At Incirlik AB, your unit's Commander's Support Staff (CSS) must sign you up for the Newcomer's Briefing with the Military & Family Readiness Center (M&FRC), located in Bldg. 833. The M&FRC can advise on items required for the briefing, including travel documents and receipts. During the Newcomer's Briefing, you will in-process with Finance and TRICARE Overseas and get familiarized with base agencies. Bring several copies of your orders as they will be needed to process your paperwork. The briefing will end with personnel getting equipped with gear. The bus will then drop off service members at their current accommodations (Hodja Inn, housing or dorms).

Fire Safety and Extinguisher Hands-On Training needs to be done within 30 days of arrival per Incirlik AB Instruction 32-2001. The training is located at Bldg. 373, every Thursday at 9 a.m. For more information and sign up, call 676-3021.

#### **CIVILIAN DOD EMPLOYEES**

Civilian employees and visitors must check e-visa requirements at evisa.gov.tr/en. After 90 days, civilian DoD employees must apply for residency in Türkiye for the duration of their contract. The process can be done at Pass and ID in Bldg. 833.

# TURKEY ASSIGNMENT INCENTIVE PAY (TAIP)

The Turkey Assignment Incentive Pay (TAIP) program looks to bolster continuity and experience at the 39th Air Base Wing (ABW) within this unaccompanied tour by offering incentive pay to military members who agree to serve on station for a total of 24 months. As of Dec. 29, 2022, TAIP has increased to \$1,000 per month.

Members are eligible to enroll in the program prior to arrival, or within the first 60 days of arrival (if not already enrolled) and begin receipt of pay effective on the date of enrollment or date arrived on station, whichever is later. Currently assigned members interested in the program may contact their unit CSS or the MPF for additional information on enrollment.

# SERVICES IN TÜRKIYE



# BANKING

#### **DEBIT & CREDIT CARDS**

- Put a travel advisory on your cards, so your transactions are not automatically declined. Your bank can also explain their fraud prevention procedures, such as mobile app notifications.
- It's always best to carry Turkish lira and U.S. dollars when off installation. Some places take cards off-base, but not always.
- There is often fluctuation with the exchange rate with several lira to the dollar, so be aware of the difference in the currency's worth.

#### **ATMS**

- To save on ATM fees, bring a checkbook to withdraw money at the CPTS cash cage (first floor) in Bldg. 833 at Incirlik.
- ATMs dispense Turkish lira, U.S. dollars or euro, but can occasionally run out of cash or malfunction, so having a checkbook is advised to withdraw cash.

# **CELL PHONES**

Research your options for cell phone service before leaving your prior station. Some cell phone plan providers require you to set up overseas compatible plans before leaving the U.S. Getting service for your cell phone is vital and allows you to stay connected. The pre-paid option and use of Wi-Fi, which is accessible at most public locations on base, is the preferred method of staying connected. If you want to avoid roaming charges, be sure to switch your phone to airplane mode.

# BASEFIX IN THE EXCHANGE MOBILE CENTER

BaseFIX can assist with internet connection to the local Turk Telekom lines in both dorms and housing. They are in the BX next to the electronics and typically have a turnaround between 24 hours to a week for service activation, depending on the demand. You can re-load minutes and pay bills at the counter, or you can take advantage of online bill pay with a credit card.

You can set up pre-paid phone plans with TurkCell, purchase pay-as-you-go hot spots and sign up for internet packages at various speeds. Non-Turkish citizens are limited with the length of cell phone contracts, so please refer to BaseFIX representatives for details on the documents needed in your case.

All services through BaseFIX or TurkCell require NATO orders to setup.

### **GOOGLE VOICE**

Google Voice will allow you to port your U.S. number for free so you can keep it. You can then use a local SIM card to have a local number and U.S. number simultaneously (with a dual-SIM phone). Google Voice allows free calls to the U.S. using Wi-Fi. If you don't want to be limited to Wi-Fi and haven't gotten a local SIM yet, Google Fi is a paid phone plan that uses T-Mobile's cell towers. Starting either of these processes is much easier while still in the U.S.

