Trempelmarkt / Trempel Market May 13-14, Nuremberg



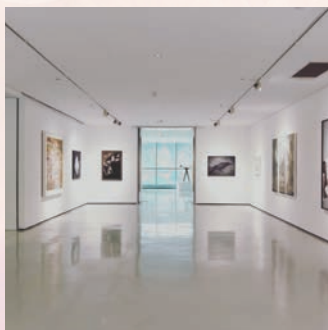
Germany's largest inner-city flea market offers bargains on treasures you never knew you needed. The market runs 4 p.m. to midnight on Friday and all day Saturday.

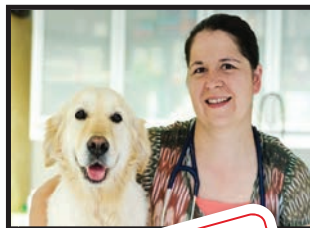

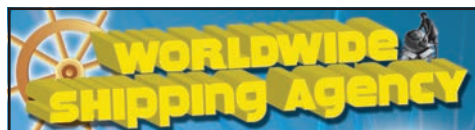

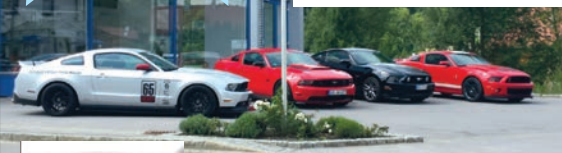

Since 2010, the Badeparadies Schwarzwald has been offering the chance to do exactly that, thanks to its winning combination of serious pampering for the grown-ups and fun attractions for kids of all ages.

BADEPARADIES SCHWARZWALD

This extensive complex is no insider's secret, consistently ranking close to the top position on lists of Germany's best water parks.

This vast water park whose name translates to "Black Forest Swimming Paradise" is located just north of the recreational lake known as the Titisee. Although less known than Berlin's Tropical Islands or the Therme Erding outside Munich, this extensive complex is no insider's secret, consistently ranking close to the top position on lists of Germany's best water parks.

For non-speakers of German, a first-time visit to a water park can be a disorienting experience. This park's three distinct zones reduce to a minimum the chances of inadvertently stumbling into a gaggle of nudists with your young children in tow.

The zone most appealing to families is the Galaxy Schwarzwald, where slides and water attractions tempt riders both timid and brave. The eight slides categorized as "family level" include a pink and curvy snake slide, along with parallel tube slides two children can ride simultaneously. The six "action level" slides feature raging rapids and blinking lights, along with the X-Tube, a 590-foot-long tube slide for pairs and singles. For fearless riders above the age of 13, two "X-treme level" slides await, one offering a free fall experience, the other the world's biggest steel halfpipe. A wave pool churns up artificial surf 25 times a day.

Visitors without children or with kids old enough to work their way through the Galaxy Schwarzwald independently can slip away to the Palm Oasis. The Blue Lagoon's turquoise waters are kept at around 91 degrees, warm enough to sip fruity cocktails in the swim-up pool bar. Other ways to relax include soaking in waters laden with Dead Sea salts and other minerals, placing weary limbs under hydro-massage jets or indulging in a massage.

The Palais Vital is meant for lovers of the sauna experience. This zone, a strictly "textile free" area and off-limits to those under age 16, offers 12 themed saunas, including two for women only, along with six pools for floating, soaking and gently paddling in nothing more than the skin you were born in.

Knitting together the theme of a lush swimmer's paradise are the complex's palms. Over 300 living and breathing trees were transported from plantations in Malaysia and Florida and were gradually acclimatized to the European climate and replanted in massive pots. A high-tech system to irrigate and monitor the temperature and humidity of each individual tree keeps the complex at its verdant best.


