

# 'Meat up' your meal at S. African barbecue joint

ne benefit of serving in the military is getting to travel the world and sample new cuisines. Thanks to this benefit, Braai Republic near Camp Humphreys, South Korea, just became one of my favorite restaurants.

Braai — rhymes with "dry" — is a South African barbecuing method that uses aromatic wood for roasting meat.

Braai Republic offers exceptional service and a welcoming atmosphere, along with some incredible food. An open kitchen allows you to

watch the friendly and attentive staff as they prepare and serve tasty dishes that include boerewors - a type of sausage that originated in South Africa - lamb chops and shrimp.

I found it difficult to choose an entrée but eventually settled on the Half Chicken and

Lamb Chops for 36,000 won, or about \$27. It includes mashed sweet potatoes and a salad, and I ordered lemonade to wash it all down. This was my first time eating South Afri-

can food and it did not disappoint. The chicken was highly flavorful and a bit spicy thanks to its peri-peri marinade, and the lamb was tender and juicy with a smoky taste. The sweet potatoes were buttery and savory.

Other eye-catching menu items include the Meat Platter — two lamb chops, a boerewors, pork sausage, potato fries, corn

and basil salad and slaw - for 37,000 won; and 500 grams of Pork Spare Ribs with Potato Fries for 23,000 won.

he city of Seoul is a vibrant and thriving place with an endless number of things to do, from ascending to more than 1,600 feet at the Lotte Tower to riding rollercoasters at Everland Resort.

But history buffs will find the Gyeongbokgung Palace is a perfect place to spend an afternoon.

This historical site in the heart of Seoul was first erected in 1395 and is one of the first and largest of the royal palaces built during the Joseon Dynasty.

It served as the royal palace until 1592 when it burned down during the first Japanese invasion of the Imjin War. It was rebuilt in 1865 into the beautiful palace we see today.

There is more to this place than its history.

Through Han-jeong-sik, you are not only going to experience the true taste of Korea, but also discover many cultural aspects of Korean food. While a bowl of rice is served for each person, soup and other dishes are shared with others. Sharing dishes is a big part of Korean food culture.

There are many restaurants specializing in han-jeong-sik and these are a great place for Koreans to bring their important guests. Koreans culturally believe the quantity of side dishes can determine a well-prepared and dedicated meal table. Setting the table full of various plates is a way to show affection or respect for their guest. Also, as the harmony of colors on the table is significant in Korean culture, the meal course table is truly a feast for the mouth and the eyes.



# San-deul-hae (산들해)

San-deul-hae, only a 10-minute walk from Jamsil Station, is a terrific han-jeong-sik restaurant for friends to enjoy some tasty Korean dishes together in Seoul!

The staff at San-deul-chae literally brings a tabletop with 24 different traditional Korean dishes and slides it in front of you. Try them all, and if you want more, don't hesitate to call the staff. They will keep bringing your favorites because unlimited refills are available for all the dishes. This full-course meal is about \$16 and there's no time limit!

This restaurant is very popular among locals so expect to wait about 20 to 30 minutes for a table. According to the staff, between 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. is the best hour to avoid the long line. Reservations are available for groups of 5 to 8 people a week in advance.

# **OEAM FOLK VILLAGE: Where time stands still**

espite the rapid industrialization and gentrification of South Korea over the last half-century, there are still several great traditional villages that retain their original features across the nation like Bukchon Hanok Village in Seoul and Yangdong Village in Gyeongju.

Recently, I went to Oeam folk village in Asan, South Chungcheong Province, on the recommendation of one of my coworkers. Frankly, I didn't expect much from place since the folk village is not as famous as Bukchon and Yangdong. However, located in the peaceful and beautiful rural countryside, Oeam was a pleasant surprise.

### Time travel to Joseon period

Only 30 min-drive from Camp Humphreys, Oeam Folk Village is not your ordinary tourist attraction packed with souvenir shops and the sound of merchants, rather it's a

historic village where many people still live. What makes this village distinctive is a 6.3km-long stone

wall set along its narrow alleys. I had a terrific time walking the alleys at a leisurely pace as if I were a resident. And taking in sound of a group of singing sparrows sitting on the thatched roofs was another charm of my walking experience.

This village is full of photo ops, especially against the backdrop of it beautiful thatched and tiled roof homes. When summer hits, the pond at the entrance of the village is overflowing with lotus flowers in full bloom, attracting photographers of all abilities.

If you would like to look deeper into the architecture and the more than 500-year legacy of the village, call the village tourist info center and make a reservation for an Englishspeaking guide at least two weeks in advance. You could



The village offers a lot of hands-on experience programs that will entertain you and your kids, including lantern making, rice cake making, chestnut roasting, rice cultivating, and more. I really enjoyed the village in the daytime, but cars and satellite dishes around the houses were the fly in the ointment. Other than that, the historic folk village was

# Trip to AFN Humphreys studio

t some point in your life, you have probably heard of the American Forces Network. AFN does everything including the news, entertainment, sports, you name it. You can listen in the car, watch at home on the TV, or use the app on your phone. AFN is easily accessible, anytime, anywhere. But have you ever wondered what goes on behind the scenes, in the studio of this popular news network?