Scooters, motorbikes, bicycles, e-bikes and cargo bikes are common methods of transportation on base.

#### **THINGS TO KNOW**

- Personally Owned Vehicle (POV) shipments and use are not currently authorized for members stationed at Incirlik.
- If renting a car, it must be registered with the base.
- The 39 LRS provides transportation between Incirlik and the Adana Airport for official travel.
- A 24-hour bus is available every 30 minutes, in each direction around Incirlik. Call the shuttle bus for pick up at 676-6756.
- It is also highly encouraged for members to ship or purchase a bicycle for personal transportation.

#### **LICENSE & REGISTRATION**

Only a valid stateside driver's license is needed to drive a vehicle or motorcycle. No other local or international licenses are required to drive on base. If your license expires while in Türkiye, go to the Legal Office to file for an extension. Call the Passport and ID Office ahead of time to ensure you're bringing all necessary documents. It is recommended to have car insurance that covers rentals overseas before you drive a rented vehicle.

#### MOTORCYCLES, SCOOTERS AND E-BIKES

Motorbikes, e-bikes and bicycles can be purchased new or used at the Auto Hobby Shop in Bldg. 1060 (DSN 676-6655), from vendors next to the BX or on a Facebook group called Incirlik Scooter Mart 2.0. Check in with the Safety Office or your command's motorcycle safety representative after arrival to attend a class on motorbike safety. A helmet and closed-toed shoes are required.

#### **FUELING YOUR TRANSPORTATION**

There is a shoppette with a two-pump gas station, open Monday–Friday, 11 a.m.–5 p.m. and Saturday 7 a.m.–1 p.m. Some dorms offer parking areas for electric scooters with charging capabilities.

# LODGING UPON ARRIVAL

- Dorms may be ready for move-in upon arrival for service members E-1 to E-4. Please keep in mind that some items, such as linens, are not always provided.
- The Hodja Inn is ready to serve when members step off the plane and while waiting for availability on a house or a dorm.

It is highly recommended to obtain renter's insurance whether living in the dorms or homes on base to cover potential damages or loss to personal property.

# **ON-BASE HOUSING**

All personnel live on base. Accommodations on base are based on availability, rank, career field and TAIP incentives. Base houses contain basic furnishings that cannot be thrown away or sold. All furniture supplied will need to be in the house at move out and is marked with a barcode.

#### Pets

All personnel are allowed to have one 25-gallon aquarium, for fish only.

Two pets (dogs or cats) are permitted for personnel living in single-occupancy housing, and for dual military members stationed together at Incirlik. 39 CES Housing Management must be notified of the quantity and type (dog and/or cat) before the pets arrive; email 39ces.cechh@ us.af.mil. Pets must also be registered with the Incirlik Veterinary Treatment Center (VTF), Bldg. 912, within 10 days of arrival.

# HOUSING NEIGHBORHOODS

There are four housing neighborhoods.

- Phantom Housing: 3–4 bedrooms, E-5 (with roommate) or 2 bedrooms for E-6 (single)
- Herky Studio Apartments: E-6 (single)
- Falcon Housing: Civilians, E-7 to E-9 (single)
  Eagle Housing: 4 bedrooms, O-1 to O-3 (with roommate) or O-4 to O-6 (single)

If you have a line number for staff sergeant (E-5) and sew-on with at least four months left at Incirlik, you can request housing, which would include a roommate. If you have a line number for technical sergeant (E-6) and have at least six months left at Incirlik, you can request single-occupancy housing in Phantom or Herky studio apartments as available. If you have a line number for master sergeant (E-7), you can request to move into single-occupancy Phantom Housing if you have at least six months left at Incirlik. Company grade officers live in Eagle Housing with a roommate. For those who will promote to field grade, a request can be made to move into single-occupancy housing if they have at least six months left at Incirlik.

