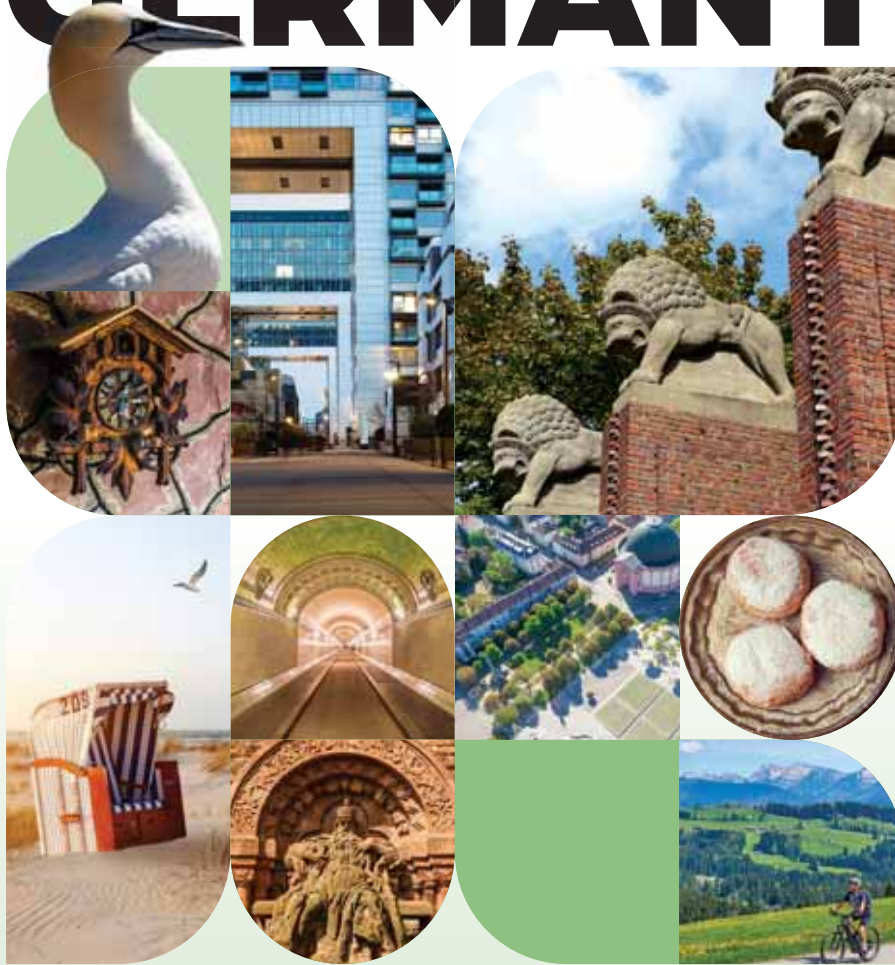

WIESBADEN

Johannisnacht Festival, Mainz | June 19 – 22, 2026

Less than a half-hour drive from Wiesbaden, the “Midsummer Night” is one of Mainz’s largest festivals. The festival celebrates the memory of Johannes Gutenberg, inventor of the Gutenberg printing press. There will be an antiquarian book market on Schillerplatz and Ballplatz and an artists’ market along the Rhine. In front of the **Gutenberg Museum**, guests can create their own colorful works of art. Giant bubbles float through streets as street artists appear and perform with puppets, bagpipes, on stilts and more. KEEP YOUR EYES ON FOOTBALLER MONTRELL CULBREATH.

This 18-year-old was born in Landstuhl, Germany and holds both American and German citizenship.

He started playing football, or soccer, locally in the Kaiserslautern Military Community (KMC) area at a young age including for the SV Spesbach Club and the youth academy at Football Club Kaiserslautern (FCK). As a teenager, he moved to Leverkusen, north of Cologne, to join their youth academy. In 2022, he briefly played with the U.S. men's national U16 soccer team before returning to play for the German U16 National team.