Recently, the Humphreys Area Homeschool Co-op (HAHC) and I had the incredible opportunity to tour the AFN headquarters building at Camp Humphreys in South Korea. During our trip, we were able to see and take pictures in their recording studio and on their television set. Our group even got to talk to AFN employees. We learned that AFN is the only American radio station in Korea.



# **DIABETIC'S DIET** What and how to eat healthy

m Dr. K, an internal medicine specialist at Dr.K-Medicare Clinic. Today, we will discuss the three most essential things in a diabetic's diet: Which one works well? What else should I eat? What should I eat less?

The critical thing in diabetes is reducing sugar intake by reducing carbohydrates. So other than the first meal, we can cut down on bread, rice cakes and noodles because all are made of flour and carbohydrates. The important thing is knowing the Clymic index.

The sugar index is how quickly food is absorbed by your body, and that's what the table shows for each food. So, a GI glycemic index below 55 is good food, and 70 and above is a high index. Since the GI is high, the sugar is absorbed too quickly and raised as fast as possible. Almost all bread, rice cakes, and noodles have a sugar level of 80 to 90 or higher. If the GI is this high, it absorbs incredibly quickly, raising your blood sugar level. That's how insulin gets released.

When blood sugar spikes, it's a waste of insulin. That's how the original resistance worsens, so you end up riding this vicious circle. You can stop this vicious cycle by reducing the number of times you eat bread rice cakes and noodles.

Second, stop eating white rice and switch to brown rice and mixed-grain rice. White rice is absorbed in your body quickly, raising your sugar level above 90. Mixed grain rice

makes you feel full and doesn't absorb. So, of course, it's easy to digest, and it's easy to absorb. Grains with shells are delicious.

What's the third? You have to watch out for sugary foods. Don't just drink anything. I wouldn't say I like sports drinks. They are lumps of sugar. It's absorbed as soon as it goes in. How about some snacks? Sweets, fried snacks, and everything like that, even fried carbohydrates. Hyperlipidemia is accompanied by diabetes. It can also cause high blood pressure

Also, if you overeat fruit, your sugar level goes up. And in the case of watermelon, early Gi is very high for 71 days. Sweet fruit like watermelon and grapes have empty blood sugar the next day. Fruit has lot of

sugar, so it's better to eat only fistful. So, remember, diabetes isn't a disease where you should eat more, it's one where you should eat less You don't have to look for anything else.

# **1 in 3 adults suffers from** seasonal allergy symptoms

#### What is an allergy?

Allergy or allergy reaction refers to a phenomenon in which a substance or component in the environment reacts with the human body to cause a harmful hypersensitivity reaction to people, and substances that cause such an allergy are called allergens.

Well-known allergens include dust mites, pets, pollen, insects, ticks, molds, foods, and medications. In addition, there are hundreds of other substances in everyday life. People who have generally not had an allergy can suddenly experience allergy symptoms such as a runny nose and itchy skin.

These days, when flowers bloom quickly due to climate change and a large amount of pollen is blown in a short time, rhinitis symptoms or skin allergy symptoms may appear even for people who have never experienced allergies before.

Invasion of pollen through the respiratory tract can have a more substantial effect on microscopic, invisible allergens. If symptoms begin to appear, use an air purifier and sufficient humidification at home, wear a mask when going out, and take care of your body as usual. I recommend not doing it.


#### Who gets allergies?

Allergy symptoms are very prevalent, with one in three people experiencing them. In Korea, the number of allergy rhinitis patients recently exceeded 6 million, and Japanese cedar allergy is said to give significant and small symptoms to 40% of the population. About 26% of American adults suffer from seasonal allergies.

Why do some people show allergic hypersensitivity to pollen or house dust mites while others do not offer any reaction? The reason is genetic factors that cause hypersensitivity in the human immune system to external allergens are different for each individual. If one parent has an allergic disease, one of three children is likely to have

an allergy. In addition to genetic factors, hormonal influences, viral infections, and smoking can also cause allergies.

### What are the symptoms?

An allergy is an individual immune response, so different symptoms appear even when people are exposed to the same allergen. Common symptoms include itchy, watery eyes, itchy nose, sneezing, runny nose, rashes, hives (a rash with raised red patches), stomach cramps, vomiting, diarrhea, bloating, swelling and coughing. In severe cases the throat will close due to dyspnea and palpitations.

### How is an allergy diagnosed?

In the case of seasonal allergies that worsens during the change of season, pollen is most often an allergen. Observe whether symptoms are alleviated indoors or when wearing a mask, or if symptoms change when exposed to a specific environment or allergy cause, and similar signs or symptoms in the family. It is also classified as a self-diagnosis method that determines whether or not there is a dis-

> However, in most cases, the allergen is unknown, and diagnosis is more difficult in children with weak self-expression. In the hospital, allergies are diagnosed by skin tests, blood tests, and allergy tests. The skin test is to see if an allergic reaction occurs to various major causes of allergies.