# DORMS

Incirlik Dorm Management Office DSN 676-3080

As part of the Newcomer's Briefing, the Dorm Manager will assist you in filling out paperwork and getting familiarized with your new home. Dorm residents will be assigned a room immediately upon arrival. Dorms consist of basic and bare furnishings. Dorms vary in floor plan and can include a shared kitchen or bathroom, with laundry rooms on each floor or a single laundry room on the first floor.

- Airman utilizing TAIP can move into Bldg. 960.
- Grills are available outside the dorms.
- Electric scooter charging stations are available, but be sure to secure your property as you are liable for loss or theft.

#### **Other Streaming Services**

Streaming services like Amazon Prime, Netflix and Hulu are available in Türkiye. Show variety and availability may be limited due to geographical location, so a virtual private network (VPN) service, such as ExpressVPN or Google One VPN, is recommended to access U.S. programming.

Once you have your orders, email 39LRS.personal.property@us.af.mil for a personal property worksheet. Fill it out and email it back to them. The Traffic Management Office (TMO) will assist you with passenger travel and delivery of your household goods (HHG). During the Newcomer's Briefing, you will sign a Power of Attorney for your goods with the Legal office, who will notarize it. This is for Turkish Customs, so they can clear your goods once it arrives.

#### **HHG Delivery**

Once your HHGs arrive, a Beyanname will be created by the Customs Liaison Office, which includes high-value items that you have brought with you. Any item on this list you must keep for the duration of your time in Türkiye, even if it is damaged. Contact the Legal Office if you wish to sell an item on your Beyanname or if the item was stolen. If you do not have the listed items when you out-process, you will need to pay a fine of up to five times the value of the item due to Turkish black-market laws.

- Secure a delivery date for your HHGs and remember that dates book fast during the peak summer PCS season.
- Since there is no temporary furniture program, consult with the TMO to figure out temporary options.
- Once your HHGs are delivered, make sure every box that was shipped is accounted for.
- Mark each item off your inventory list as everything is being unloaded.

#### **Inspect Your Home**

To avoid being held liable for damages done to your home and property that the movers may have caused, it's best to note any damages on your household goods paperwork. Note everything that isn't right such as missing boxes or damaged goods. Be sure to make copies of all the paperwork and take pictures of any damages.

#### Filing a Claim

You have 75 days to submit a notice of loss or damage report in the Defense Personal Property System from the scheduled delivery date. From then, you will have nine months to submit your claim in order to be eligible for a full replacement value.

- Be sure to have photos and receipts for purchases of your damaged goods.
- Keep any paperwork until all claims are processed.


#### 220 Volt Power

You may need power converters and transformers to use your U.S. electronics in your home. Electronics that are dual voltage will label their voltage range like this: 100–240V. If the range includes 220 volts, you only need a plug converter. Other items that are labeled 120V will require a transformer, which is a small plug-in box that converts the voltage to safely use your single-voltage equipment.

Some items, like hair clippers and electronics with certain motors, may be damaged or unusable even when using a transformer. This is due to the difference in electrical frequency, measured in hertz (50 Hz in Türkiye as opposed to 60 Hz in the U.S.), so it is sometimes best to buy a 220V replacement for the duration of your time in the country.

While there may be some cultural and treatment differences in Türkiye, rest assured that the medical standard of care you receive is the highest quality. Although there are a few differences in medical practices, the 39 MDG staff collaborate with the host nation medical partners, ensuring a positive outcome and experience for all patients. Local hospitals do accept TRICARE.

# **CIVILIAN MEDICAL CARE**

Preferred Network Facilities for Civilians are not supported. Adana hospitals do not accept civilian insurance. Some insurance providers will reimburse individuals for out-of-pocket costs, but this should be discussed with the insurance provider before seeking care.

#### **AREA DEFENSE COUNSEL**

The ADC consists of an attorney and a paralegal to advise and advocate for individual Airmen through military justice and administrative processes. The staff works with 100 percent attorney-client confidentiality, which also does not fall under the local chain of command.

They will assist with response and representation on corrective and disciplinary actions such as an Article 15, LOC, LOR, LOA, discharges, rights advisement, administrative demotions, referral EPRs/OPRs and more, from help with rebuttals to representation during court martials.

