bab
- \* Rice mixed with vegetables and seasoning: 비빔밥 / Bi-bim-bab. One variation of this dish is to have the bibimbab served in a hot stone bowl 돌솥비빔 밥 / Dol-sot-bi-bim-bab.

# Noodles: 면 / Myeon

- \* Ramen: 라면 / ra-myeon
- \* Cold noodles: 냉면 / Naeng-myeon There are two common varieties of cold noodles
- 1. One is with the noodles served in a broth and is called water naeng myeon: 물냉면 / mul-naeng-myeon
- 2. Second is mixed with spicy red pepper sauce, hot mustard, and vegetables which is 비빔냉면 / Bi-bim-naeng-myeon.
- One favorite Korean noodle dish of many westerners is Chap-chae and though it doesn't use the "Myeon" is a noodle dish normally using vermicelli noodles (당면 / dangmyeon) mixed with vegetables stir fried in a mixture of sesame oil and other ingredients.
- During the next couple of weeks try ordering some of these dishes you won't be sorry.

Eat well: 많이 잡수세요 / Ma-ni jab-su-se-yo.

### **IMPLANTS: BEFORE SURGERY**

First, it is very important to check the overall health status. If the patient has osteoporosis, diabetes, hypertension, or is taking medication related to these diseases, consultation with an attending physician is required.

Secondly, it is necessary to check the health of the oral cavity. Through X-ray and CT we check the condition of bones and gums. Before installing implants, it is very important to have healthy gums. If gum treatment is necessary, it must be done before implants.

# **IMPLANTS: TIMELY**

Our body is such that if you do not use any organs (for example, muscles), they begin to shrink and weaken. Also, the bone under the gum, holding the tooth, if not used, it decreases. In this case, bone tissue should be enlarged during implant installation. This increases the complexity of the surgery, the healing period, the pain, and also the cost. Therefore, after tooth extraction, if there are plans, implants should be put in place timely. Also, if a long time passes after tooth extraction, the adjacent teeth begin to tilt. In this case, partial or complete tooth correction may be required in the future.

# **IMPLANTS: ADVANTAGES**

Previously, after tooth extraction, adjacent teeth were usually ground down and crowned over the bridge made of dental crowns. But since the lifespan of a tooth depends to some extent on the amount of remaining dentin (hard tissue of tooth), it is natural that teeth that have been ground down can have a shorter life.

Installation of implants is a procedure when only the artificial root (implant) is inserted into the place of the missing tooth and an artificial dental crown is installed on top of it. This way, adjacent teeth are not ground down and remain in their natural state.

**Timely** installation is very important for implants!

# **IMPLANTS: TREATMENT PERIOD**

The treatment period with implants is usually about 3 months for the lower jaw and 4 months for the upper jaw. During this time, the hospital carries out an examination, installation of implant, check on the healing process, and installation of a dental crown.

But if guided bone regeneration (GBR) and/or sinus lift were additionally carried out during implantation, the full treatment period may be from 3 to 9 months. Therefore, in order to avoid an increase in the treatment period, it is very important to have the implant installed timely without additional procedures.

The time to wait for the implant to heal to the bone is very important. There is no need to hurry.

# **IMPLANTS: LIFESPAN**

As there is no definite lifespan for native teeth, so also for implants. It all depends on caring for them. Usually, it is said that the lifespan of implants is about 8-15 years. But if you take care of them correctly, their term will be semi-perma-

The most important and main reason for reducing the lifespan of the implant is the peri-implantitis (destructive inflammatory process affecting the soft and hard tissues surrounding dental implants). But

it can be avoided with proper teeth cleaning

and periodic examination and treatment.

# **IMPLANTS: POST-TREATMENT CARE**

There are two points after implant placement that should be monitored well. This is the care of the gums and dental crown. You need to monitor oral hygiene and brush your teeth properly.

Sometimes it happens that the dental crown falls out of the implant or the screw inside the implant is unscrewed. In such cases, consultation with the attending dentist and timely treatment are imperative. Therefore, when choosing a dental hospital, it is very important to look at how the post-treatment care is done there.

