## Germany's TRADITIONS





### When the weather turns cold and the holidays are upon us, it's time to start celebrating in Germany!

Starting with St. Martin's Day in November and continuing through the end of December, there is always an event in which to participate. Whether indoors or out in the open, get ready to celebrate some of Germany's most festive traditions.

On Nov. 11 each year, St. Martin's Day, "Martinstag" is celebrated in honor of St. Martin of Tours, a Roman soldier. Legend says that Martin and other soldiers were returning on horseback to a town called Amiens during a heavy snowstorm, when he came upon a beggar. The poor man's clothes were ragged, and it was clear he would not survive the night. Martin had neither food, shelter nor money to offer the beggar so instead, he cut his heavy red soldier's cloak in half and covered the man to keep him from freezing to death. It is said that later that evening Martin dreamed of Jesus Christ, where Christ revealed it was he who had been the beggar and thanked Martin for his cloak.

In order to share St. Martin's selflessness,

German children are taught through reenactment in local churches, where children dress in costumes for the storytelling. After the story is told, the children embark on a procession through their village carrying beautiful paper lanterns to a bonfire, or Martin's Fire, "Martinsfeuer." Children also sing carols and go door to door to collect money for the church or treats. You may also find local parades and festivals celebrating St. Martin.

### OFTEN FAMILIES WILL SET UP AD-VENT WREATHS, "ADVENTSKRANZ" ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF THE SEA-SON, WHICH HOLD FOUR CANDLES.

The month of December brings Advent, a time to prepare for the arrival of the Christ child, "das Christkind" on Dec. 25. From Dec.1-24, there are various ways to celebrate Advent. Some choose to give up things (similar to Lent), while others choose to indulge in special treats like chocolate or alcohol-filled Advent calendars. Often families will set up Advent wreaths, "Adventskranz" on the first Sunday of the sea-

son, which hold four candles. Each candle represents one week of Advent.

Many towns and cities throughout Germany will host Christmas markets. Lovingly decorated wooden huts will likely line the square of the town that is putting on the event. You'll find traditional items like gingerbread cookies, Lebkuchen, marzipan and mulled wine, Glühwein. Mulled wine is a fan favorite at the markets. Oftentimes you can collect ceramic mugs with the name of the town's market and the dates as keepsakes. Craftsmen also sell their wares at the markets, and the range of items available is amazing. Think anything from handmade jewelry to delicate glass ornaments painted with vivid Christmas scenes.



### **HOLIDAY CHEER**

The St. Wendeler Weihnachtmarkt comes to life near the town hall, cathedral and pedestrian precinct from Dec. 7-15. Over 160 lovingly decorated booths will be selling arts, crafts, gifts and regional delicacies to tempt your taste buds. Fancy a sausage or waffle with powdered sugar with your glühwein? Look no further! This cozy atmosphere is especially beautiful at night when the twinkling lights are out in full force.

Good girls and boys will love getting candy from St. Nicholas, who makes frequent appearances and is full of holly jolly holiday spirit! Also in attendance are the Three Wise Men, who parade daily through the town with live camels to the stable for a performance of the story of Mary and Joseph. They are followed by musicians and fire eaters.

The Christmas pyramid is a stunning eye catcher and features intricately carved nativity figures and towers over market goers. Take pictures next to life-size nutcrackers as well for the perfect Instagram post. Go zooming down a snow-covered toboggan run for a real adrenaline rush or feel like a giant in the Dwarf Forest. ### **MEDIEVAL MAGIC**

If the medieval world of knights fascinates you, you're in luck! Vendors at this market don historical costumes to hawk their wares. Artisans demonstrate forgotten arts and techniques like felting, spinning, weaving, blacksmithing, wood turning, basket weaving, rope pulling, javelin throwing and archery. If you're lucky, you too will be able to test your skills and perhaps try to make a masterpiece to bring home!