# **GUIDANCE** & SAFETY TIPS





# FERAL ANIMAL PRECAUTIONS

There are many critters on the installation, including feral dogs and cats. Per the 39 ABW commander, feeding, fostering and/or adopting of stray animals on the installation is strictly prohibited and punishable under the UCMJ for active duty and civilians alike.

It is essential that you do not interact with these animals because Türkiye is a high-risk area for rabies, which is fatal if left untreated. Transmission can come from dogs, cats, bats, raccoons, skunks and foxes. They shed the virus for three to seven days prior to showing any symptoms. Even if an animal appears healthy, it may not be the case and is never worth the risk. There is NO guarantee that rabies treatment will be available at the Military Treatment Facility (MTF) or hospitals off base.

# Steps to take if you are bitten, scratched or make contact with the animal's saliva on open skin:

- Immediately wash the wound or contaminated area thoroughly with soap and water.
- Immediately seek medical care at the Clinic. Call 676-6666.
- Call the Civil Engineer Squadron (CES) at 676-7008 to report the stray animal that bit you.
- Call the Veterinary Clinic at 676-3119 for animal welfare concerns or if the animal that bit you is still present in the immediate area.

# **OPERATIONAL SECURITY (OPSEC)**

- Be familiar with your Critical Information List in your unit.
- No outside photography around the base.
- Report suspicious activity to BDOC at 676-3200 or OSI at 676-6488.
- This is not a U.S. installation, so access controls are different. Secure your belongings in your home, vehicle and workplace. If you hire a housekeeper or have guests in your residence, this is especially important to keep in mind.
- Call the OPSEC Office for questions at 676-6693.

# ANTI-TERRORISM

- Be vigilant for suspicious activity, such as small, unmanned aircraft systems (sUAS). Note a description and behavior of the sUAS and photograph it if it is possible without approaching it. If it crashes, alert bystanders to stay away and call the Base Defense Operations Center (BDOC) at 676-3200. Call Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection for questions at 676-6657 or 676-1661.
- Sign up for the U.S. State Department's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program at step.state.gov/ step to get travel advisory notifications.
- In the event of civil unrest, stay tuned to advisories in order to ensure personnel safety.

# ATTIRE

If you are off the installation, you will see some of the host-nation population dressing according to local customs.

### **APPROVED ATTIRE**

- Ball caps, beanies, visors
- Collared, casual or dress shirts that cover shoulders and midriff
- Sleeves that cover at least three inches from shoulder seam
- Skirts, dresses or shorts worn at or below the knee
- Jeans, slacks and capri pants (must not be frayed or torn)
- Running shoes, sneakers and dress shoes
- Flip-flops with leather or cloth straps, or wooden sole

#### **Always Remember**

- Uniforms are not to be worn off installation.
- Some may find it offensive for service members to wear traditional host-nation attire.
- Clothing should be appropriate, neat, and conservative and without political or religious imagery or offensive logos or slogans. Know what you are wearing and what it translates to or represents before wearing it off base.
- Personnel should always carry their ID card, but never display it in plain sight.

# LOCAL CULTURE



Eat meals on the economy, attend local festivals and learn about Turkish traditions. Address the differences between life in Türkiye versus back home and gain an appreciation for diversity while exploring.

# DINING

- Some restaurants may not serve alcohol and pork due to Muslim religious practices.
- Tipping is generally around 10–15 percent of the bill, and if especially good service is received, 20 percent is appreciated. Leaving it on the table or adding it to the bill is fine.
- Complimentary tea or small pastries are sometimes served after a meal.
- Open containers of alcohol are prohibited on streets and sidewalks. Please keep open containers within businesses and residences.

# SHOPPING

 When you enter a store, you may be pressured to buy something. A good rule of thumb is to not enter unless you are prepared to purchase an item.

- Upon entering and being greeted by the shop owner, you may be offered Turkish tea as a sign of hospitality and friendship. There may also be instances where you will even be offered a small gift or food as their guest. It is suggested that you take the offer and thank them.
- It is typical to politely haggle for certain items, depending on the situation. For example, if the item does not have a price tag, or you know the price of comparable items, you may be able to lower the price. If you agree to the price, it is considered binding.
- Do not give away or sell your items purchased at the BX.