In December 2025, he made an exciting Bundesliga debut, playing for Bayer 04 Leverkusen, scoring a goal on his first night out and helping secure a 1-3 win over Leipzig. ■

CHEER ON THE BEST: FC BAYERN MÜNCHEN!

From the Allianz Arena in Munich, comes FC Bayern München; a Fußball (football) team whose ambition and drive to win have held strong for over 125 years.

In 1900, founding father, Franz John, had the idea to bring together a group of people to play Fußball. At the time, Schwabing was an area where artists and innovators from all over came together and on February 27th, 11 founding players formed FC Bayern, making Fußball the go-to sport. One of the main goals of the club was to remain independent from others with no loans and no credit. This has been maintained by the club since.

FC Bayern has become one of, if not the most successful club in German Fußball history, having won a record 34 German Bundesliga league titles (11 of them consecutively from 2013 to 2023). The team holds the record for the most Bundesliga titles as well as the most DFB-Pokal (German Cup) wins at 20 wins. They have also won the Champions League six times, along with other international titles like the FIFA Club World Cup.

Perhaps this is partly attributed to their motto "Mia san Mia" (We are who we are), which embodies self-belief and the ambition to win. With such a strong winning mentality, it's no wonder FC Bayern also has the most fans. The team has the support of over 432,500 club members, more than any other club in the world.

THE KIT

Team Colors: The official colors that the team and fans sport are red and white, but this was not always the case. Before the merger with Münchener Sport-Club (MSC) in 1906, the club wore white and blue to represent Bavaria and the official state colors. Blue has since been reintroduced in the team's logo. Blue and white diamonds in the crest reflect the flag of Bavaria.

Stars: You may have noticed five stars on the jersey. FC Bayern München is the only team that wears five stars on their jersey as of right now. The stars represent an accumulation of Bundesliga championship titles. In 2021, the fifth star was added for the first time after the team's 30th championship.

One Star: 3 Bundesliga titles

Two Stars: 5 Bundesliga titles

Three Stars: 10 Bundesliga titles

Four Stars: 20 Bundesliga titles

Five Stars: 30 Bundesliga titles

NEED TO KNOW

Home Ground: Allianz Arena in Munich

Team Nicknames: Der FCB (The FCB), Die Bayern (The Bavarians), Stern des Südens (Star of the South), Die Roten (The Reds)

Team Motto: "Mia san Mia" (We are who we are)

Chant: "Immer vorwärts FC Bayern" (Forever forward FC Bayern)

Song: "Stern des Südens" is the official song; however, in 2025, they were gifted a stadium anthem from the fans based on the chant "Immer vorwärts."

ON YOUR VISIT

Celebrating: Like in most cities with a prominent Fußball team, fans flood the streets sporting team colors and gathering pre- and post-game for beers, filling the surrounding area with lively chants in support of the home players. Frequent game-day bars such as Stadion an der Schleißheimerstraße are full. Leopoldstraße in the Schwabing district is a well-known "party street" where fans celebrate, especially after major title wins.

FC Bayern Museum: This thoughtfully curated museum is the largest club museum in Germany. It houses the history of FC Bayern München from their first championship in 1932, up until the spectacular treble season in 2012/2013. Plus, it stays up to date with current events. There are interactive displays and visitors can walk among life-size figures of current players, shirts from almost every season, trophy replicas and more. Museum and stadium tour combi-tickets, where you can see the players' tunnel, are available. Keep an eye out for "Meet the Legend" events with former players. ■

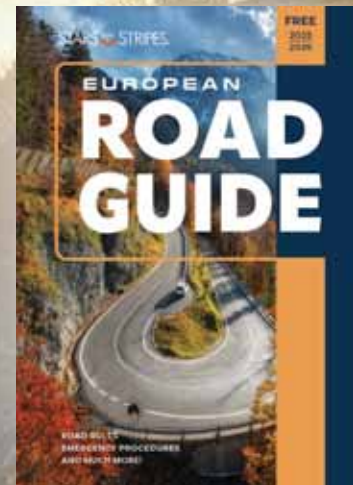

When we rented our house in the Betzenberg neighborhood of Kaiserslautern, we did not fully grasp how much living near the local football stadium would affect our lives.