Badeparadies Schwarzwald is located at Am Badeparadies 1, 79822 Titisee-Neustadt. Use of the pool complex, at least for now, is by advance reservation only. Entry to each different zone is priced separately. Prices for day tickets for the Galaxy Schwarzwald start at 17 euros; ages three and under enter for free. Entry to the Palais Vital costs 20 euros and up. Entry is cheapest during the off-season and on weekdays. www.badeparadies-schwarzwald.de. ■

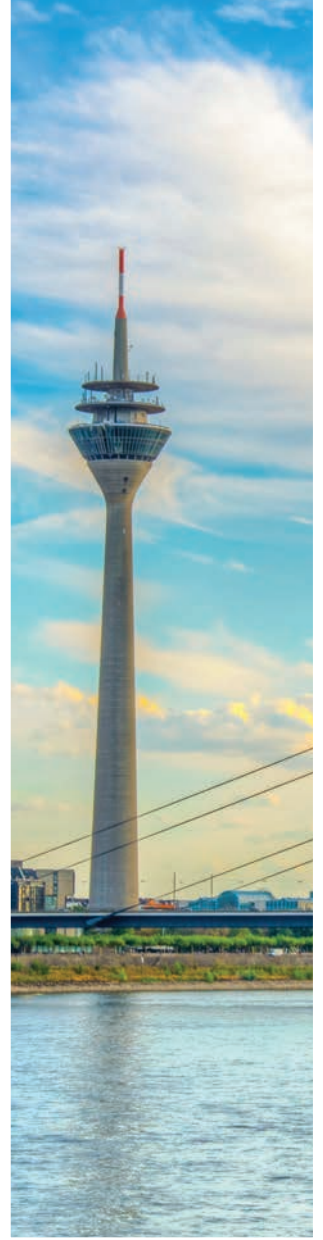
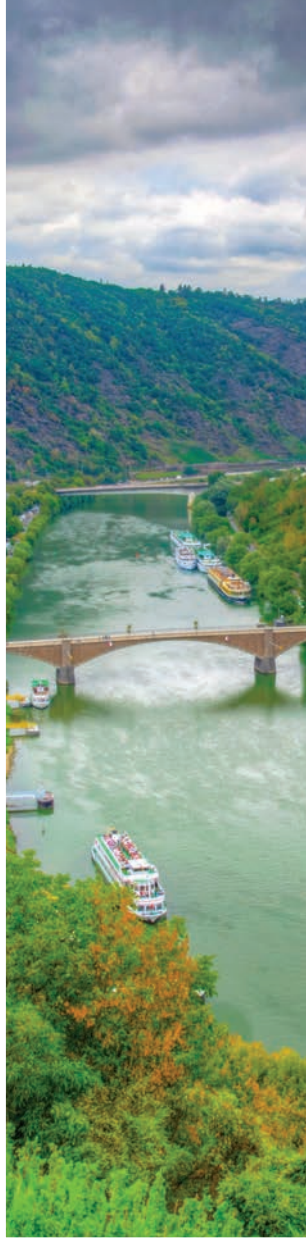

The mighty Rhine River rises in the Swiss Alps and empties into the North Sea near Rotterdam, Netherlands. Along the banks of its 765-mile path, numerous great cities including Basel, Switzerland; Strasbourg, France and Cologne and Düsseldorf, Germany can be found. But there's one stretch in particular that has fueled the lion's share of the myths and legends surrounding Western Europe's second-longest river.

The Upper Middle Rhine Valley is the official term for the 40-mile length of the river between Bingen and Koblenz, Germany. Colloquially known as the Rhine Gorge, the officially designated UNESCO World Heritage Site is a fairy-tale land of brooding castle ruins, medieval half-timbered villages and impossibly steep vineyards. Sandstone cliffs and hairpin turns add yet more drama to a landscape that has been inspiring poets and artists for centuries.

ALL ABOARD

In addition to the barges and working craft plying up and down the Rhine, dozens of cruise vessels ferry tourists along the entirety

of the river's navigable stretch. For many passengers, the highlight of this weeklong tour will be the time spent in the Rhine Gorge. For those without unlimited vacation time or the deep pockets needed to spend a week aboard a ship, day cruises can make for a fun and affordable alternative.