Camp groups shed light on how people lived, worked, ate and celebrated in the middle ages. Merry jugglers, dancers, singers, musicians and magicians provide entertainment for all in attendance both on stages and throughout the streets. The fun doesn't stop when the sun goes down. After dark, there are many fire choreographed performances with music, lights and dancing.

Children will love getting to know Argon and Nea, a duo of puppet dragons who will come out to play at the market. There will also be a magician full of tricks and spells to captivate his audience. This family-friendly market makes sure no one is disenchanted with their surroundings or thinking about the coldness of their toes.

### **GETTING THERE**

St. Wendel is approximately 50 minutes west of Kaiserslautern and an hour and 45 minutes southwest of Wiesbaden. Parking for the market is available in the city garage until 10 p.m. Don't forget to pay your parking ticket before exiting the garage! The market is open Monday-Thursday from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Friday-Sunday from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Set the mood right for the Christmas season this year by attending the St. Wendel Christmas and Medieval Markets. You're sure to find holiday cheer, fantastic gifts and outstanding food mixed with a medieval flair. Spend the day wandering through the booths, being in awe at the performances and learning a trick or two from a blacksmith!



### **MEDIEVAL MAGIC**

The Christmas Market in Bochum takes you back in time to the 15th century. Here you'll find craftsmen, traders, minstrels and buffoons, all dressed in costumes from this time. The world's smallest ferris wheel is housed here amongst almost 200 old fashioned stalls. Every day the region's only flying Santa will appear in a reindeer drawn sleigh overhead between 5 - 7 p.m. near Pauluskirche in the heart of the city. Available gifts include tree decorations, ceramics, glassware and wooden toys. The market is open from Nov. 21 - Dec. 23, 2019.



### **AN ISLAND OASIS**

The Frauenchiemsee Christmas market is a one-of-a-kind market located on an island surrounded by the perfectly clear waters of Lake Chiemsee and the magnificent Bavarian Alps. With such a picture perfect backdrop, an incredibly romantic winter wonderland emerges. The Frauenchiemsee Christmas market is open from Nov. 29 – Dec. 1 and Dec. 6 – 8 this year. It is open on Friday from 2 - 7 p.m. and Saturday - Sunday from 12 p.m. - 7 p.m. Getting to Frauenchiemsee is easy. With just one ticket you can go from the train station in Prien to the Prien/Stock harbor and get on a ferry to the market. If you arrive by car, there are parking areas near the train station or at the harbor.

### A WINE LOVERS PARADISE


The Mosel Wine and Christmas market in the underworld of Traben-Trarbach is celebrated in a dimly lit network of historical wine cellars. This market is particularly wonderful because the aroma of mulled wine, roasted almonds and fir sprigs dances through the warm subterranean air. Hidden beneath the streets of the town you'll find stalls with high quality items, culinary specialties and all the wine products you could possibly imagine. The market is open Nov. 22 - Dec. 15 and Dec. 20 - Jan. 1, 2019.



### FOR GROWN UPS ONLY

The Santa Pauli Christmas market in Hamburg is definitely geared towards an adult-only crowd. This market focuses on "blurring the boundaries between conventional Christmas tradition and the frivolous love of life." This market is in full swing from Nov. 18 - Dec. 23, 2019. Opening hours are Mondays - Wednesdays from 4 - 11 p.m., Thursdays from 4 p.m. to midnight, Fridays and Saturdays from 1 p.m. - 1 a.m. and Sundays from 1 - 11 p.m. The market is located in the vicinity of the Schmidt Theater and admission is free.

### THE FLOATING MARKET

### TIP

If you want to bring your family to this market, there are child-oriented programs only on Sundays. Otherwise, leave the kids at home and enjoy some adult only time.

Despite the undecided definition, you can still explore the best of the most common concept of Scandinavia — Denmark, Norway and Sweden!

