



Germany's TRADITIONS

"We three kings of Orient are ... bearing gifts we traverse afar ... field and fountain, moor and mountain ...

following yonder star,"

begins the popular Christmas carol. On Jan. 6, the countries of Austria, Germany and Switzerland honor the trek of the Magi detailed in the song's lyrics with a religious feast day known as Epiphany (meaning, "manifestation" or "revelation"), or the Three Kings Festival (das Dreikönigsfest). If you are stationed in Europe, there are three things you should know about this special day.

THE OFFICIAL END OF CHRISTMAS

It's recognized as the day Magi arrived in Bethlehem with gifts to present to the Christ child after their long journey from the Orient. It also commemorates the day Jesus was baptized. In addition, it's considered the last day of the holiday season. If you've been putting off the tedious task of taking down your Christmas décor, now is the time to finally get it done, as this is the day most Europeans do so.

For Austria, along with the German states of Baden-Württemberg, Bavaria and Saxony-

Anhalt, three Swiss cantons (or districts) and part of Graubünden, Jan. 6 is considered a public holiday. This means most businesses and restaurants are closed. Plan ahead to avoid any kinks this may cause in your daily responsibilities and travel itineraries.

STAR SINGERS MAY COME CALLING

From Dec. 27 to Jan. 6, small groups of children known as Star Singers (Sternsinger) dress up as the three wise men to raise funds for special charities. Following a leader who carries a star, they go from door to door, singing hymns about the Magi and the birth of baby Jesus in exchange for a few coins. When you get the knock, have euros on hand and open your door and hearts.

HOMES ARE BLESSED AND CLEANSED

Sternsinger and representatives from religious organizations also stop by to offer blessings for the new year. It's common to see a cryptic series of letters, numbers and symbols written on villagers' doors. Marked with chalk that has been blessed by a Catholic priest, this inscription has usually been sanctioned by a local church.

How to decipher the symbol: Beginning and ending with the first and last pair of digits of the new year, 2019's blessing will read: 20*C+M+B+19

The asterisk (*) symbolizes the star of Bethlehem the Magi followed to find baby Jesus. The three crosses (+) stand for the Holy Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Finally, the C, M and B are said to either represent the names of the three wise men (die Weisen), whose German monikers are Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, or "Christus mansionem benedicat," which means "Christ bless this house."

In addition to the chalk blessings inscribed on doors, it is common for frankincense to be burned in rooms to cleanse village dwellings for the next 12 months.

Keep an eye out for Epiphany customs around Europe on Jan. 6. It is another great opportunity to learn something new about our host nations. ■



GERMANY DAY TRIPS

JUST BECAUSE IT'S COLD OUTSIDE DOES NOT MEAN YOU HAVE TO BE STUCK AT HOME OR INDOORS. THE HOLIDAY FLURRY IS OVER, SO PULL OUT YOUR SKI AND SNOW-BOARDING GEAR FOR SOME OUTDOOR FUN AND EXERCISE. IF YOU ONLY HAVE THE DAY, TAKE THE SHORT TREK NORTH TO WINTERBERG.

YOU WON'T BE "BOARD"

Skiliftkarussell Winterberg will make for an excellent ski destination. Between 34 slopes across seven mountains, you'll find varying degrees of difficulty to accommodate all skill levels of skiers and snowboarders. This includes our younger generation of snow athletes as well. You will ascend the slopes in either a chair-, t-bar or conveyor lift. For you borderline professionals, put your skills to the test on Slalom slope or St. Georg Sky Jump.

Who says the fun has to end when the sun goes down? Everyone can enjoy night skiing thanks to an awesome flood lit course. If you've never tried it before, here's the perfect opportunity.

The cost to enjoy the slopes is totally reasonable. They offer half day passes starting at 24 euros for adults and 16 euros for children. Keep the party going all day starting at 32 euros for adults and 22 euros for children. The floodlight skiing and snowboarding passes are sold separately.

For those of you wanting to take up the winter sport, you have the opportunity to take lessons from professional instructors at one of two ski schools. You'll learn proper safety and technique no matter how old you are. Either group or private lessons are available. Group lessons take place on a specific schedule, but the private lessons allow for more flexibility.