We've grown accustomed to the pre-game road closures and post-game chaos with hordes of excited people who, thankfully, take the path of least resistance and stumble downhill into town. We can interpret the various cheering sounds and fireworks that waft over the neighborhood and can predict the hooliganism of visiting teams based on the number of paddy wagons and police in riot gear based at the nearby roundabout. It has been a (mostly) fun immersion into German football culture, surrounded by some of the country's fiercest fans.

You don't need to be stationed in Germany very long to know that Europe's number one sport will affect you in one way or another. Whether you've unknowingly boarded a train full of fans, run into traffic or not been able to find a decent hotel room on a game weekend, it's important to understand that in Germany, *Fußball* is a way of life. Fans are devoted, and if you are from a big college town or an NFL or NBA city in the States then you can grasp just how much life revolves around the sport for true fanatics.

THE BUNDESLIGA

Germany's professional soccer league, the *Bundesliga*, is one of Europe's top leagues with teams and players receiving numerous international top honors. Germany's fans are known for their team commitment, too, attending matches in any weather.

Teams are operated by a football club, which must hold the majority voting rights according to the 50+1 rule. This means that the publicly owned clubs run by invested fans are the primary owners and private corporations or individuals cannot take over. This important German distinction keeps the clubs local, ticket costs low and garners a dedicated fan culture.

There are 18 teams in the top tier of the Bundesliga, representing cities across Germany. Interestingly, early regulations within the league limited an individual city to having only a single team in the top league; the rule was phased out, but its legacy means that the league has teams from geographically diverse areas, devout local fans and few local rivalries.

The Bundesliga season runs from August to May. Each team plays each other twice yearly: once at a home match and again at an away match. This means there are 34 games in a season. Teams earn 3 points for a win, 2 for a tie and 0 for losing; the team with the most points is declared the current champion. Running parallel to the Bundesliga season, teams also participate in the German Cup (DFB-Pokal) tournament, which is a single-elimination style series with semi-final matches held this year on April 21-22 and a final on May 23.

The top teams from both the Bundesliga and German Cup qualify to compete in the Union of European Football Associations (UEFA) leagues during the next season. UEFA matches occur throughout the season but are typically on weeknights to not compete with local football. For the 2025-26 season, Germany is represented by Dortmund, Bayern, Leverkusen and Frankfurt in the Champions League and Freiburg and Stuttgart in the Europa League.

At the end of the season, the bottom two Bundesliga teams are relegated to the lower 2 Bundesliga tier, while the top two second-tier teams get to move up. A third spot is also up for grabs in a relegation play off that pits the 16th ranked team against the third-ranked team from 2 Bundesliga. A final professional tier, 3 Liga, has 20 teams with the potential for promotion.

It's important to know that football clubs affiliated with the Bundesliga don't only provide professional teams. Below the 3 Liga, the Regionalliga has semi-professional players from 90 teams competing in five regions. The German league system continues to offer lower and more local tiers for state and county leagues. Football clubs across the country have teams and academies for children, amateurs and semi-professionals in addition to the big well-known competitive pro teams. So, when the neighbor's kid tells you they play for the Bundesliga, they probably earned a spot in the U9 (Under 9s) on a competitive team whose players grow into amateurs that feed the pro team, so they have every right to brag. ■



WHAT ABOUT THE FIFA WORLD CUP™?

The Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup is an international competition. Germany has now qualified for the World Cup 21 times with their inclusion in the 2026 series. Germany's Deutscher Fußball-Bund (DFB), which oversees the Bundesliga, assembles a national team from top players on German teams to participate. World Cup matches always occur in the summer, outside of the regular football season. In 2026, matches begin on June 11 and the final is held on July 19 in New York. Canada, Mexico and the USA are hosting the World Cup with matches held in 16 different cities.