The Köln-Düsseldorfer Deutsche Rheinschiffahrt, KD for short, offers regular sailings aboard its extensive fleet of riverboats from April through October. Passengers can hop on board in Mainz or Wiesbaden-Biebrich and cruise as far as Koblenz or vice-versa; they can also elect to hop off at any number of adorable towns such as Rüdesheim, Bacharach or St. Goar. Once a town has been thoroughly explored, they can either board another ship back to their starting points or hop a train for their homebound journeys.

KD Lines' additional offerings include a historical paddle steamer named Goethe that makes its way from Koblenz to Rüdesheim and back once a day, or a special sailing from the town of Boppard to the Loreley, a monument to a mythical maiden who threw herself into the Rhine River in despair over her faithless lover. Magically transformed into a siren upon her death, she sits on a rock and

combs her golden hair, distracting sailors and making them run their ships aground. The beloved legend has inspired a popular song; don't be surprised if the German-speaking passengers onboard start singing it loudly as the ship sails past the monument.

Other KD specials include ship-bicycle and ship-cable car combination tickets. Onboard party nights, after-work and evening cruises can also be booked. Boat tickets can be purchased online or at onshore booths near the landing stages.

The Bingen-Rüdesheimer Schifffahrtsgesellschaft is another shipping company serving the Rhine Gorge area. Its so-called "ring ticket" offers a boat ride from Bingen to Rüdesheim, from where passengers can hike or take a chairlift to the imposing Niederwald Monument, erected in 1883 to commemorate the unification of Germany. From there, they can either hike or take a different chairlift down into the town of Assmannshausen before boarding another ship to take them back to their starting point. Ring tickets offering a similar itinerary are also available departing from the town of Bacharach.

SPECIAL EVENTS

In non-pandemic times, there are five summer evenings in particular when it's a special treat to be aboard a ship. Rhine in Flames events are evenings during which the cities of Bonn, Bingen, Goarshausen, Koblenz, Oberwesel, Rüdesheim and Spay take turns hosting brilliant displays of fireworks set against a backdrop of illuminated vineyards and monuments. A merry convoy of riverboats done up in lights chugs slowly along the Rhine, granting those on board front-row seats to the action. These spectacles take place on selected weekends between May and September. The USO typically offers tours inclusive of bus transfers and an on board program including dinner and live entertainment on many of the Rhine in Flames dates.

In between the day trip and weeklong cruise options is another wonderful way to discover the Rhine and its villages. In the weeks leading up to Christmas, several riverboat tour operators offer three-day cruises departing from Cologne and calling in at towns with their Christmas markets in full swing. Tour-goers get to experience all the magic of the markets for several hours without the hassle of driving or parking, and once their toes and noses have grown nippy, their warm and sumptuously decorated riverboat home awaits them just steps away.

The wild beauty and romance of the Rhine is undoubtedly one of Germany's best touristic assets, and the experience of being afloat in its mythical, ever-flowing waters is as timeless as the river itself. ■

A magical destination such as Santorini needs no introduction. With blue-domed churches, unreal views of the Aegean Sea and picture-perfect moments with every turn of your head, this whitewashed beauty of an island will leave you awestruck until the end of your stay. To make the most of your time here, check the following off your bucket list:

Treat your eyes to the best
sunrise and sunset
you've ever seen.

For a good vantage point, head to the Byzantine Castle in Oia. Don't forget to set your alarm to catch the sunrise, but be aware there may be a sea of people who had the same idea.



Meander the narrow streets in Fira, Santorini's capital, and shop for souvenirs to bring back home—olive oil, wines, ouzo and ceramic paper boats are popular items.