# DRIVING

- Follow traffic laws and regulations as you would anywhere else in the world.
- In cities, expect aggressive driving.
- Horn usage is common in Türkiye and may be used to indicate that someone is turning, entering a blind corner or just to let you know the light turned green.

# WHEN OUT AND ABOUT

- Give seats on crowded transportation to elders or others in need of a seat.
- Watch out for scams in urban areas, and always practice situational awareness.
   Elicitation is common, including sextortion through online dating applications or flirting in-person. Always be cognizant of strangers' potential motivations.
- Religious professing is frowned upon culturally.
- The Turkish Penal Code makes it illegal to insult the President of Türkiye and you can be arrested by local police as a result. Additionally, you will see great respect given to historical figures such as Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the first president of Türkiye from 1923 to 1938. A good rule of thumb is to avoid controversial or political conversations or statements.
- If you are detained for any reason, present your "I am an American" card, then contact your chain of command and the Legal Office at 676-6800 (for Incirlik personnel).

# RAMADAN

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic lunar calendar. During this month, among other observations of their faith, some Muslims fast, which means they do not eat, drink or smoke from dawn until sunset. U.S. personnel are not obligated to fast. It is important to be aware and respectful of this observance, especially if you are off-base. Please note that some restaurants, parks, stores and services may have different hours and may seat you away from a wide public view to eat.

For language learning (free and paid options).

#### ► Google Translate App

This app allows you to translate typed and spoken language, plus the Google Lens features allows to translate Turkish from images via your camera. Keep in mind that there are informal and formal phrases in the Turkish language, so there will be times when Google Translate does not distinguish between the two. In formal situations, it is a good idea to cross-reference word choice with another credible source.

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




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# **TOP 10 PLACES TO GO** in Türkiye

Whether you are passionate about history, inspired by the outdoors or excited by urban *life, these top ten places to visit in Türkiye* will make it a memorable assignment.







# 1 Istanbul

Yes, it was Constantinople, and before that it was Byzantium. Founded in the seventh century by Greek colonists, this eclectic city straddles the Bosporus Strait and has been a cultural meeting point for centuries. Highlights include the Hagia Sophia Grand Mosque and the Blue Mosque across scenic Sultanahmet Square. Don't miss the Grand Bazaar whose maze of vendors easily occupies an entire shopping day. Then there is Topkapi Palace, this expansive Ottoman sultan's residence takes time to explore. Istanbul offers many more sites, but leave yourself time to enjoy some *meze* (small plate appetizers), try a *borek* (sweet and savory pastries) and sip some strong Turkish coffee.

# 2 | Cappadocia

Experience this land of unique geology by staying in a Göreme cave hotel and enjoying the town's exotic nightlife. Tour decorated cave churches at the Göreme Open Air Museum or on a hike in Soğanlı Valley. Get a little lost among rock formations down Devrent and Love Valleys and explore the underground city tunnels in Derinkuyu or Kaymakli. Take a classic morning hot air balloon ride, then spend an afternoon tasting the local clay pot kebab and touring a vineyard before marveling at sunset over Rose Valley. In winter, try skiing on a stratovolcano at the Erciyes ski resort.


### 3 Ephesus

The UNESCO Heritage Site of Ephesus was built by ancient Greek colonists and later flourished as a Roman port city. Today, it is preserved as a massive open-air archaeological park where visitors can wander inside a neighborhood of terraced homes, see the famous two-story façade of the Celsus Library and visit the Temple of Artemis, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. There are intricate details like mosaic floors and grand structures like the amphitheater. For more archaeological sites, check out the Greek city of Pergamon, the Hittite capital of Hattusa or neolithic Çatalhöyük.