"SNOW" MORE FOR ME

One will need a break at some point during the day. You'll be able to get a hot meal, quick snack

or hot and cold beverages at any one of the 10 huts scattered throughout the area. No matter where you dine, the savory Bavarian food and spectacular views will not disappoint.

BEYOND A DAY

Winterberg offers a variety of overnight accommodations if you decide one day just isn't enough. Need to relax after a fun but exhaustHave you ever seen bobsledding or luge runs in person? If not, head on over to Veltins EisArena. Call ahead to register for a tour. There is a minimum requirement of four people and the cost starts at 16 euros per person. Save even more if you can tag onto a group of 10 to 15 people.

Don't let the gloom of winter send you on a downward spiral. Head to Winterberg for some serious downhill time to bring those spirits back up!

SINCE THE GERMAN AUTOBAHN IS WELL-KNOWN FOR ITS HIGH-SPEED AND FAST CARS, WHAT BETTER WAY TO EMBRACE DRIVING DOWN THESE RENOWNED HIGHWAYS THAN BY TAKING A ROAD TRIP TO SEE GERMANY'S FIVE MOST FAMOUS ROADS FOR THE PERFECT ROAD TRIP!



ROMANTIC ROAD

Originally created by English-speaking travel agents in the 1950s, the Romantic Road or Romantische Straße is located in the regions of Baden-Württemberg and Bavaria. This famous road stretches 261 miles long and highlights major experiences such as visiting the Franconian wine country and the Neuschwanstein castle. As you look out the car window and catch striking views of the Bavarian countryside, be sure to park your car and roam the quaint towns, castles and monasteries along the way. Rothenburg ob der Tauber, a well-known and well-preserved medieval town in Bavaria's Franconian region, is a pit-stop you must take! For the history buffs, visit Germany's oldest city, Augsburg, which dates back 2,000 years. In this historic city, a 1,000-year-old castle, Burg Colmberg, calls its visitors to relive the medieval era.



FAIRYTALE ROAD

Ever hear of the brothers Grimm? If the name doesn't ring a bell, fairytales such as Cinderella, Snow White, Hansel and Gretel, Sleeping Beauty and Puss in Boots are tales originated from the creative minds of the German folklorists. During this road-trip which starts in Hanau, witness the towns and landscapes that inspired the brothers to write the folk tales we all love and know today. Along your drive, you will be brought to Steinau where the brothers grew up.

Adventure awaits as this 370-mile-long expedition allows you to visit Sleeping Beauty's castle, hunt the Big Bad Wolf in Little Red Riding Hood's forest and ask Rapunzel to let her hair down in her famous tower. This trip in particular is perfect for children as they can appreciate real life fairytales that are imbedded in the magical towns that are filled with puppet shows, parades and even statues of popular characters.

THE CASTLE ROUTE

When in Germany, one must marvel at all the castles this country has to offer. Luckily, the Castle Road allows us to see many of these ancient fortresses in a short amount of time. Stretching over 625 miles, Castle Road consists of winding and small back roads, typical of Europe, that is dotted with over 70 castles to include ruins. The road starts in Mannheim and ends in Prague, and it is recommended to pick a few castles to see due to how many there are. You can spend days exploring and taking yourself back in time to when knights and lords ruled the land. Ever wanted to feel like royalty? Stay in a castle hotel! Castle Hornberg is a four-star accommodation that will make you forget what century you're in!



THE BLACK FOREST HIGH ROAD

Perhaps the most known area, the Black Forest is synonymous with cuckoo clocks and deliciously rich Black Forest cake. However, it's also home to the beautiful and adventurous 44-mile-long drive bursting with stunning mountain views and nature. The journey starts in Freudenstadt and runs north through the Schliffkopf and Kniebis mountain ranges. In order to catch a breathtaking view over the Rhine Valley, hike up the newly opened path on the Bühlerhöhe.

For those who enjoy skiing, this road trip has your name on it as many ski-lifts are open and connects to the Nordschwarzwald cross country skiing trail.

Mummelsee, a serene lake at the western side of Hornisgrinde, is also a popular tourist attraction that brings its admirers to be one with nature. The Hornisgrinde tower provides picturesque views from the highest mountain in the Northern Black Forest area.