Delight your tastebuds in Greek fare such as fava (a side dish made from pureed split yellow peas), "chlorotyri" (goat cheese found only in Santorini) and "saganaki" (fried cheese wrapped in Phyllo dough) to name a few. Seafood, of course, is a must.

Clink your glasses and become an oenophile with the handful of wineries found on the island. Assyrtiko is the main grape variety here.



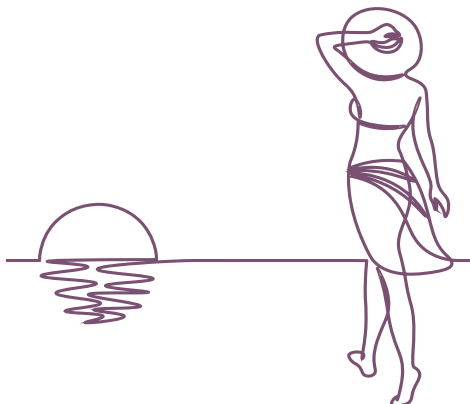

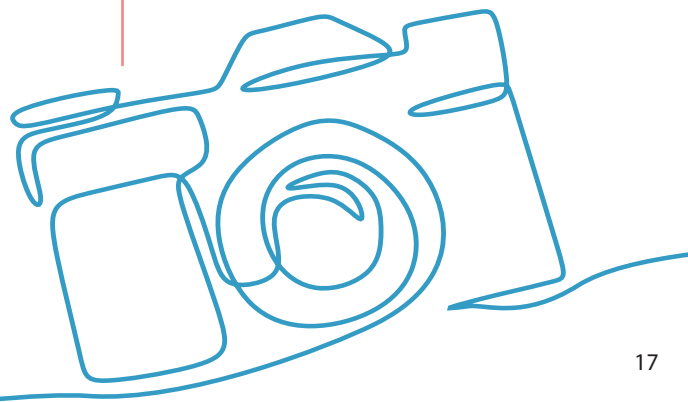

Rüdesheimer Kaffee

a taste of the Rhine

The town of Rüdesheim am Rhine is a well-known winemaking spot along the Rhine River. Marked as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, tourists to this charming town can stop at various weinstubes to taste local Rhine wines and cuisine as well as take a cable car to Niederwald-denkmal, the patriotic statue towering over the vineyards. You can also visit a couple of local castles, including Burg Ehrenfels among the vineyards and the 10th-century castle Brömserburg, known as the oldest castle in the Rhine Gorge World Heritage Site.

After a morning of exploring the town and surrounding vineyards, a Rüdesheimer coffee is in order. Not only is this locale known for its wine drinking, but it also has its own coffee concoction. Invented in 1957, this coffee cocktail mixes a bit of theatrics with the town's signature item: wine, of course.

This coffee's unique ingredient is Asbach Uralt brandy, which originates in Rüdesheim from when Hugo Asbach opened his distillery there in 1892. This wine town was perfect for him, as cognac/brandy is made by distilling wine. Because France claimed the term "cognac," Asbach changed the name of his product to "weinbrand." The theatrics enter the picture when warm brandy is poured over a couple of sugar cubes and then the mixture is flambeed in the mug, before freshly brewed coffee is added. Naturally, a dollop of whipped cream and shaved chocolate on top are the final touches. While Rüdesheimer coffee has its own specially designed mug, which you can purchase for optimal coffee enjoyment, it can also be served in an Irish coffee mug.



Rüdesheimer Kaffee

Start to finish: 10 minutes, including brewing coffee

Serves: 1

Equipment: long match, long spoon

2 cubes sugar

1 1/3 ounces Asbach Uralt Brandy

Freshly brewed coffee

Heavy cream

Pinch of cinnamon, optional

Chocolate bar for grating

Prepare the whipped cream, adding a pinch of cinnamon while whipping, if desired. Once your coffee has finished brewing, place sugar cubes in coffee mug. Warm the brandy either in the microwave or over gentle heat on the stove, not allowing it to boil.