### **DENMARK**

### Copenhagen

Denmark's capital is known for its abundance of shopping and dining opportunities. The Strøget, located in the historic district, is Europe's longest pedestrian-only shopping zone. Here you'll find your favorite top-of-the-line and budget-friendly brands scattered through the 1.1 kilometer-long shopping area, making it a true fashion lover's paradise.

Compared to the other Scandinavian capitals, Copenhagen is home to the most Michelinstarred restaurants with exactly 15 dispersed across the city. Copenhagen's compelling culinary scene is one it takes great pride in by featuring a variety of high-profile restaurants, kitchens that cook with organic ingredients (most of which are grown in-house) and hole-in-the-wall restaurants owned by some of the world's best sous chefs.

A trip to Copenhagen wouldn't be complete without strolling along the iconic Nyhavn waterfront filled with colorful houses, bars and restaurants. More than just a buzzing entertainment district, Nyhavn provides the perfect photo opportunity for all Instagram-loving tourists.

### **Tivoli Gardens**



### **NORWAY**

### Oslo

Home to a vast amount of landmarks, museums and outdoor treasures, the capital of Norway is filled with plenty of sightseeing opportunities. Be sure to uncover Norway's Viking history at the Oslo Viking Ship Museum filled with well-preserved wooden Viking ships dating back as far as the 9th century.

For the outdoor enthusiasts, the city holds plenty of rustic parks, the magnificent Oslof-jord's waterways and islands which can be found a short distance from the city center, as well as the ski slopes and forests of Nordmarka.

### **Fjords**

Noted as the symbol of Norway, over 1,000 fjords can be found throughout the country. Shaped by massive glaciers from many ice ages, fjords resemble a half-oval, underwater valley boasting dramatic, picturesque scenery. The most popular destinations include the Lysef-jord area, Hardangerfjord region, Aurlandsfjord, Nærøyfjord, Sognefjord area, Geirangerfjord area, Hjørundfjord, Romsdalsfjord and the Trollfjord. Many tourists kayak, hike or take a cruise to reach these breathtaking beauties. The Norwegian fjords are truly a stunning sight to behold.

### **Lofoten Islands**

Sprinkled across the Norwegian Sea and high above the Arctic Circle are the glorious Lofoten Islands. Tremendous landscapes and spectacular characteristics can be found throughout this archipelago to include magnificent mountain peaks, arctic fjords and sheltered bays. Connected by bridges and tunnels, the primary islands of Austvågøy, Vestvågøy, Flakstadøy and Moskenesøy, are separated from the mainland of Vestfjorden. Other than their beauty, the islands are famously known for their small fishing villages that offer visitors the chance to stay in a Rorbu, also known as an old fisherman's cabin. Be sure to indulge in stockfish — a traditional cuisine made from spawning cod.



### **SWEDEN**

### Stockholm


Made up of 14 islands connected by many bridges, exploring the capital of Sweden is rather easy. A top spot to visit is the strikingly romantic neighborhood of Stockholm's old town, Gamla Stan, which lures tourists with its vibrant atmosphere of well-kept 17th century buildings housing shops and restaurants. # Make time to GET AWAY





### OSLO

Norway's capital is nestled in the country's southern coast and sits along the Oslofjord. Known for its sweeping green spaces, photographers flock to Oslo. Luckily, much of the area is flat, so when you do find higher ground you're often looking at what resembles a postcard.

Oslo's best view is the Holmenkollen Ski Jump and Museum. The jump has an observation deck nearly 200-feet high with a panoramic view of the area's deep blue waters, lush green forests and white snowy peaks. If you're brave enough and want a moving view of Oslo, take Holmenkollen's zipline. It's 1,200 feet of pure adrenaline as you plummet 350 feet.

You can't visit Olso without admiring and snapping a photo of its gorgeous waterfront. If you want a great shot of the beach and its city skyline stacked behind it, hop on one of the many boat tours offered. One even takes you on an old-school wooden sailboat.