### 4 **Turquoise Coast**

Often called the Turkish Riviera, the coastline of Antalya and Mugla provinces boasts 1000km of cliffs, harbor towns, ancient sites and diverse beaches. It can be hard to choose where to go. Alanya is great for shopping, features a lively downtown, big sandy beaches and plenty of water sports. For something eco-focused, stay in Dalyan with its Greek ruins, hot springs and access to the wild beach and sea turtle conservation area. Need more nightlife? Marmaris is known for its clubs, scenic harbor and boat trips to remote coves, while Kaş offers live music, cob-

blestone streets and proximity to the 18km long Patara beach. Can't choose? Try a multi-day Blue Cruise from Fethiye in a traditional gulet sailboat to see it all.

#### 5 Bursa

If there is one Turkish city that has something for everyone, it's Bursa. The central bazaar was an essential silk road waymark and is still a shopping paradise. Non-shoppers will enjoy exploring the historical hans, or Silk Road inns and trading centers, that have been around for 700 years. Bursa was the first Ottoman capital. Unique architecture from the Seljuk empire is on display at the Grand Mosque, built in 1399, and at the impressive sultan tombs. Nearby, wander around the cobbled alleys and original wood-beamed Ottoman homes in the quaint village of Cumalıkızık. Take the Bursa Teleferik, one of the longest cable cars in the world, higher into the Uludağ Mountains for summer hikes and winter skiing.

### 6| Bodrum Peninsula

The Bodrum Peninsula is a haven of small upscale waterfront towns, local markets and leisurely boat trips. Going to Bodrum is about finding the perfect beach town to match your vibe. Looking for epic dining, hopping nightlife, history and plenty of excursions? Try Bodrum City, known as Halicarnassus in ancient times, this city has it all. Looking for nature and a relaxing beach for swimming? Stay in one of the numerous cove resorts near Torba, or try windsurfing in Gumbet. For high-end stays, see if you can keep up with the yacht crowd in Yalikavak.

### 7 Izmir

Historically known as Smyrna, Izmir is an active port city. Known for its shopping superiority, the Kemeralti Market has been around for 500 years. Its combination of open-air stalls and small shops make this massive bazaar district a maze of commerce. Visit the Agora Open Air Museum to wander the ruins of the original fourth-century marketplace. Later, enjoy fresh air and sunset views along Izmir's seafront promenade. For the best views in town, ride up the Asansör, a free elevator built in 1907 to allow easy transport between markets at sea level and neighborhoods high on the hillside.

### 8 Olympos

Nestled within the Olympos Beydaglari National Park, the canyons around the ancient town of Olympos are an outdoor enthusiast's dream. Camp, stay in a treehouse or rent a cabin. Go rock climbing, SCUBA diving or paragliding. Hike to the eternal flames of Chimaera where burning underground gases escape through rock fissures. Explore the ruins of Olympos and its famous Temple of Hephaestus, god of forges. Or just swim and relax at the natural pebbly beach. Take adventuring a step further and hike part of the Lycian way, a 509km long-distance trail that runs from Fethiye to Antalya. The wildest section of the trail runs through Olympos.

# 9 Pamukkale

The hot springs at Pamukkale deposit calcium bicarbonate from the surrounding limestone to form uniquely bright white terraces of travertine pools full of pale blue water. In antiquity, the Greek city of Hierapolis was built on part of the formation and is now an archaeological park. Today, the area is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the water is diverted into cleverly mimicked swimming pools to control human impact on the natural terraces. A marked boardwalk trail allows viewing of the original travertine. Nearby are the less-touristed Karahayit Red Mud Springs where hot water bubbles up and deposits ironrich minerals.

### 10| Black Sea

The northern Black Sea coast of Türkiye is unique with its forests, misty mountains, lofty villages and Byzantine sites. Find a chalet in the Uzungöl valley with its alpine hikes and beautiful mountain lake town. Take a day trip to the Sumela monastery, precariously carved into a cliff. Visit Zilkale Castle and you'll think you landed in the alps. If you'd rather be wandering cobblestone streets, eating seafood and relaxing at the beach, stay in a small town like Amasra with its castle walls, quaint market and scenic waterfront ideal for slow travel.

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