THE GERMAN WINE ROUTE

Considered to be the most popular driving tour, immerse yourself in wine culture and become a true connoisseur by driving through the German Wine Route or Deutsche Weinstraße. The 50-mile-long drive is branded by the grapes logo and starts off in Schweigen-Rechtenbach and ends in Bockenheim in the Palatinate wine region. Grape vines hanging at the center of charming wine villages and local foods and farmer's markets are all perks to stopping by any weingut areas, or wineries. One of the better-known destinations along this road is Bad Dürkheim which is not only home to the biggest wine barrel in the world but also serves as a spa town. This town is synonymous for its famous Wurstmarkt, a massive "sausage" and wine fest that takes places every September. Whether it's the wine or the colorful and easy drive, the Weinstraße has got everything you need!



SPRING

As the snow melts away, find an abundance of brightly-colored wildflowers beginning to bloom throughout the green pastures. The hiking and biking trails will start to reopen and will soon be filled with hikers and cyclists. Walls of the mountains will also be ready for those looking to conquer a *via ferrata* (iron road) which are steel-cable, assisted climbs along the rock face. Wine enthusiasts will enjoy the annual Vino in Festa, where 16 wine-growing districts on the South Tyrolean Wine Road gather to showcase their fine wines. The festival usually takes place at the end of April and lasts through the beginning of June.

SUMMER

The warm summer months are a busy time in the Dolomites with tourists embarking on countless outdoor activities to include — hiking, biking, cycling, rock climbing, kayaking, swimming, fishing and so much more! Definitely be prepared to share the trails with more tourists. Many events take place during the summer from cycling races, music festivals, and wine fests. During this time of year, many enjoy visiting the Dolomites for the beauty of the unpredictable, majestic summer storms.

FALL

Experience fall foliage like never before as the alpine trees begin to feature colors of golden yellow and bright orange. Visiting during this time of year calls for less crowded trails and a more intimate affair with the glorious mountains and their array of outdoor adventures. Towards the end of September, indulge in tasty foods, listen to live music and more at the end of summer festival known as the Ladin Festival, which takes place in the town of Canazei.

WINTER

The Dolomites are most commonly known for their perfect terrain for winter sports. Whether you're a pro or beginner, partake in skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing, bobsledding and other thrilling winter activities. The most loved ski towns are Campitello di Fassa and Cortina d'Ampezzo, which boasts amazing ski runs.

NOTABLE THINGS TO DO — IN THE DOLOMITES —

A trip to the Dolomites is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity but can be overwhelming with all the countless experiences to choose from. Depending on when you visit and your interests, implement as many of the remarkable things below during your trip.

- There are too many trails to count, so take an easy day hike or complete a challenging hike over multiple days.
- Ski down some beginner and kid-friendly runs: Alta Badia, Alpe di Siusi, Val di Fassa, and Alta Pusteria.
- Ski down advanced runs: Pista Ciampac, Pista Bel lunese, Pista Col Margherita, Pista Gran Risa, and Pista Saslong.
- Conquer a via ferrata.
- Make a stop at the various nature parks.
- Opt to bike along a route instead of hike.
- Stay or have a meal in the multiple rifugios (mountain huts) you'll come across.
- Climb the Dolomites' highest peak, Marmolada, "Queen of the Dolomites."
- Visit the most picturesque lakes: Lago di Braies, Lake Limides, Lake San Pellegrino, Lake Carezza and Lake Resia to name a few.
- Kayak and fish at the other countless lakes to be found.
- Unwind in the thermal baths of Terme Merano.
- Explore the World War I tunnels and galleries.
- Witness Reifenstein, a 15th-century castle.
- Rent a car and see it all along the "Great Dolomite Road" from Venice to Bolzano.
- Make a stop along the many small villages, churches, pastures and farms during your journey.

PLANNING TIPS

- There are many kid-friendly activity options.
- Hire a travel guide if you're a beginner or need equipment for any of the outdoor activities.
- Research the trails and ski runs that best suit the experience levels of everyone on your trip.
- While the *rifugios* are fun to experience, definitely plan to stay in resorts or hotels as well.
- The area is very dog-friendly.




MUST-TRY FOOD AND DRINKS