### STOCKHOLM

When a city is made up of 14 islands and more than 50 bridges, you can't really find a bad view of Stockholm. If you want that Instagram-perfect picture, Skinnarviskberget is the place to take it. It's Stockholm's highest natural point where there are spectacular views of the city's old town with colorful buildings built in the 17th and 18th centuries. You'll also spot the city hall's famous spire featuring three golden crowns. City hall is also a favorite viewpoint. Climb the 365 steps up the 350-foot high tower to get another remarkable view.

If you feel like you just haven't gotten quite high enough to see all of Stockholm, Skyview is the place for you. Balloon-like gondolas take you around and to the top of the world's largest spherical building, the Ericsson Globe. Think of it as the world's safest Ferris Wheel, as you slowly ride up 425 feet above sea level and gently come down to the ground.

### COPENHAGEN

you can describe almost any European village as picturesque, there's a Nordic group that stands out from the pack. Head north of the Baltic to Scandinavia and visit these scenic spots.

Denmark's capital claims to have some of the best sunsets in the world and nobody is arguing with that claim. One of the best places to photograph a classic Copenhagen sunset is The Round Tower. A 17th century observatory with a 360-degree view of the city 115 feet up. You will have to hike up quite the spiral staircase to get to the top. It will likely be cold and windy but it's all worth it once you see the view.

In central Copenhagen, there is The Black Diamond, the nickname for the waterfront extension to the Royal Danish Library. What makes this a spectacular spot for a photo is the building's exterior, made up of a polished black granite facade. As the sun sets, light reflects off both the water and the building's irregular angles creating every photographer's dream during the golden hour.

# Copenhagen in 24 HOURS

From its humble beginnings as a small Viking fishing village in the 10th century to the sprawling gorgeous city it is today, Denmark's capital should earn a spot on your travel bucket list. Scandinavia's city by the bay has something for every type of traveler.

### **MORNING**

When you leave Copenhagen's airport, a good first stop is Vor Frelsers Kirke, Danish for Church of our Savior, a quick 15-minute tram ride away. Dating back to the 1600s, the Baroque Luthern-Protestant church has a unique helix spire with a winding golden staircase. Bring a bottle of water because you're going to get a workout climbing up all 400 of those stairs to the top of the tower. Once there, you will see breathtaking views of the city.

If the weather is nice, stroll over to the Butterfly 3-way Bridge to the Inderhavnsbroen, a pedestrian and bicycle bridge that spans the entire harbor. This is Nyhavn, or New Harbor, the 16th century narrow canal where wooden boats are still used today and rainbow-colored homes line each side. There are more than enough restaurants and cafes to grab lunch and admire the beautiful area.

### **AFTERNOON**

Work off that delicious Danish lunch by taking a walk along the harbor to Den lille Havfrue, The Little Mermaid statue. The more than 100-year-old bronze sculpture is a tribute to Hans Christian Anderson's famous fairytale. It's also one of the most photographed landmarks in Denmark.

The tram can take you to the place featured on many Danish stamps and currency, Rosenborg Castle. Tour 400 years worth of Scandinavian history, including seeing Denmark's crown jewels.


From a castle to a palace, a quick walk brings you to Christiansborg Palace.
The palace is home to Denmark's Supreme Court, prime minister and parliament. A palace tour shows you where Danish royalty entertains guests from around the world.

### **EVENING**

Denmark is gorgeous at night and one place lit up to perfection is Tivoli Gardens. The world's second oldest amusement park isn't just rides and carnival games. There are bars, restaurants, concerts, massive gardens and water fountains along with an aquarium. There will be something for every member of the family.

Copenhagen is a fine destination any time of the year. Whether you're cooling off during its mild summers or hitting up the Christmas markets during the holidays, it's a prime location just a hop, skip and a jump from most of Europe.

**Tip:** Copenhagen is one of the most bikefriendly cities in Europe. You can even rent one with a GPS tablet to navigate around the city. ■