When the brandy is warmed through, pour over sugar cubes. Light the mixture with a long match and let burn for 1 minute, stirring with a long spoon to dissolve the sugar.

Pour the hot coffee over brandy-sugar mixture and top with a dollop of whipped cream.

Using a potato peeler, gently shave chocolate bar over whipped cream. Enjoy! ■



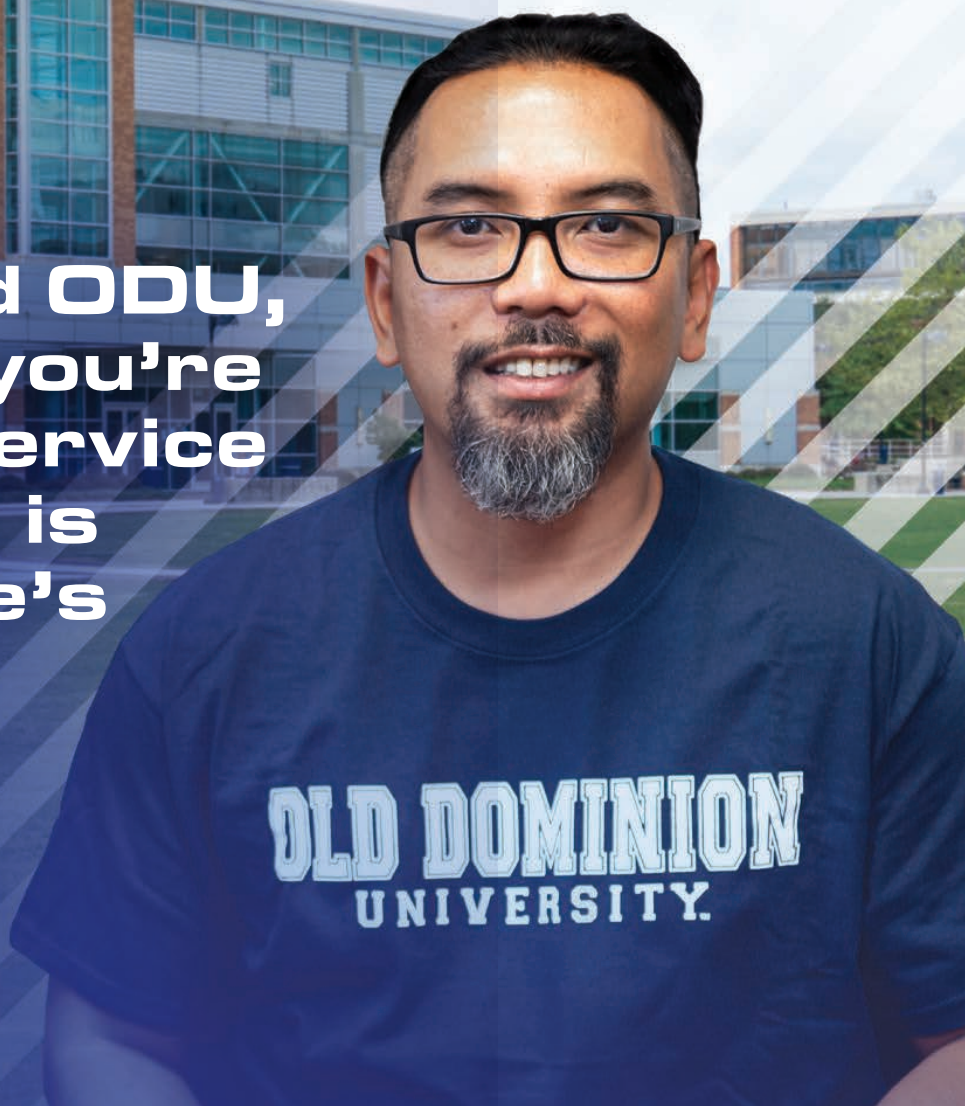