Both the **Greuther Fürth** and **FC Nürnberg** are nearby 2 Bundesliga teams, but closer to home is the regional tier 4 **Ansbach** team.

USAG BAVARIA

FC Nürnberg and **Greuther Fürth** are your nearest 2 Bundesliga teams.

USAG RHEINLAND PFALZ & RAMSTEIN AIR BASE

FC Kaiserslautern is a 2 Bundesliga team playing in Fritz-Walter Stadium, also known as Betzenberg.

USAG STUTTGART

VfB Stuttgart is a Bundesliga team playing at the MHP Arena, also known as the Neckarstadion.

USAG WIESBADEN

FSV Mainz 05 is your local Bundesliga team.



CELEBRATE MATCH DAY

It's match day! All right, you've got your tickets in hand, and you've brushed up on your terminology and rules. Here are some things to know before you go.

THE BASICS

A few years back, comedian Jason Sudekis created a skit (and now popular TV show) about an American football coach hired to train an English Premier League (EPL) team. "Ted Lasso" hilariously bumbles his way through the lingo, rules and coaching. Here are a few basics to avoid becoming like Coach Lasso.

- **Common terminology:**

match = game

fixture = scheduled match

pitch = field

kit = uniform

promotion = moving up a league

relegation = moving down a league

VAR = video assistant referee

- Football matches are generally 90-minutes long, separated into two 45-minute halves. Depending on the amount of penalties and fouls during the half, the head referee will usually add a few minutes of make-up time at the end of each half.

- There are three referees—one center ref and two line judges on either side of the pitch. If a decision is challenged, or if the referee is unsure of the correct call, VAR is used. VAR is essentially the same as instant replay during NFL games.



TICKETS TO PROFESSIONAL MATCHES

Scoring tickets to top-tier team matches is almost a science. Who is playing, location, venue, membership status, number of tickets needed and even plain geography can affect whether or not there are seats available. For example, we recently tried to buy tickets to Sheffield United vs. Leicester City. Because we weren't members of either club, and since the clubs are near each other, there was no general sales seat release. Here are some things to consider when buying tickets.

- **Are you a die-hard fan of a particular team?**

Consider purchasing an annual club membership. Members often have access to tickets before the general public. Just be warned that tickets are often sold individually, which means each person wanting tickets will need their own membership.

- **Buying multiple tickets doesn't mean you will sit with your party.**

My husband and son went to a Tottenham vs. FC Barcelona match and had seats two rows apart. Luckily, people volunteered to switch seats so they could sit together.

- **Hospitality packages can be worth it depending on the match and time of year.**

As the season progresses, team placement and seeding becomes more stable. Hospitality often includes decent seats in a dedicated section, pre- and/or post-game food and beverages.

- **Know your logistics before purchasing tickets.**

Some stadiums are on the outskirts of town and may not have public transportation readily available. Many fans tailgate at local pubs or bars ahead of time, so plan your time of arrival accordingly. Stadium size can have a direct impact on ticket availability. Huge venues such as Wembley Stadium, Camp Nou, and Allianz Arena may afford a better opportunity for tickets as opposed to smaller stadiums such as King Power Stadium and Volkswagen Arena.

- **Does the team matter?**

If you're catching a match for love of the game, considering popping down to one of the lower leagues. Local matches can be just as exciting for a lot less money. ■

The Temple of Apollo in Naxos, Greece

The *Portata*, also known as the **Temple of Apollo in Naxos, Greece**, is a large, unfinished marble gate dedicated to the Greek god of music, poetry and prophecy: Apollo. Built in 530 B.C., it is located on the islet of Palatia and accessible by foot from the Naxos mainland. Photographer Katie Merry captured an incredible view of sunset shining through the precious landmark. It is said that the Portata faces Delos, Apollo’s birthplace, but it also has strong ties to Dionysus, as Naxos was his home. ■