# **IMPLANTS: COST**

The cost in each hospital is different and depends on the type of implant on the method of implant installation, additional procedures. In dental hospitals in Korea, you can usually find out the cost of an implant from dental consultants, who, like doctors, work in hospitals all the time. For those with insurance, the hospital helps to make all necessary documents in order to replace the cost of treatment with the insurance company.

Guided bone regeneration (GBR) is

necessary in cases where the native bone tissue is insufficient for the implant to stand firmly.

If the condition is normal, GBR is carried out very quickly simultaneously

> with the installation of implants. But if the bone is very small, GBR is carried out in advance of implants.

> The materials used for GBR are human bone. cow bone, artificial bone. These types of bones are pre-sterilized and are introduced as powder. Therefore, the response

of the transplant rejection can be avoided.

Sometimes in extreme cases or when the patient does not want to have another bone material, a native bone grafted from another place is used.

# **SINUS LIFT**

Inside the maxillary bone there is a hollow air space called the maxillary sinus. To carry out GBR in a place next to this cavity, sometimes a sinus lift - lifting the lower sinus membrane - is required to create space for GBR.

### IMPLANTS: INSTALLATION ON THE SAME **DAY DURING TOOTH EXTRACTION**

If after tooth extraction there is a good environment for the implant, it is possible to place the implant immediately. For this, there should be no inflammation or other types of infection. Of course, it is ideal to wait a while after tooth extraction. But if the patient does not have free time, it is possible to carry out the extraction of the tooth and the installation of the implant at the same time, but provided that the condition of that place is healthy.


### The prevalent COVID-19 prioritizes quarantine in hospitals as well. How do you ■ implement quarantine control?

eyes in the summer.

In the summer, the hot weather gets people to stay with air conditioners or fans on. And the dry air indoors causes eyes to be more likely to be dry. When you look at a computer monitor for a long time or read books in a dry room, you blink your eyes less and the tear film on the surface of your eyes becomes dry, which causes dry eye syndrome...

In order to prevent dry eye syndrome, it is necessary to keep your eyes from directly contacting the wind from an air conditioner or a fan. Frequent ventilation indoors or using artificial tears is also helpful. If artificial tears or eye drops do not work, or the symptoms are getting worse or painful, you should visit a dry eye clinic to figure out the cause and take appropriate treatment.

# Corneal abrasion: A superficial scratch on the eye

A corneal abrasion occurs when your cornea is scratched by contact with external factors such as a leaf or sand. In the summer, it is often caused by strong breezes or sand at the beach. Once it occurs, it is easy to recur, so you had better be very careful not to get your eyes scratched.

In particular, many children tend to rub their eyes unintentionally. While they play with sand outdoors, you should warn them not to touch any part of their eyes with their hands. It is recommended to wear protective glasses or sunglasses when the breeze is too strong at

the beach. Wearing sunglasses is also helpful to protect hands as frequently as possible and avoid touching your eyes as they can block UV rays.

When artificial tears or eye drops do not help to relieve the uncomfortable gritty feeling or if you feel pain in your eyes, you can have a corneal abrasion. You need to find an eye doctor to get an accurate diagnosis and you need to apply eye ointment consistently.

# Conjunctivitis: Frequent eye problems in summer

An conjunctivitis is one of the most common eve problems caused by a virus in the summer. Wet and hot weather provides a good condition for viruses to proliferate. In the places including beaches, swimming pools, and water parks, where people are actively crowded in the summer, the virus spreads easily and eye diseases are more likely to occur.

One of the most common conjunctivitis in the summer is 'epidemic keratoconjunctivitis', which is caused by an adenovirus. Once infected, you will have tears, eye mucus, redness, itching, or pain in your eyes. After an incubation period of about one week, it develops for about three to four weeks with the symptoms in one eye at first. After a few days later, the other eye can be infected. Inflammation of the cornea can make symptoms worse and can lead to complications including corneal opacity. Children may also show systemic symptoms with fever and diarrhea.


There is no specific treatment for epidemic keratoconjunctivitis, so it is best to prevent them in advance. As it is highly contagious, it is important to wash your your eyes or the peripheral area with your hands. When someone in your family has an epidemic keratoconjunctivitis, you have to separately use towels, toiletries, and blankets.