A blood test is a method to determine whether immunoglobulin E, which fights against a specific allergy cause, is present in a person's blood. It is often used as an optional item during health checkups.

Lastly, an allergy test is a provocative test method to see whether an allergic reaction occurs by directly acting on a suspected cause of an allergy in a person's nose, eyes, or bronchial tube or by eating a

suspected food. It is a method widely used in hospitals where dermatologists or otolaryngologists reside.

### Literally no side effects

Every anti-snoring oral appliance works by advancing the lower jaw forward so the tongue connected to the lower jaw is also pushed along, preventing it from falling back to block the airway while sleeping.

PASA's most significant advantage over other treatment methods is that it is virtually side effectsfree. One of PASA's fundamental design principles



is allowing free movement of the lower jaw while wearing the appliance. This feature makes it extra comfortable and prevents the build-up of strain in joints that lead to long-term side effects. PASA is a simple, compact size in one piece without addi-

tional connecting components in the other devices, making it more hygienic and less likely to break

Dr. Park also noted that "PASA would be an excellent treatment option who suffer from chronic oxygen deficiency due to sleep apnea, and those with a dry mouth or swollen tonsils from long-term mouth breathing."

### Great results

Dr. Park, the inventor of the anti-snoring appliance PASA, was awarded by KHIDI (Korea Health Industry Development Institute) for the appliance's excellence in 2022. He won the gold prize in 2014 and the NET (New Excellence Technology) certification from the Ministry of Health and Welfare of Korea in 2015. Dr. Park's Ilmi Dental Clinic was well known for its different treatments of snoring and obstructive sleep apnea using PASA and the treatment of TMJ disorders and traumatic occlusion.

# Implant, thorough check! Safely with oral bacteria test

### Case #1

Mr. Kim, an office worker in his 40s, had four teeth placed through implants at a newdental clinic near his house. After X-rays and a brief preliminary treatment the implants were completed. Six months after implantation, the gums were swollen and bleeding when chewing meat. The implanted teeth were also loose. Mr. Kim went to the dentist, who said it was because his gums were weak.

### **Case** #2

Mr. Oh, an office worker in his 40s, found a place with rich clinical experience to get an implant. He meticulously found a dentist with extensive implant experience in Gangnam and made a plan for implant placement after going through an oral bac-

teria test, X-rays, and CT. In particular, through an oral bacteria test, it was said that many bacteria were detected in the gums where the implant was to be placed.

Recently, Korea's implant surgery has been recognized in advanced countries thanks to its rich clinical experience and the efforts of medical staff.

However, as implants become more common, concerns about implant side effects tend to increase. Implant side effects are cases where the implant is loose or falls out in severe cases.

According to UC Gangnam Dental Clinic (Yoossi Gangnam Dental Clinic), which expanded and relocated to Eonju Station in Nonhyeon-dong, Seoul, implants go through meticulous examinations to increase the success rate from the time they are first placed.

As mentioned above, implant placement is the same principle as planting a tree.

Even if a severe storm comes, the gums must be strong, as if the root is firmly established in the soil, and the implant must be placed in such an environment.

To this end, UC Gangnam Dental Clinic can identify the pre-periodontal disease and gum disease through an oral bacteria test.

It detects microscopic bacterial activity in the oral cavity that is not visible on the surface, prevents gum disease and periodontal disease that may occur due to this, and enables safe implant placement.

Oral bacteriological examination, an accurate dental diagnosis technique, is already standard in the United States and Europe, which are advanced countries in oral health. Still, only a few dentists in Korea are introducing examination equipment and systems.

The benefit of oral bacteriological examination is that periodontal disease and expected diseases around implants to be placed can be identified in advance. This can increase the success rate by discovering the cause of the failure of the implant to be placed at an early stage.

In addition, even without apparent symptoms such as tooth decay, overall oral health can be improved through the activity and distribution of bacteria in the mouth

In addition, it has been pointed out that the high-speed rotary drill used for implant placement can damage tissues in the oral cavity due to severe frictional heat and vibration.

It has been pointed out that the gum bone can be permanently damaged even if exposed to a temperature of 40 degrees for only 10 seconds.



### Waterdrop laser implant

Waterdrop laser implant has the advantages of infection prevention through sterilization, minimization of anesthesia, effective and accurate treatment, and fast recovery after treatment. If considering an implant, it is also effective

to check whether a water drop laser is used. In addition, teeth are located at the bottom of

the face and affect the facial contours and jaw bones

It is recommended to use 3D CT for precise diagnosis when placing implants. According to UC Gangnam Dental Clinic, 3D CT allows accurate surgical planning to be established through 3D information.

This has the advantage of shortening the surgical time, reducing the risk during implant placement, and being safe as the radiation exposure is 1/50 lower than that of general CT.

It is a way to maintain a healthy tooth life with new teeth."
